

Registration deadline for next **ACT** test


College-bound high school students who want to take the Ac. Assessment have two chances to register before the December 8 test date. The postmark registration deadline is Friday, November 2. There is also a late registration postmark deadline on November 15 (an additional fee is required for late registration). Students can get information from their school counselor or register online at www.act.org.

ACT scores are accepted by virtually all colleges in the nation, including all lvy League schools. The test fee is \$24 (\$27 in Florida). A student's ACT scores are considered by colleges for admissions and course placement, along with several other important factors including high school GPA, college prep courses taken in high school, extracurricular activities, personal background and other information.







Program on **Reversing Deser**tification on Rangelands

Years of drought have decimated much of West Texas rendering a near desert-like state in many pas-To help ranchers tures. counter this alarming trend, a number of private, state, and federal entities will present "Reversing Desertification on Rangelands" at the Texas A&M University Agricultural Research and Extension Center near San Angelo. The October 24-25 program purpose is to promote management practices that enhance water and soil conservation and return health and productivity to West Texas rangelands and pastures.

The sponsors are: Texas Cooperative Extension, Holistic Resource Management of Texas, Texas Agricultural Experiment Station, Texas State Soil and Water Conservation Board, Upper Colorado River Authority, and the United States Department of Agriculture-Office of Risk Management.

Both days' activities will start with an 8-8:30 am registration period at the Center, located just northwest of San Angelo on U.S. Highway 87. The first day will be devoted to formal presentations at the Center and the second day will involve a bus tour of area ranches.

Day-one speakers and topics include: "State Brush Control Programs," James Moore, assistant executive director, State Soil and Water Conservation Board, Temple; "Grass Die-Off," Homer Sanchez, Natural Resources Conservation Service, Temple, and "Effect of Grazing Management and Brush Control on Rangeland Hydrology - Results from the Sonora Station," Dr. Charles "Butch" Taylor, Sonora Experiment Station

superintendent. Following a 10:00 am break, the morning program resumes with "Ripping-a Tool for Reversing Desertification on Rangelands," Dr. Darrell Ueckert, Experiment Station range researcher, San An-gelo; "Maintenance Herbicide Treatments," Dr. Allan McGinty, Extension range specialist, San Angelo; and "Monitoring Rangelands," Chris Allison, Extension range specialist, New Mexico State University, Las Cruces, NM.

After lunch, the program continues with: "General Principles of Grazing Management," Dr. John Walker, Experiment Station resident director of research, San Angelo; "Time Controlled Grazing," Bob Steger, ranch management consultant, Mertzon; "Integrated Grazing Management-Fire and Kind of Livestock for Sustainable Production," Taylor, and "Using Goats to Control Brush and Enhance Wildlife on the Ford Ranch," Forest Armke, rancher, Melvin.

The final session opens with; "Economics of Multiple Enterprises," Walt Davis, rancher and consultant, Bennington, Oklahoma and "Economic Decisions for Management Programs," Walt Richburg, managing director, Farm and Ranch Management Group - Bank One, Fort Worth.

The day ends with a rancher panel moderated by George Brannies, president-Holistic Resource Management of

Texas and of Mason National Bank. The panel members are Frank Price, rancher, Sterling and Coke counties; Bill Tullos, Irion County rancher; Dalton Maddox, Colorado City area rancher; and Karre Remme, rancher, Reeves, Brewster, Jeff Davis counties with McCoy Land and Cattle Company.

The October 25th ranch tour will depart from the Texas A&M University Agricultural Research and Extension Center by chartered bus shortly after 8:00 am.

Ranch stops and their onsite hosts include; Angelo State University, Dr. Cody Scott, ASU animal science associate professor; Hugh Stone Ranch, Hugh Stone; Texas A&M University's Carlsbad lease property, Ueckert; and Bill Tullos Ranch, Bill Tullos.

October 15 is deadline for pre-registration of \$10.00 per person per day and is required to reserve a place on the tour bus October 25. After this date of October 15, the fee will be \$15.00 per day. Fees paid for each day will cover that day's meal.

Businesses hurt by reservist call-ups

Small businesses that employ military reservists who were called to active duty by President Bush in response to the terrorist attacks on the

World Trade Center and the the term of each loan SEAthe Pentagon may qualify for Military Reservist Economic Injury Disaster Loans (MREIDL). These disaster loans are available from the U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA) to small businesses during a period of military conflict.

The MREIDL program will provide loan funds to eligible small businesses to cover operating expenses that would have been met, but cannot because an essential employee was called to active duty in his or her role as a military reservist.

Communities across the nation are going to feel the loss of the thousands of men and women who have courageously answered the call to support the nation's military effort," said SBA Administrator Hector V. Barreto.

"The loss of a key employee, even for a short period of time, can financially devastate a small company or even cause it to fail. This lowinteresi loan program can provide the money necessary to support these small businesses until the reservist is able to return to the business," Barreto said.

Small businesses may apply for MREIDLs of up to \$1.5 million if they have been financially impacted due to the loss of a key employee. These working capital loans may be used to pay fixed debts, payroll, accounts payable, and other bills that cannot be paid. The interest rate on these loans is 4 percent, with a maximum term of 30 years. The SBA determines the amount of economic injury,

payment amount, band on the financial circumstances of each borrower.

The filing period begins the date the essential employee is ordered to active duty and ends 90 days after the date the employee is discharged from active duty.

Businesses interested in applying for an economic injury disaster loan can contact the SBA disaster area office in Ft. Worth, Texas at 1-800-366-6303.



Food safety tips for tailgate parties

With fall weather and football games, tailgate parties become popular activities. "Tailgating" can be full of good food, friends and happy memories. Don't let your tailgate party be spoiled by foodborne illness.

Jan Yanez, of Texas Cooperative Extension, Coke County, says that foodborne illness causes stomach cramps, diarrhea, nausea, headaches, fever, and even vomiting. It results from improper handling and cooking of foods and can occur as soon as a few hours or as long as a few days after eating contaminated food.

The bacteria that cause foodborne illnesses grow most rapidly at temperatures between 40 degrees F and 140 degrees F. This is known as the temperature "danger zone." Foods prepared for tailgate parties or any outdoor eating event can reach danger zone temperatures even when the weather is cool.

Almost any food can carry harmful bacteria, but foods that are moist and contain protein such as meat, fish, seafood, poultry, eggs, and dairy products are most perishable. Other foods such as cooked vegetable dishes can also be suspect. They should not be left in the danger zone for more than 2 hours or 1 hour in hot weather.

Dishes containing these perishable foods should be kept either hot (above 140 degrees F) or cold (below 40 degrees F). Try to prepare just enough food to serve your guests. It may be safest to discard any leftovers.

Popular items such as chili, stew, soup, and dips can be kept hot in a thermos if it has no cracks or leaks. Keep the thermos clean and check for a tight seal. Rinse it with boiling water just before filling it with the steaming hot food.

Hot casseroles can be wrapped in several layers of aluminum foil followed by newspapers and a towel to keep them hot. Plan to serve immediately after arriving. Do not let the casserole fall into the temperature danger zone for more than 2 hours.

Cold food can be transported in a cooler filled with ice or cold packs to keep it below 40 degrees F. Pack the food in shallow containers and pre-chill before placing in the cooler. Keep sandwiches, deviled eggs, dips made from dairy products, or other perishable foods cold or eat them within 2 hours.

Watch the clock on fast food or deli purchases. Whatever you select, pick it up immediately before the event and eat within 2 hours. If you purchase them in advance, refrigerate and then reheat the foods.

When the party begins, use safe food handling practices. If you don't have hot or cold storage, plan on non-perishable foods such as canned or dried meats, fruits and vegetables, breads, cereal mixes, nuts, popcorn, or peanut butter.

Keep hands, utensils, and dinnerware clean. Disposable dinnerware and utensils make it easier. Spread a clean tablecloth on the tailgate or table and enjoy.
