Upgrading US highway signs slated

Beginning this week, the Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) will begin a one-year project to upgrade approximately 8,000 signs on US highways in the San Angelo district.

Motorists' safety is the goal for replacing the existing signs, according to Public Information Officer Patsy Rainwater-Maddux. The base will involve a new "break away" structure that has proven to be safer than the existing signs during crash situations.

The project will begin on North US 277 at the Runnels and Nolan county lines, progressing to the Schleicher County line. Other US high-ways included in the sign project are US 67, US 83, US 87, Loop 306 and Business 67 on Sherwood Way. These signs can be found in Runnels, Coke, Sterling, Glasscock, and Tom Green counties.

The contractor, Texas Commercial Fence from Austin, will also replace the large overhead signs.




Lee Collenback of Georgia took this nice mule deer while hunting with Ron Dickey of Robert Lee in the Texas Panhandle.




