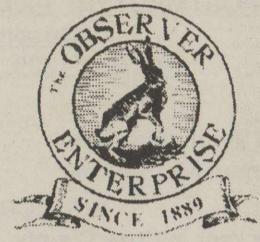

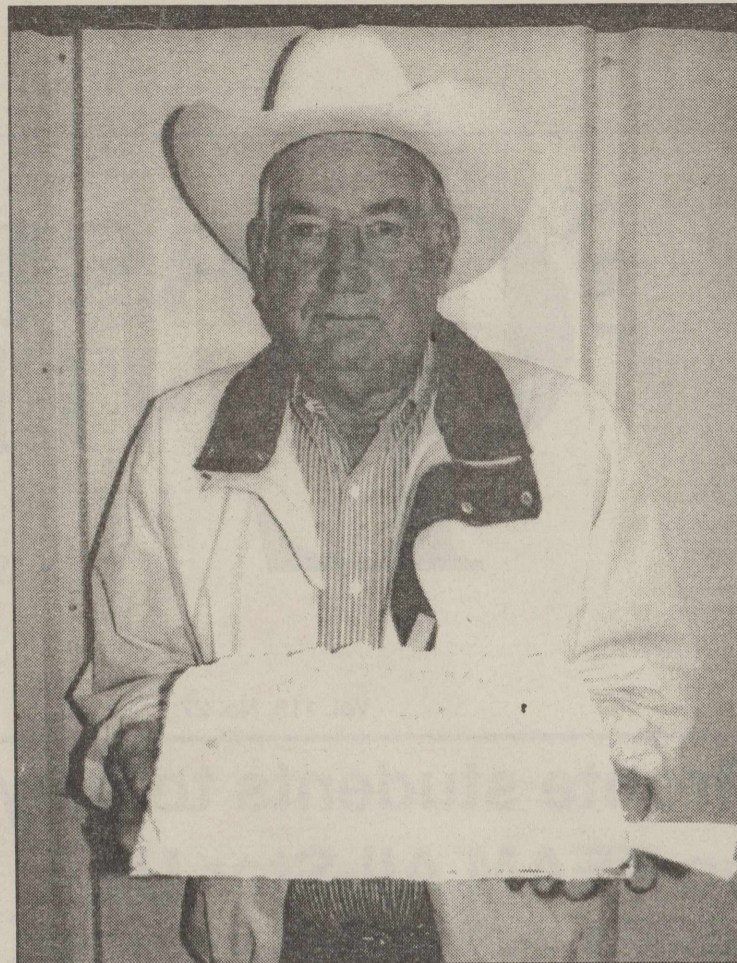
FSO Representative available

Bronte school receives use of fitness center

Bronte School recently obtained fitness equipment from the National School Fitness Training - "LIFT" Program. The non-profit organization provides free equipment in hopes of helping the youth of the school to "LIFT" themselves to new levels of fitness and self-confidence. We believe in "fitness through education." Thus the mission of the National School Fitness Foundation is to provide each participating school with a fully-equipped, state-of-the-art Fitness Center, including exercise equipment, computerized assessment tools, well-tested curriculum, and staff training and certification.

Bronte School was fortunate to obtain the free use of this equipment to provide comprehensive physical education for our students and the community. Now that the initial training and orientation has occurred, we are ready to open the fitness center for public use. Program Coordinator Pam Hilliard says the fitness center will be open to the public for free under certain guidelines. A community member must fill out three forms and go through an orientation prior to using the equipment which includes treadmills, elliptical, stationary bikes, as well as strength training equipment. The school must protect the integrity of the program. The free use of this equipment is based on data collected from Bronte students; thus, the students and programs will have priority over public use.

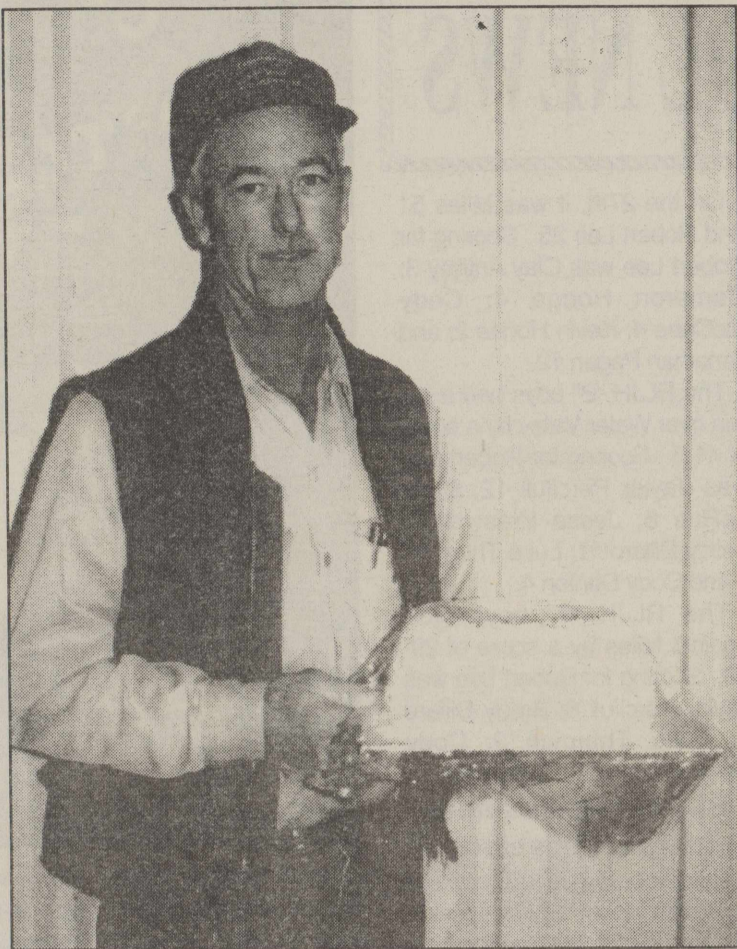

Wallace discussed the report with the board and those present. The report is on file for public inspection.

Other action, the minutes of the previous meeting were approved as were the paying of invoices for February. The principals' reported on attendance and student activities at their campuses. Supt. Wallace provided the board with information on activities concerning the maintenance department and the central office. An early release day is scheduled for February 19, 2003 for staff development.

Supt. Wallace addressed the board concerning the financial situation of RLISD. He discussed declining enrollment, declining fund balance and other factors contributing to the present financial condition. Questions were asked by the board and answered by Supt. Wallace and legal representation. After lengthy discussion Supt. Wallace recommended that the board declare a financial exigency which will require the district to reduce its financial expenditures for personnel and to eliminate one or more professional positions. The board entered closed session to discuss legal issues pertinent to this recommendation. Upon returning to open session, the board unanimously approved Supt. Wallace's recommendation and financial exigency was declared, as was the recommendation to invoke a reduction in force.

In other action, Supt. Wallace's contract was extended for two years and a letter of resignation was accepted from Lindsay Treadaway effective at the end of the school year.

A special meeting will be held on January 30, 2003 with the next regular meeting being held on February 27, 2003.

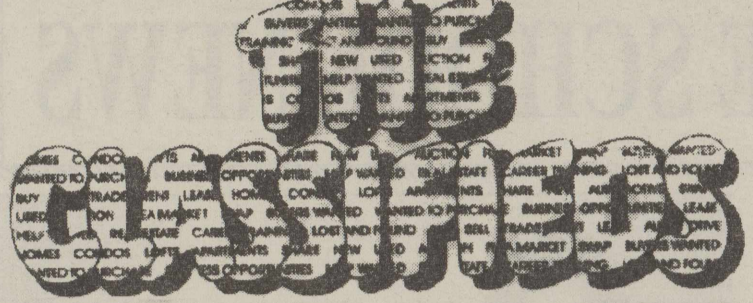

The FSA Office reminds area farmers and ranchers to make an appointment to sign up for the Direct and Counter-Cyclical Program (DCP). The deadline to apply for DCP is April 1, 2003. This date is outlined in legislation and no extensions or exceptions will be made.

The new farm legislation is complex in nature. Maximizing benefits received from these programs will require producers to organize and plan ahead before visiting

our offices.

The sign-up for DCP is averaging at least one hour per farm. Producers are encouraged to avoid procrastinating and come in as soon as possible to make application.

Our office is processing applications as soon as possible so payments can be issued to producers as soon after sign-up as possible.

books and activity suggestions.

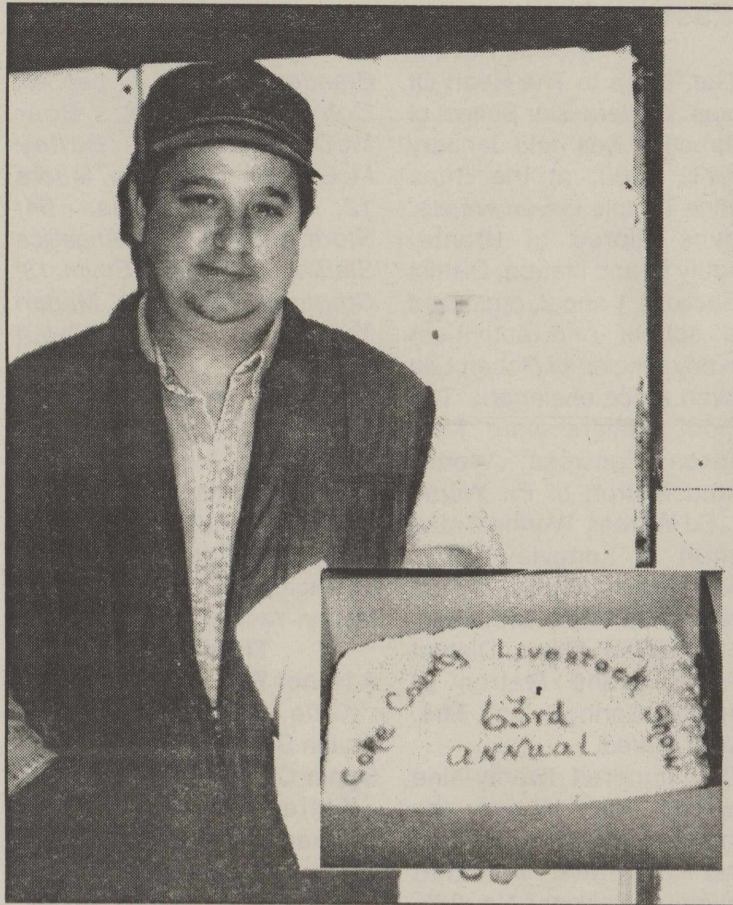
