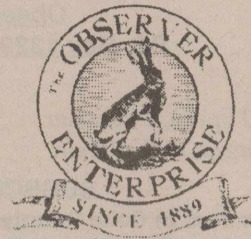

The old saying "haste makes waste" was never more true than in last week's issue. Let me give you an example. Memorial Day weekend, KLST Television was reporting that Lake Spence would double in size (from 9 to 18%), as a result of the runoff from the storms over the weekend. Monday (Memorial Day) was a holiday; so we were already starting out with one less day to get the paper together. Add to that the area storms (we were without power all night at my house), and you've got even more problems during a short week.

As Wednesday morning rolled around, we were frantically calling around trying to confirm our rainfall totals and get an early idea on the runoff for our area lakes. I called Mrs. McWhorter at Live Oak Lodge at Oak Creek, and was very disappointed, along with everybody else, that they didn't get any water in the lake over there.

I knew that we were getting a rise at Mountain Creek, but nobody knew how much, cause it wasn't through running in. I called Terry at Wildcat Marina, and he confirmed a rise of about 1 foot so far at Spence, but couldn't sign on to anything like what KLST reported. But, water was still running in; so he couldn't discount that story, either. I left Doug Frye a message (Doug works for CRMWD in some capacity that I can't remember), and he didn't get back to me until after our deadline.

So we went with the KLST story, and as the old joke goes, "they thought like great aunt Sara, and she thought wrong!" Anyway, that will give you a little insight into the newspaper business and what you can get into just trying to report the facts.

According to one official, "we got about a foot of water at Lake Spence, and they are pumping that out pretty fast" supplying the area municipalities on the water system and "letting water out down the river for the snake". So there you have it. Not as much as we would like, but it beats not getting any. There's always a next time, and as of this writing (on Wednesday), we've got another chance of showers; so we are always hopeful that we'll have more to report next week.

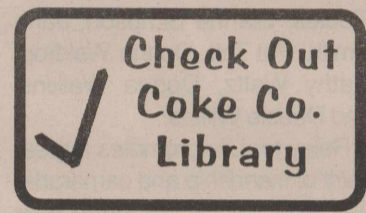

Robert Lee Volunteer Fire Dept. news

Firemen were busy in the month of May. Not with fires, but other activities. There were only 2 calls, one a false alarm and the other was a control burn on the Tom Green side of the divide. The firemen assisted with a number of MVA's.

The firemen met on Monday, the 6th, 13th, and 20th.

On the 26th, the volunteers gathered with their families for a family appreciation barbecue at the station. The volunteers wanted to show their families how much they are appreciated because without family cooperation, there would be no firemen. Those who attended feasted on delicious hamburgers, chips and dips.

On Monday the 27th, we were given no warning as to the size of the hail stones nor the velocity of the storm which hit Robert Lee. The weather service told us only pea size hail was expected. We were as surprised as everyone at the size of the hail and the storm that hit. The Robert Lee Care Center attempted to sound the sirens but the electricity was already out all over town. No electricity, no sirens.

The fire department utilizes the sirens when there is a fire or a drill/meeting. Two 15 to 20 second blasts of the siren is a call for the firemen to assemble

at the station.

The group met on June 3rd for the regular meeting with 10 members present. The minutes and the treasury report were accepted as read.

Chief Rick Drennan reported on the 2 grants we have in the works. One is for the building and the other is for Hazmat equipment.

Dispatcher Bud Thompson reported on the information he was able to obtain regarding the sirens. They would like to have them radio controlled. The group discussed different ways in which this could be done. They also discussed the need for new tires on the trucks. At the present time 6 new tires are needed and a new fire hose, as

required by the state. They had a discussion of firemen safety at the scene of a motor vehicle accident.

Warning signals

Tornado sirens for the City of Robert Lee are 3 long blasts, with each blast lasting 15 to 30 seconds. This is a public warning be it severe weather or anything that might threaten the welfare of the city. If a tornado is spotted in the area, the Coke County Skywam Team, who are all firemen, will notify 911 and they will sound the alarm. Three long blasts is the signal to take immediate shelter preferable in a sturdy building, basement, interior room or hall. When the danger is past, 1 long blast of the siren will signal all clear.

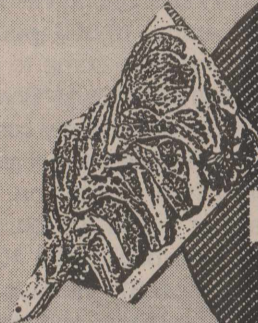

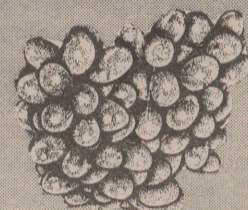

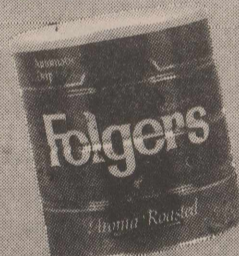

Lodge honors Bryan as community builder

Hayrick Masonic Lodge No. 696 A.F. and A.M. in Robert Lee honored Wilson Bryan by presenting him the Community Builder Award. May 31, 2002, a surprise (to Wilson) presentation was held in the Masonic Lodge Hall in Robert Lee.

Bobby Roberts, Worshipful Master of the Lodge, called the meeting to order. Bob Large, Chaplain of the Lodge, offered the prayer. Bobby told of the many things Wilson has done for our community and is very deserving of this title as the certificate reflects.

Wilson came to Coke County arriving in Bronte by railroad in 1920 at an early age of seven years. He was on the first football team at Robert Lee High School in 1928.

He was an early organizer of Coke County Livestock Association serving as secretary and president. In 1946, he and several men went to Houston to purchase prefabricated lumber to build the first Livestock Show Barn. It was used for the stock shows until 1975, when the current building was built.

Wilson served eight years on the Robert Lee School Board and was president when the current building was built. He served on the Tax Equalization Board and Farmer Home Administration County Committee.

Wilson and Ruby Dodson Bryan raised their four children on their farm west of Robert Lee. After many years of marriage Ruby died and Lake Spence now covers their farmland and homeplace.

He married Lucile Dean in 1965. They built their home in Robert Lee and his community service continued. He served as Mayor of Robert Lee five different times and served three terms on the City Commission, was on the Citizens Advisory Committee, is a past member of the Lions Club and Board of City Development. In 1979 he was presented the Citizen of the Year Award for his community service.

In about 1975, Mayor Robert Vaughan asked Wilson if he could beautify the corner next to the City Hall where the Brown & Clark Service Station was in business for many years. The old building was torn down and the Minipark was designed and built under his supervision. This was his gift to the city.

In 1978, he designed and supervised the construction of Mountain Creek Amphitheatre, home of the pageant "Ole Coke County - Home of the Rabbit Twisters". He served as maintenance supervisor and various other jobs for 20 years.

In 1988, he and Lucile entered the Christmas Decorating Contest, stringing Christmas lights on everything in their backyard. They won

two awards. This prompted them to decorate the barn he built on his six acres one mile West of Robert Lee on Messbox Creek.

The entire Bryan family strung lights on everything on the six acres and the building. This has put Robert Lee on the map. Some years, 10,000 people from everywhere come to see the Christmas Lights at "Bryan's Barn". The entire family continues to work all year to get ready to turn the lights on on December 1 and are on and open to the public until 10:00 pm December 31. He says this year will be bigger and better. The theme and their gift to our community, reflects the true meaning of Christmas.

At the age of eighty-nine and one-half years, he is still making our community a better place to live.

Bobby asked Thelma Jo Hinnard, Terry Frank and Richard Bryan to escort their dad, Wilson Bryan, to the podium. Bobby asked all the Masons to please stand as he presented the Community Builder Certificate to Wilson on behalf of the Masons.

Eastern Star Deputy Grand Matron, Beverly Sinclair and her husband Jimmy decorated the Lodge Hall and dining room with beautiful roses and miniature tin can, barns, etc. among the roses. Robert Lee Eastern Star ladies, Masons and wives prepared and served refreshments of sandwiches, vegetables, chips, desserts and tea to the 56 in attendance.

Among those in attendance were family members intro-

duced by his daughter, Thelma Jo Hinnard, Molly Burns of Robert Lee; Terry and Jeanne Bryan, Jimmy and Lorri Martin all of San Angelo; and Stephenie Roberts and Tillie Bryan all of Ballinger.

Texas Forts Trail Region names Yandell coordinator
