

Disaster, tornado, or severe weather siren signals for the City of Robert Lee are 3 long blasts (with each blast lasting 15 seconds). This is a public warning, be it severe weather or anything that might threaten the welfare of the city.

If a tornado or severe weather is spotted in the area, the Coke County Skywam Team, who are all firemen, will sound the alarm. Three long blasts, is the signal to take immediate shelter. Preferably a sturdy building, basement, or interior room or hall. When the danger is past, 1 long blast of the siren will signal All Clear.

The fire department utilizes the sirens, 2-10 seconds blasts, is a call for firemen to assemble at the fire station, for a fire call, drill/meeting, or for any reason firemen are needed.

Don't forget that December 2, 2002, is the final date to purchase a NAP policy on grass for 2003.
