Results announced for 64th annual Coke County Junior Livestock Show

The 64th edition of the Coke County Junior Livestock Show was held at the Sterling Lindsey Memorial Exhibit Building in Robert Lee on Friday and Saturday, January 16 and 17. This year's show featured more than 75 county youth exhibitors showing their projects in the Market Lamb, Goat, Swine, and Steer shows.

All the action began Friday night with the Market Lamb show, followed by the Market Goat show. Both were judged by Marty Gibbs, Runnels County Extension Agent. The Market Swine show and Steer show followed Saturday morning, judged by Joe Behrens, cattle and swine producer from Voca, Texas.

The Buyer's Appeciation Barbecue was served at 12:00 noon on Saturday, followed by the Premium Sale at 2:00 pm. Once again the brisket and sausage luncheon meal with all the trimmings was finger licking good, thanks to barbecue cooks Keith Dillard, Wayland Drennan, Curtis Walker, Gaylon Pitcock, and Marshall Millican. All the volunteers who served and cleaned up after the meal are also due special recognition for their dedicated service to the annual event.

Although sale results were pending at presstime, this year's Livestock Association directors are due a strong commendation for their tireless efforts in funding this year's sale.

Highlights of this year's show include multiple wins by Cody Bridges in three different shows. Cody exhibited the Grand Champion Pig in the Swine Show, the First Place Light Weight Meat Goat in the Goat Show, and the Champion Finewool Lamb and Reserve Champion Mediumwool Lamb in the Lamb Show. Cody also received both the Frank Percifull Overall Showmanship award and the Ralph Walker Memorial Top Hand award.

In other action, Clay Antilley exhibited the Champion Mediumwool Lamb, which was also judged Reserve Grand Champion Lamb. He also showed the Champion ABC Steer, the Champion Crossbred Steer, and the Grand Champion Steer, taking home the Steer Showmanship award in the process.









Crossing Rio Pecos by Patrick Dearen relates history and folklore of all the crossings on the Pecos River: Horsehead, Pontoon, Pope's, Emigrant, Salt, Spanish Dam, Adobe, and Lancaster. 



Without the RLVFD, the citizens of Robert Lee and the surrounding area would be required to pay more for household insurance because the area would be without an "E" insurance rating. Over the years, the volunteers have dealt with housing that has been less than adequate. One of the situations that has to be dealt with is making sure that the trucks will start during cold snaps. This means that a volunteer has to go to the fire station to light heaters and then watch the temperature and turn off the

heaters to save gas. This also means that the weekly meetings have been held under the same conditions. The firemen work all day at difficult jobs and then must hold training meetings in a cold (or hot) building in the evening. Since 1945 when the fire department was organized, the volunteers have dealt with sub-standard conditions.

The situation is now almost an emergency. The San Angelo Health Foundation has granted \$45,000 towards a proposed \$92,000 building which will house two truck bays, a training room, an office and restrooms (which have been non-existent) and the building will be heated and the training room will be cooled. Some generous donations have been made to the almost \$10,000 raised so far. There is a ways to go towards reaching this goal.


