RL City Council adds \$2 charge for new fire station

The Robert Lee City Council extended the \$2.00 addition to the water bills at the regular monthly meeting December 6, 2004.

In July of 2003, based on construction costs, a goal of \$92,000 was set to build a fire station in Robert Lee. The San Angelo Health Foundation offered a \$45,000 matching grant and gave the City one year to raise the match. As the need for a new station was crucial due to crowding and lack of storage after the old filling station roof collapsed, \$2.00 was added to each water bill to help pay for the building. Through community supported fund raisers, a grant from the Robert Lee EMS, corporate, business, memorial and individual donations, the goal of \$92,000 was reached and everyone breathed a sigh of relief.

Within that year, however, the global economy became chaotic and construction costs increased from 60-

Fire safety tips

by Bud Thompson, City Fire Marshal Bud Thompson would like to remind Robert Lee residents that fire safety is everyone's responsibility.

Lightning is common with winter storms. Lightning kills more people than tornadoes, hurricanes, and floods combined. Since lightning kills one at a time, it does not get media attention. Seek shelter when a storm with lightning is in the area. Do not stand under a lone tree as it can attract the lightning. When lightning strikes nearby, be careful and do not touch anything metal or use your phone, except in case of emergencies. It could strike a telephone pole and follow the line. If the phone is at your ear, you can take the strike or get badly

Be sure to check your extension cords when you put up your Christmas decorations. Do not use them if they are frayed or cracked. A Christmas decoration burned last year due to a faulty extension cord.

When using space heaters or a fireplace, keep the area around them clear. Heat alone can ignite fabric. Do not block exits, and have a fire plan worked out with the children. They should know where to meet and above all, do not re-enter the house.

Winter is the time to change the batteries in your smoke detectors. They are only good for about a year. If you know someone who does not have smoke detectors, they would be a useful Christmas gift.

After Christmas, comes New Year's. Fireworks are prohibited within the city limits of Robert Lee. Persons caught setting off fireworks within the city can receive a citation.

If you plan to set off fireworks, read the instructions and warnings and have water available in case the grass is ignited. Have a safe holiday.

Thirteen fire department members met at the fire station on December 6th for the regular monthly meeting. The minutes of the previous meeting and the Treasury report were accepted as read.


Bud Thompson gave the monthly report November. 1 business meeting, 1 extracation class, 83 hours of activities, incomplete as members spent many hours at the station installing gas lines so that the station could be heated. This is necessary as freezing temperatures can cause delays with starting the trucks when there is an emergency and to keep the pumps from freezing. 2 fire department calls, 2 county, 47 man hours, 11 1/2 truck hours, 44 miles one way per trucks and personal vehicles.

On November 22nd, the men were called out to assist with a search & rescue. A deer hunter did not make it back to the camp and was out overnight. On November 28th, the BVFD had their hands full at a motor vehicle accident on 277 South. Traffic had backed up and a 5 car pileup ensued. RLVFD responded to assist them.

The group discussed the 2 incidents at length. The deer hunter got disoriented with the darkness and fog and spent the night in a deer blind. The 5 car wreck was caused by motorists speeding, not heeding flashing lights, and slamming into the cars already stopped for the rollover.



(Continued from Front Page) 120%. The \$92,000 goal that was reached fell short of the construction costs for the bare-bones metal building planned. The shortage amounted to \$17,000.

At that time, it was decided that a delay in construction would only increase the eventual cost for the fire station. The City Council and the RLVFD agreed that funds for completing the building would be borrowed from the City's reserve funds. This decision met with the approval of the San Angelo Health Foundation as the agreement with them had initially been to raise \$92,000.

As of today, a balance of \$11,000 remains to be paid back into the City's reserve accounts.

The City's water/sewer rates, nor City taxes, have been increased since 1999. While costs have risen for almost every aspect of city services, the decision not to raise rates or taxes has been due to the Council's consideration of the necessity to add \$2.00 to the water bills to cover the expense of the fire station.

Small communities cannot be granted E-rate insurance status unless they support a volunteer fire department. Without an E-rate, household insurance would increase from \$300 and up a year. For \$2.00 a month, the fire station's funds can be repaid within approximately 11 months.

For the friends and family members who have everything, a Christmas donation to either the Robert Lee EMS or the Robert Lee VFD building fund, or the Coke County Food Closet, in his or her name would be of help on many levels. Without these volunteer organizations, our community could not survive the economic pressures over which local communities have no control.




