

Dyess air show slated for Saturday

Dyess officials announced specific restriction which will be in place for visitors attending the annual Big Country Appreciation Day on May 11th. Many of these restrictions have been in place for several years but due to the Sept. 11th attacks and the war on terrorism, officials stated these rules will be strictly enforced.

Gates open for Big Country Appreciation Day at 9 am May 11, and flying acts begin at 10:15 am. The highlight act will be the world renowned U.S. Air Force Thunderbirds in their only Big Country appearance this year. Admission and parking are free.

Rules for people attending Big Country Appreciation Day include:

*No weapons are allowed to be brought onto the base

*No coolers are allowed to be brought to the event

*No alcohol allowed to be brought onto the base

*No animals (except seeing eye dogs) are allowed to be brought to the event

*No glass containers are allowed to be brought to the event

*No smoking allowed on the flight line

*No bicycles, skateboards, roller blades or scooters of any sort allowed on the flight line

"We are working to keep inconveniences to a minimum for our visitors," said Capt. Dave Honchul, 7th Bomb Wing Public Affairs. Honchul offered recommendations for people attending the event, including:

*Arrive early and be patient; visitors should be prepared for possible long waits; security personnel will get visitors on the base as quickly and efficiently as possible

*Have photo identification with you at all times

*Understand that everyone is subject to random searches of handcarried items; anything larger than a handbag will be searched; officials discourage visitors from bringing items like large bags or backpacks.



TAAS scores improve

Students' test scores on the Texas Assessment of Academic Skills (TAAS) are improving and research by the Private Enterprise Research Center (PERC) at Texas A&M University suggests that the state's accountability system is the reason.


Student improvement on the TAAS may have more to do with schools and districts being held accountable than with availability of resources and per capita expenditures, says PERC Research Fellow Donald Deere. "Increases in the typical

measures of school resource such as the student-to-teacher ratio and teacher salaries cannot explain the pattern of passing rate increases across schools over time," he says. "Instead much of the explanation appears to rest with schools responding to the incentives of the accountability system."

Deere and Economics Professor Wayne Strayer, examining the state accountability system and TAAS test results for 1994-1999, found that between these years the fraction of students passing each test and the number of schools and districts receiving improved accountability ratings increased.

"The high visibility of the TAAS tests and associated accountability ratings have placed increasing pressure on district and school administrators

and on teachers to achieve TAAS success," Deere says.



Pursuant to Section 104.103 of the Texas Utilities Code, TXU Lone Star Pipeline (TXU LSP), a division of TXU Gas Company, hereby gives notice of intent to establish a supplemental firm transportation rate and an interruptible transportation rate designed to recover the costs of constructing and operating a 76.5-mile, 24-inch pipeline extending from the Bridgeport area in Wise County to the junction of Lines W and W7 in Denton County and then in an easterly direction to the junction of Lines D 17-9 and D9 in Collin County, hereinafter called the "Northside Project." The supplemental firm rate and interruptible rate are proposed to be charged upon the initiation of service on the Northside Project. The proposed supplemental firm rate constitutes a major change and will result in an annual increase in the revenues of TXU LSP of approximately \$9.8 million. These revenues will represent an 8% increase in the total revenues of TXU LSP.

PUBLIC NOTICE OF

The proposed supplemental firm transportation rate will be applicable to all firm transportation customers contracting for capacity on the Northside Project. The only current customer directly affected by the supplemental firm transportation rate will be TXU Gas Distribution. No other customer has agreed to contract for firm capacity on the Northside Project. The supplemental firm rate may, however, indirectly affect all residential and commercial customers served by TXU Gas Distribution in the state of Texas. The supplemental firm rate will be assessed to TXU Gas Distribution for its contracted capacity on the Northside Project in addition to the city gate rate approved in the Railroad Commission of Texas (Commission) Gas Utilities Docket (GUD) No. 8976. The supplemental firm rate may then be passed on to TXU Gas Distribution's residential and commercial customers. If any other transportation customers contract for firm capacity on the Northside Project, those customers may also pay the supplemental firm transportation rate in addition to any other applicable rates charged such customers

TXU LSP also proposes an interruptible transportation rate for the use of the Northside Project. To the extent that shippers other than firm transportation customers use the Northside Project, they will be charged this interruptible rate. TXU LSP proposes to reduce the proposed supplemental firm transportation rate charged to firm customers on the Northside Project through an annual revenue crediting mechanism based on revenues from the interruptible rate approved in this proceeding.

Construction of the Northside Project is estimated to be completed in approximately 23 months after approval of this rate application. The proposed supplemental firm rate and interruptible rate will be effective on June 4, 2002, but will not be charged until the initiation of service on the Northside Project and will be charged for an initial seven year period. TXU LSP further proposes to reconcile the projected capital costs with those actually incurred and to adjust the supplemental firm transportation rate and interruptible transportation rate accordingly.

A Statement of Intent to make such change has been filed with the Commission in GUD Docket No. 9292 and is available for inspection at the Commission's office at 1701 North Congress, Austin, Texas, and at the offices of TXU LSP at 301 South Harwood, Dallas, Texas. Copies of the Statement of Intent have also been sent to the appropriate city official of each incorporated city served by TXU Gas Distribution. Any affected person may file written comments or a protest concerning the proposed changes in the rates with the Docket Services Section of the Office of General Counsel, Railroad Commission of Texas, P.O. Box 12967, Austin, Texas 78711-2967, at any time on or before June 17, 2002. Any person or agency that has a justiciable or administratively cognizable interest in this proceeding who desires to be designated as a party may petition for leave to intervene and request to become a party to this proceeding. The final date for intervention in this case shall be June 17, 2002.




