After some investigation, John says we need to hold off another week until our "beans" can ripen up a little more. He thinks we jumped the gun a little bit last year and harvested some of the first bluebonnets a little too early, when the seed were not yet viable. This year we are hoping to hit it as close as we can as we have set our first meeting for Tuesday, May 10, beginning at 6:00 pm. We will meet at the gazebo across from the newspaper office and disperse from there. John invites all residents from throughout the county to come and pick some bluebonnets and take them back to locations in their areas which need beautification. This is truly a Coke County Project, and all are invited to attend and participate.

There are only a couple of things you may want to bring. First, a pair of work gloves of any kind are helpful in pulling up the plants. Next, you may want to bring some kind of container to put the plants in. I will have some paper bags there for you to use. Some have brought plastic garbage cans which have worked well in the past. You can use plastic garbage bags, but remember if you use plastic, you must distribute the plants immediately after you get back home to your planting area, or they will mildew and the seed will rot. Most of our sessions don't last over about an hour; so don't worry about working yourself to death. Come and join in the fun next Tuesday, May 10, as we begin our second season of the Coke County Bluebonnet Brigade. We don't want to settle for being the talk of the area newspapers. What we really want is to be the "Talk of Texas." See you next Tuesday.

Spring certification of crops ending for **FSA office**

The spring certification of all small grain crops will end May 1, 2005. Producers who have not certified their small grains need to make an office visit ASAP. Certification of small grain crops after May 1, 2005 will result in a late-filed fee being applied to the producer.

For producers who are signed up in the farm program, DCP, a certification of all crops planted and all cropland acres is a requirement.

The Middle Colorado-Elm Watershed in Coke, Nolan, Taylor, Coleman, Concho, Tom Green and Runnels counties is one of the watersheds selected for CSP. Producers interested in participating will need to fill out a CSP self-assessment workbook and bring the completed workbook and needed documentation of conservation management activities to their local NRCS office. NRCS personnel will then determine if their operation meets the requirements for the program. CSP information and the self-assessment workbook are available at local NRCS Service Centers, or on the NRCS Web site at www.tx.nrcs.usda.gov/programs /csp.

If the operation meets CSP requirements, NRCS personnel will then determine the enrollment category and tier the producer qualifies for, and selects the categories to be funded. "All successful applications begin with the demonstrated protection of soil and water quality," said Butler. "However, most CSP participants will go beyond the minimum and work to further enhance soil and water, improve wildlife habitat, and conserve or produce onfarm energy."

The CSP self-assessment workbook goes into specific detail about program require- . ments and any questions specific to the Middle Colorado-Elm Watershed should be directed to your local NRCS Service Center or Kathy Saunders at the Ballinger Service Center at 325-365-3415 ext. 3.


