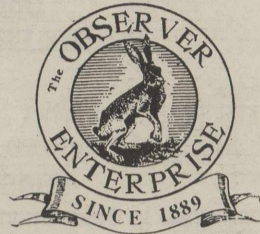

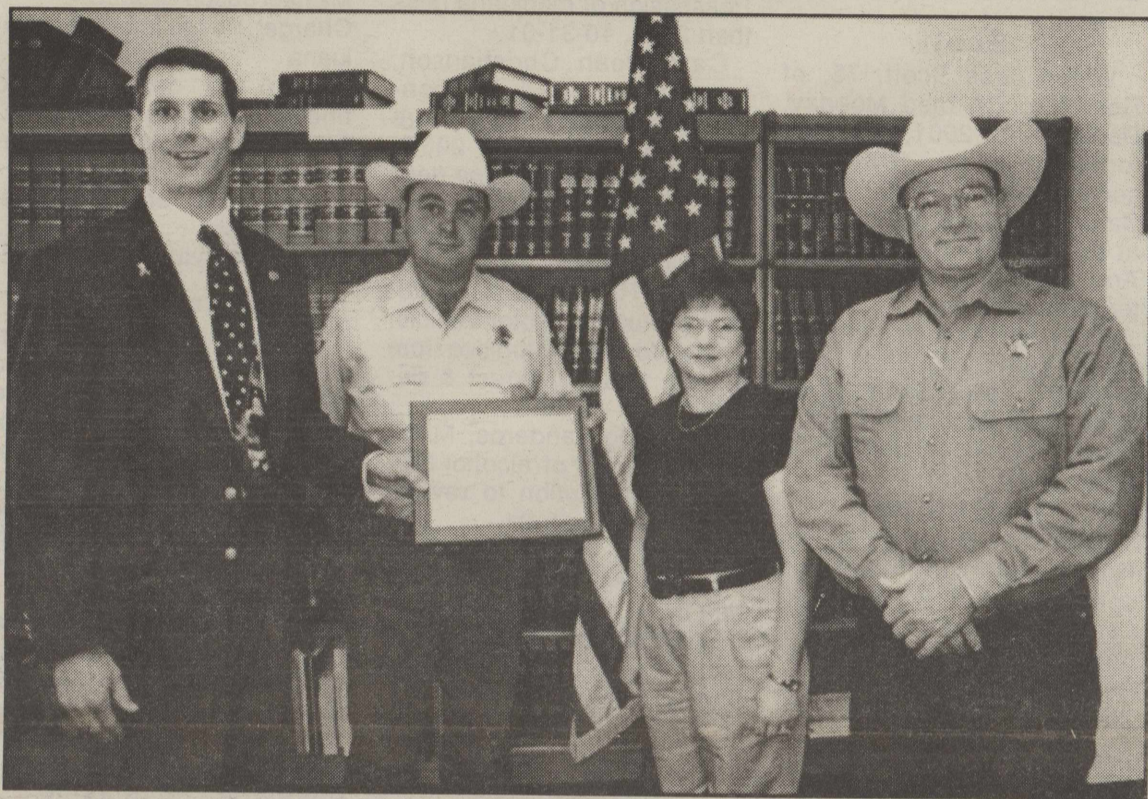

The filing period for local (and state) officeholders, which began December 3, 2001, continues through January 2, 2002, at 6:00 pm. Current local officeholders whose terms expire include County Judge Jackie Walker; Precinct #4 Commissioner David Rawlings; Precinct #2 Commissioner Bill Wheat; County Treasurer Phelan Wrinkle; County Tax Assessor/Collector Gayle Sisemore (unexpired term of Kristy Roe); Justice of the Peace Precinct #1 D. Joan Davis; and Justice of the Peace Precinct #2 Jack G. Moore.

According to county party chairs Patti Ivey (Democratic) and Kathy Pentecost (Republican), the following candidates have filed for these offices (all in the Democratic Party) at the present time: County Judge - Jackie Walker and Roy Blair; County Treasurer - Phelan Wrinkle; County Tax Assessor/Collector - Gayle Sisemore; County Commissioner, Precinct #4 - George Snapp and David Rawlings; County Justice of the Peace, Precinct #1 - D. Joan Davis; and County Justice of the Peace, Precinct #2 - Jack G. Moore.

Primary election day is set for March 12, 2002, with the runoff primary election on April 9, 2002. Candidates are reminded that all filings for public office must be received in the party chair's office (not mailed) by the January 2 deadline.

Upgrading US highway signs slated

Beginning this week, the Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) will begin a one-year project to upgrade approximately 8,000 signs on US highways in the San Angelo district.

Motorists' safety is the goal for replacing the existing signs, according to Public Information Officer Patsy Rainwater-Maddux. The base will involve a new "break away" structure that has proven to be safer than the existing signs during crash situations.

The project will begin on North US 277 at the Runnels and Nolan county lines, progressing to the Schleicher County line. Other US highways included in the sign project are US 67, US 83, US 87, Loop 306 and Business 67 on Sherwood Way. These signs can be found in Runnels, Coke, Sterling, Glasscock, and Tom Green counties.

The contractor, Texas Commercial Fence from Austin, will also replace the large overhead signs.

ADOPTION OF INTERNATIONAL RESIDENTIAL BUILDING CODE
AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE #136, SECTION 1, OF THE CITY OF BRONTE, TEXAS, IN ORDER TO ADOPT THE "2000 INTERNATIONAL RESIDENTIAL CODE FOR ONE AND TWO FAMILY DWELLINGS".

WHEREAS, State law states that cities must adopt the 2000 International Residential Code for One and Two Family Dwellings; and WHEREAS, it is staff's recommendation and the consent of the City Council that this International Code be adopted to include the following.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED that:

A. Ordinance # 136, Section 1, Adoption of Minimum Housing Code, be amended to adopt the 2000 International Residential Code for One and Two Family Dwellings with appendices and amendments.

Section 5. That this ordinance and the rules, regulations, provisions, requirements, orders and matters established and adopted hereby shall take effect and be in full force December 31, 2001.

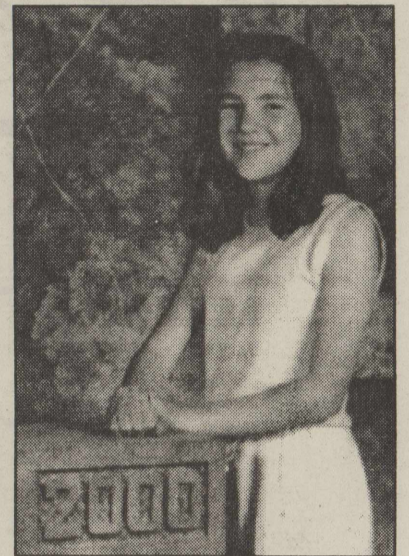
