## PROPOSITION 1

(HJR 68, Section 1)
HJR 68, Section 1 would authorize the Veterans' Land Board to use excess
receipts in the Veterans' Land and receipts in the Veterans Land and
Veterans' Housing Assistance funds for Veierans Housing Assisiance fund for
payment of revenue bonds, and use excess assets in those funds to provide veterans homes.

The proposed amendment will appear on the ballot as follows: "The constitutional amendment authorizing the Veterans Land Board to use assets in certain veerans' land and veterans' housing assis for the aged or infirm and to make principal, interest, and bond enhancement payments on revenue bonds."

## PROPOSITION 2

(HJR 51)

HIR 51 would expand from six months to two years the period in which the former for unpaid property taxes may buy back the mineral interest.

The proposed amendment will appear on the ballot as follows: "The constitutional amendment to establish a two-year period for the redemption of a mineral intertax sale."

## PROPOSITION 3 (HJR 55)

HJR 55 would authorize the legislature to exempt from taxation land owned by a religious organization that is leased for use as
a school or that will be used to expand or a schoot or hat wil be lised oxpand or construct a place of religious worship that
yields no revenue.

The proposition will appear on the ballot as follows: "The constitutional amendment to authorize the legislature to exempt from ad valorem taxation property owned by a religious organization that is leased for use as a school or that is
owned with the intent of expanding or constructing a religious facility."

## PROPOSITION 4

(SJR 30)
SJR 30 would authorize the legislature to allow conservation and reclamation districts to use taxes to develop and finance
certain parks and recreation facilities. Also, the amendment would authorize the legislature to allow local elections for the legislature to allow local elections for the parks and recreational facilities in the Tarrant Regional Water District or a conservation and reclamation district located in whole or in part in Bastrop, Bexar, Brazoria, Fort Bend, Galveston, Harris, Montgomery, Tarrant, Travis, Waller or
Williamson County.

The proposition will appear on the ballot as follows: "The constitutional amend-
ment relating to the provision of parks and recreational facilities by certain conand recreational faciinties by certain servation and reclamation districts."

## PROPOSITION 5

(SJR 25)
SJR 25 would authorize the legislature to exempt from all property taxes certain tangible personal property, which could affixed to real estate and not used as a residential dwelling.
The proposed amendment will appear on the ballot as follows: "The constitutional to exempt from ad valorem taxation travel trailers not held or used for the production of income."

## PROPOSITION 6

(HJR 23)

HJR 23 would authorize a qualified homeowner to refinance a hom

The proposition will appear on the ballot as follows: "The constitutional amendment permitting refinancing of a home equity
loan with a reverse mortgage".

## PROPOSITION 7

(HJR 44)
HJR 44 would reduce the number of persons who make up the jury in a district court crimina
twelve to six.

The proposed amendment will appear on the ballot as follows: "The constitutional amendment to permit a six-person jury
in a district court misdemeanor trial."

## PROPOSITION 8

(HJR 62)
HJR 62 would authorize the legislature to permit a person to assume office without an election if the person is the only candidate to qualify in an election for that office and the election is required by the Texas Constitution. This proposition applies to state and local political subdivisions, whereas Proposition 18 applies only to
