Fort Chadbourne to host living history event

The third annual Fort Chadbourne Days Living History Event will be held Jill Lankford will present this month on Thursday, May 20 and Friday, May 21. These "living history" days students and faculty. Fort Chadbourne is located between San Angelo and Abilene and is 12 miles north of Bronte, Texas on Highway 277. A Fort Chadbourne billboard is located north of the entrance and a historical marker desig-

> Activities include re-enactments of a typical day on a frontier fort, fort tours, cattle working demonstrations, flintknapping, and a Sharp's rifle display. Arts and crafts vendors will be open on Saturday. 1850's re-enactors include cavalry, frontiersmen, period vendors and Granny G's Storytelling. The Texas Fiddlers and the Lone Star Cloggers will provide entertainment.

> Fort Chadbourne was a military frontier fort established October 28, 1852, by Companies A and K of the United States Eighth Infantry. The fort's purpose was to provide protection to settlers while venturing into Indian Territory during the westward movement to California. The Butterfield Stage Line ran through the fort from 1858 until 1861. The military used

the fort until its closure in summer. 1873.

The historic site of Fort Chadbourne had been closed to the public since 1874 and was opened to the public in 1999 on a limited basis until the ruins were stabilized. Currently, all buildings and structures have been stabilized and three buildings have been reconstructed and are open for visitors to walk through and experience the history of early Texas.

Fort Chadbourne is one of eight historic forts comprising the Texas Forts Trail. The 650-mile driving trail covers 29 counties in West Central Texas and highlights eight historic frontier forts and the communities and attractions that surround them. The remains of these eight frontier forts offer a tangible link to an early period of Texas history.
