The new addition to the O/E family of Bronte and Robert Lee and surrounding communities will begin immediately, with subscription mailings. and newsstand papers being available in Sterling City this week.

Our staff has monitored the Sterling City situation since they ceased publishing the Sterling City News Record back in the spring. As a result, their high school senior class didn't have a graduation edition of the newspaper, as well as many more regrettable occurrences as a result of not having a local newspaper. We felt this was a tragic loss for the community, and vowed to help if no one came forward to start up the newspaper.

As time went by, it was obvious that nothing was going to happen by the time school started. After much discussion with local officials, the decision was made for us by the pressing need for a local publication in which to publish legal notices for local taxing entities. This also corresponded with the beginning of school, local football, and the fall hunting season, which is an important source of income for both Coke and Sterling counties.

We hope you enjoy this initial installment of the Observer/Enterprise, serving Coke and Sterling counties. Many residents in both counties will benefit from this expanded coverage by being able to read about their friends and family in the other communities.

After knowing these two wonderful people, our best effort to attempt to follow in their footsteps and serve your needs as your hometown newspaper is warranted and


Conaway to visit Coke County

East Coke County EMS also has reimbursement plans. If tuition is a problem, please let them know and they will work with you concerning the tuition.

At this time, West Coke County EMS has only 6 certified people on the service. The State of Texas requires that two certified people be in the ambulance anytime it is used to transport a patient. It has become especially hard to fulfill these requirements during the day.





Under state law, the dollar amount of school taxes imposed on the residence homestead of a person 65 years of age or older or of the surviving spouse of such a person, if the surviving spouse was 55 years of age or older when the person died, may not be increased above the amount paid in the first year after the person turned 65, regardless of changes in tax rate or property value.

Notice of Rollback Rate: The highest tax rate the district can adopt before requiring voter approval at an election is \$1.6097. This election will be automatically held if the district adopts a rate in excess of the rollback rate of \$1.6097.





PERMIT NO. 7574 APPLICATION Chevron U.S.A. Inc. has applied to the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) for renewal of Air Quality Permit No. 7574 which would authorize continued operation of their Conger Sales Facility. The applicant has provided the following driving directions: at the intersection of Highway 158 and Ranch Road 33 go 16 miles east on Highway 158, then 7 miles south, Sterling City, Sterling County, Texas. The existing facility is authorized to emit the following air contaminants: nitrogen oxides, carbon monoxide, organic compounds, sulfur dioxide, hydrogen sulfide, and particulate matter including particulate matter less than 10 microns in diameter.

The TCEQ received this application on July 19, 2004. The application is available for viewing and copying at the TCEQ central office, TCEQ San Angelo regional office, and the Sterling County Public Library, 301 Main Street, Sterling City, Sterling County, Texas. The facility's compliance file, if any exists, is available for public review in the San Angelo regional office of the TCEO.

The TCEQ executive director has determined the application is administratively complete and will conduct a technical review of the application. Information in the application indicates that this permit renewal would not result in an increase in allowable emissions and would not result in the emission of an air contaminant not previously emitted. The TCEQ may act on this application without seeking further public comment or providing an opportunity for a contested case hearing if certain criteria are met. PUBLIC COMMENT You may submit public comments, or a request for a contested case hearing to the TCEQ Office of the Chief Clerk at the address below. The TCEO will consider all public comments in developing a final decision on the application. The deadline to submit public comments is 15 days after newspaper notice is published. After the deadline for public comments, the executive director will prepare a response to all relevant and material, or significant public comments. Issues such as property values, noise, traffic safety, and zoning are outside of the TCEQ's jurisdiction to address in

the permit process.

After the technical review is complete the executive director will consider the comments and prepare a response to all relevant and material, or significant public comments. If only comments are received, the response to comments, along with the executive director's decision on the application, will then be mailed to everyone who submitted public comments or who is on the mailing list for this application, unless the application is directly referred to a contested case hearing.

OPPORTUNITY FOR A CONTESTED CASE HEARING

You may request a contested case hearing. The applicant or the executive director may also request that the application be directly referred to a contested case hearing after technical review of the application. A contested case hearing is a legal proceeding similar to a civil trial in state district court. Unless a written request for a contested case hearing is filed within 15 days from this notice, the executive director may act on the application. If no hearing request is received within this 15day period, no further opportunity for hearing will be provided. According to the Texas Clean Air Act subsection 382.056(o) a contested case hearing may only be granted if the applicant's compliance history is in the lowest classification under applicable compliance history requirements and if the hearing request is based on disputed issues of fact that are relevant and material to the Commission's decision on the Further, the application. Commission may only grant a hearing on those issues raised during the public comment period and not withdrawn.

A person who may be affected by emissions of air contaminants from the facility is entitled to request a hearing. If requesting a contested case hearing, you must submit the following: (1) your name (or for a group or association, an official representative), mailing address, daytime phone number, and fax number, if any; (2) applicant's name and permit number; (3) the statement "[I/we] request a contested case hearing;" (4) a specific description of how you would be adversely affected by the application and air emissions from the facility in a way not common to the general public; (5) the location and distance of your property relative to the facility; and (6) a description of how you use the property which may be impacted by the facility. If the request is made by a group or association, the one or more members who have standing to request a hearing and the interests the group or association seeks to protect must also be identified. You may also submit your proposed adjustments to the application/permit which would satisfy your concerns. Requests for a contested case hearing must be submitted in writing within 15 days following this notice to the Office of the Chief Clerk at the address below.

If any requests for a contested case hearing are timely filed, the executive director will forward the application and any requests for a contested case hearing to the TCEQ Commissioners for their consideration at a scheduled Commission meeting. Unless the application is directly referred to a contested case hearing, the executive director will mail the response to comments along with notification of Commission meeting to everyone who submitted comments or is on the mailing list for this application. If a hearing is granted, the subject of a hearing will be limited to disputed issues of fact relating to relevant and material air quality concerns raised during the comment period. Issues such as property values, noise, traffic safety, and zoning are outside of the Commission's jurisdiction to address in this proceeding.


Coke County FSA Seeks Nominations


