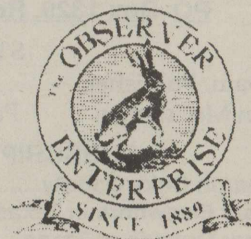

The sale will be held at the Old Jail this year to give more visitors an opportunity to tour the building. The popularity of the tour during the Street Affair encouraged the group to hold the event at the jail. Bonita Copeland will be on hand with pictures and stories from the forthcoming book of the Coke County Jail and its sheriffs.

Along with the sale of hot chocolate will be the sale of tickets for a 22 inch Victorian rag doll donated by Fran Lomas of Cedar Canyon Collectables and an ecru and pink, 46x62 inch afghan designed and

donated by Pat Watson. A drawing will be held at the January meeting of the Historical Commission.

The doll and afghan will be on display at the Coke County Library during and after the evening of December 14 and tickets will be available then as well.

The homemade cookies make the hot chocolate sale a success. Folks who came to last year's sale were encouraged to buy something to drink because the cookies were so enticing. Any bakers wishing to donate a dozen or so cookies may leave them at the Library the days before the sale.

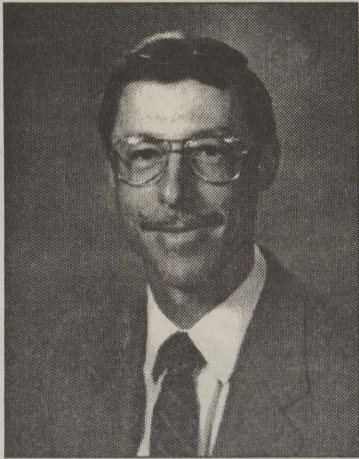

Floyd and Jessie Harmon of Robert Lee will celebrate their 70th Wedding Anniversary and Jessie's 87th birthday December 18, 2002.

Floyd Calloway Harmon and Jessie Dora Creech, both born and raised in Coke County, were married December 18, 1932. The wedding took place in the home of D.K. Smith, a preacher and school teacher, in the Green Mountain Community in West Coke County in Robert Lee.

The Harmons have four children; Lawana M. Perry of Carlsbad, Dorene Mashburn of San Angelo, Jeffie Roberts of Robert Lee, and Jerry Harmon of Weatherford. They also have 11 grandchildren, 15 great grandchildren and 2 great-great grandchildren.

Since their wedding, the Harmons have lived near Robert Lee 68 years and 2 years (1939-1941) in the Champion community near Roscoe, Texas. They built a two room house on Paint Creek near his parents home immediately following their wedding. In 1941, they purchased some land and a home six miles west of Robert Lee, they built a new house on their land in 1949, which is their present home.

Floyd and Jessie were stockfarmers, he sheared sheep part-time, and sheared his own sheep until he was 83 years old. Floyd served on the Robert Lee School Board in 1951 and was a director on the Rural Water Board when the bids were let for construction. He started to work for the county in 1953 as a road hand under Ed Hickman. He was elected Coke County Commissioner of Precinct 3 in 1960 and was re-elected 2 more terms serving the county as Commissioner until 1972.

Besides being a mother and housewife, Jessie helped Floyd in the fields and with the livestock. When the children were in school, she served as room mother for each child's class and worked at the Trimble Laundry. She was active in the Coke County Home Demonstration Clubs and was a member of the First United Methodist Church.

Floyd and Jessie Harmon will be honored with a Reception on Sunday, December 22, 2002, in the Recreation Hall in the County Park in Robert Lee from 1:30 to 3:00 pm. Their four children and spouses will host the celebration and cordially invite all their friends and relatives to come by and say hello to them.

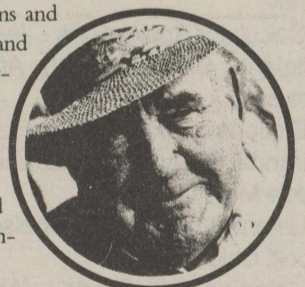


From Coal Lamps to Light Bulbs

After sixty years, we've learned a little patience and that what's good for city folk doesn't necessarily apply out here. 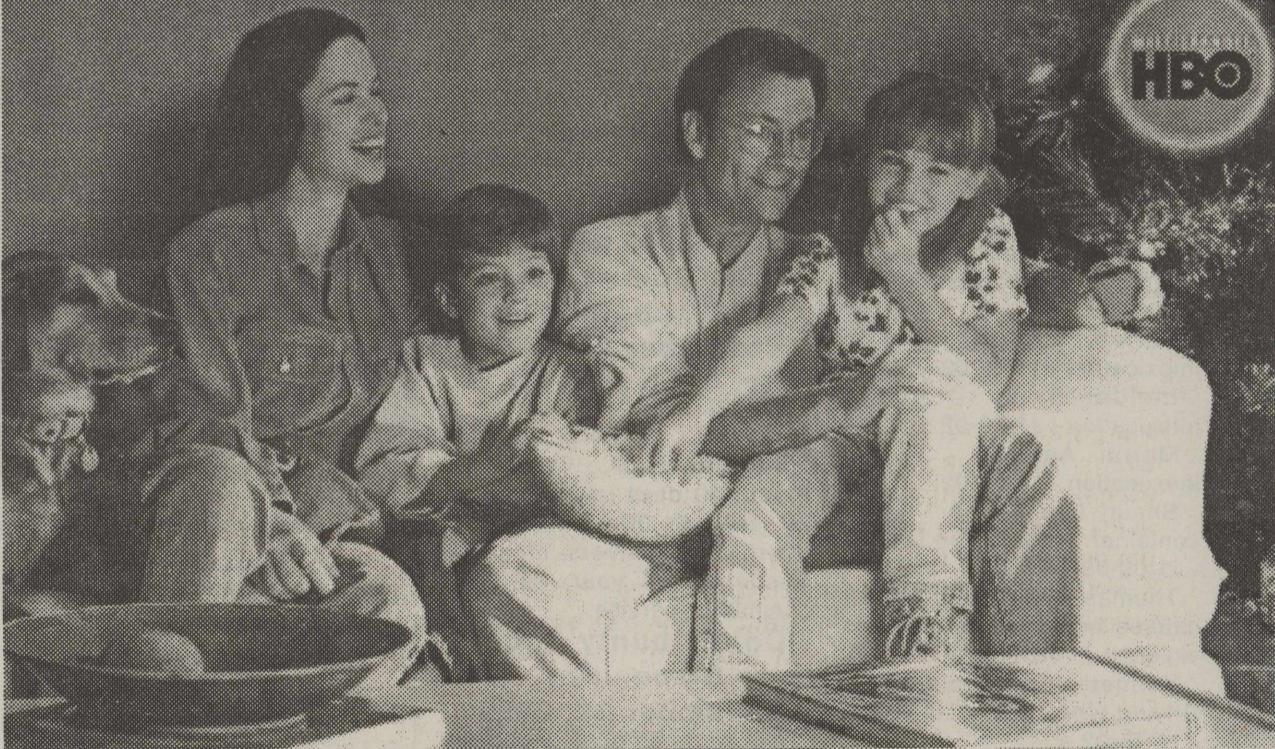
