
Bronte Chamber of Commerce non-banquet slated for tonight

Communities focus energy on downtown

There are many reasons why communities focus their energies on revitalizing their downtown centers. First, there is something intangibly attractive about having a focal point to establish a community identity. Historically, downtown was the heart and soul of the community. Generally, communities want to create this image when they set about restoring or creating a downtown center.

Secondly, the goal is to improve the city's fiscal position. The belief is that public investment can be used to leverage private investments. By improving the look and quality of the downtown and buildings, the mix of building uses will improve, including the mix of retail stores. A thriving downtown also increases the attractiveness of a community to new residents and industry, which benefits the local economy and the city.

Energy spent on downtown revitalization should be grounded in a sound planning effort. Planning increases the likelihood of success because consensus can be achieved early on in the process.

Charlotte McCabe Northcutt has taken the time to envision

what a downtown Robert Lee could like like and has painted a canvas depicting her view. The picture is an effort to make the downtown area look like a cohesive place, rather than ten boxes in a row. It is a starting point for the discussion and consideration of the improvement of the downtown area of the town. The painting is on display at the Robert Lee City Hall for anyone interested in seeing the canvas. The vision is not in any way a dictation of what is to be done. It is, rather, a starting place for discussion and planning.

Early voting continues in May 15 local elections

Early voting in the May 15 local elections began Wednesday, April 28, and will continue until May 11.

Both Robert Lee and Bronte schools will be holding an election for board members. Both cities, Bronte and Robert Lee, will also be holding elections to determine council members and a mayor. Both hospital districts, east and west, have cancelled their elections due to no contested races.

The city of Robert Lee will have to fill two council seats currently held by Beth Prather and Bonita Copeland. Both council incumbents have filed for reelection. Mayor Garland Davis' term is also expiring. Filing for the office of Mayor are Kenneth Green, Joe White and Kimble Middleton.

The city of Bronte will have to fill three 2 year council seats currently held by Martha Ratliff, Charles Sonnenberg, and Leslie Rolls. All incumbents have filed to retain their seats on the Council. Challenging them will be Scott Graves. Mayor Martin Lee's term is also expiring and he has filed for re-election.

Bronte ISD has two vacancies to fill for full 3 year terms. Positions open are currently held by Terry Charles and Gary Acker. Terry Charles and Gary Acker have filed to retain their seats on the Board. They will be joined on the ballot by Paul Williams.

Two places on the Robert Lee ISD Board of Trustees are coming open. These places are three year terms. The terms of Darrell Pitcock and Bill Burns are expiring. Darrell Pitcock has filed for re-election. New candidates filing include Kevin Roe and Gayle Bolding.

Producers should be aware of the final date to have all small grains certified in the county. May 1, 2004 is the deadline date. Any producer who wishes to certify any

small grain crop after this date will be required to pay a late-file fee.

For producers who are signed up in the farm crop program (DCP) it is required that all crops and all acres be certified on each participating farm each year to remain eligible for DCP payments.






