The term which seems to apply the most to the annual county junior livestock show is consistency. The annual event is a constant in a world that seems to be changing every day around us.







They are also the founders of Kardo International Ministries, a non-profit organization that provides for the publication and distribution of family Bible studies throughout the world.

At the present time, one of the men's Sunday School classes at Bronte First Baptist Church is studying "Wisdom for Fathers", a tenweek Bible study that was written by David. Several years ago Denise spoke at an all-day "Freedom for Mothers" Bible study held at Bronte First Baptist.

Susan Graves has been the local leader for several of Denise's Bible studies. The most recent one, "Restore My heart"., was completed just before Christmas. Denise's MotherWise studies have been translated and taught in Spanish, Russian, Korean and Indonesian. Translations into other languages are in progress. In the spring Denise plans to travel to the Ukraine and North Korea where she will teach her Bible studies with an interpreter. At the reception David and Denise discussed the culture, customs, living conditions, foods, clothing and activities of living in a Muslim -dominated society. They have found the people of Jakarta to be warm and friendly and they attend a rather large Christian church there. Thankfully, the Jakarta area had no physical damage from the recent tsunami.



The Dean's List for the 2004 Fall Semester has been announced at ASU in San Angelo.


To be eligible for the Dean's List, students must be enrolled full-time and maintain a 3.25 grade point average on a 4.0 scale.

John Driggers built their practice arena for them using the dimensions given on the state web site. The students gained valuable skills, such as communications, teamwork, problem solving, engineering and computer programming. Alan Richey, Superintendent, gave a facility and legislative update. Mr. Richey also gave an update on construction.


The meeting was adjourned by the President at 11:20 pm.



Robert Lee Christmas Bird Count conducted

The Robert Lee Christmas Bird Count was conducted December 16, 2004, in four areas around town. The counters have been doing the bird count in this area for many years and come from Midland, Stanton and Robert Lee.

There were 92 species counted for a total of 3,116 birds. A lone turkey buzzard was spotted just before the

called a "lingerer" by the Audubon group. It is hoped he or she got out before the really cold weather hit.

Sparrows headed the count with some 600 White-crowned Sparrows, 324 House Sparrows, 17 Song Sparrows, 14 Lincoln's Sparrows, 10 Vesper Sparrows, three Field Sparrows, and one lone Fox Sparrow. Northern Mockingbirds were counted at 204. Eleven different duck spe-

cies were counted on area water sources. One white pelican was spotted, and thirseen. Two species of woodpeckers were seen-24 of Golden-fronted and eight Ladder-backed woodpeckers were counted.

Six hawk species and four wren species were counted. House Wrens were a new species counted this year. A total list of the bird species found in this area is available at the Coke County Library.

The first count in Robert Lee was taken in 1973 and the highest number of 111 species was counted in 1974.
