The fort grounds became home to the stagecoach from Albany once again after an absence of 150 years. Six cannons graced the parade grounds and at times fired one after the other in a gallant display. There were Texas Rangers, the Fort Chadbourne Cavalry, chuckwagons, a flintknapper, an 1850s surgeon, buffalo hunters, mountainmen, hoop skirted ladies, frontiersmen, a blacksmith, the Texas Militia, the 7th Texas Infantry, the 8th Texas Confederates, archeology digs and Black Powder shooting. 

For information call the church office at 473-3281. about 44% either passed to the governor for signature, were incorporated into other bills sent to the governor, or the intent of the bill was enacted through agreement with a state agency or institution. The average of all bills filed that finally pass is about 23%, so I'm pleased with my success rate. The bill I'm especially proud of is HB 2815, which establishes a watermaster for the Concho River. This measure will save the City of San Angelo hundreds of thousands of dollars each year while protecting water rights for landowners along the Concho and its tributaries.

Capitol projects for the district were equally successful. I was able to secure funding for about \$14.5 million for projects in my district. They include money for brush control, additional funding for study and research of brackish desalinization water, a DPS building in Snyder, Concho River erosion control and a new overpass just beyond Goodfellow at Paint Rock road and Loop 306. I was also a co-author of legislation (HB2698) that became part of a another bill which requires state agencies to utilize technology centers like the West Texas Disaster **Recovery Operations Center** housed at Angelo State University. Increased use by state agencies will obviously expand its work significantly and create a positive economic impact for our area while saving the state millions of dollars each year.

This session, as a member of the House Natural Resources Committee, I worked hard to help preserve the water of West Texans. I fought against the elimination of junior water rights as well as inter-basin transfers. If these measures had been successful, it could have allowed for water from the Concho Valley and the Colorado River to have been released downstream to the larger cities. This would be detrimental to our district, especially during drought conditions. I was disappointed that my bill to better utilize existing state higher education facilities through dedicating additional Texas Grants to Angelo State University and Sul Ross University did not pass. Even after passing it


out of the House three times (once as a bill and twice as an amendment to other bills) we were not able to get it through the entire legislative process before the session ended. I remain determined, however, to continue pursing this idea. If implemented, it would increase the number of students at state universities where facility space is available, and save the state millions of dollars because fewer new facilities would have to be constructed at other universities which have grown beyond their capacities.

Last session, the \$10 billion budget shortfall forced us to cut programs. This session, thanks to strong economic growth these past two years, we began with more money to invest in our schools, health care and job market.

The new state budget appropriates \$139 billion. It includes more than a \$2.8 billion increase in spending for public schools, including more than \$1.3 billion for enrollment growth and improved equity, \$175 million for school facilities, and \$140 million for the Student Success Initiative to provide additional instruction and support to middle school students. Texas colleges and universities also benefited with increases of \$1 billion. The budget also gives an across- the - board pay raise to state employees of four percent next year and three percent in 2007.

Health and human services is also a big winner, with funding increases of \$4.8 billion over the next biennium. Additionally, an emergency funding measure (HB 10) includes \$66 million in general revenue, allowing the state to draw down more federal dollars and spend a total of \$169 million for the Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP) caseloads. It also includes approximately \$207 million for child and adult protective services.

In other areas outside the budget, we continued with tort reform by voting to keep frivolous asbestos lawsuits out of our state. Only legitimate asbestos lawsuits will be heard in Texas courts, and medically accepted standards will be put into place for identifying claimants who are truly impaired by asbestos so they may get their day in court and receive a fair settlement. We also set out to improve Texas' failing workers' compensation system. With the passage of some very significant reforms, Texans will see improved access to healthcare, lower costs to employers, and injured workers will get back on the job more quickly. A major disappointment was our failure to pass HB 2, (Public School Finance) and HB 3, (Tax System Overhaul). The house and senate versions differed significantly over how to pay

for the school reforms and unfortunately, the conference committee could not agree on a compromise. Thus, neither bill came back for a vote. Despite this, we still were able to put \$2.8 billion more money into public education.

My first priority as a state representative has always been to represent the great people of District 72 and I took great care to ensure that what I did during those 140 days would benefit and/or protect the rights and needs of my constituents. Despite a few disappointments, I think the 79th Legislative Session was a productive one for us, and I will continue to work in the interim to ensure that the next session will be even better.

On the bright side, we passed a solid budget, bringing more money to schools, health care and public safety, and we voted for a number of strong, conservative measures along the way.

From a personal perspective, of the bills I introduced,





saltcedar spray project along will also be treated including the Colorado River has been scheduled June 13 to provide information for landowners or interested parties, according to Ben Brooks, the project coordinator with the Texas State Soil and Water Conservation Board (TSSWCB).

The meeting will be at 6 pm Monday, June 13, at the Mitchell County Civic Center, located on the southeast corner of 2nd and Oak Streets (157 W. 2nd) in Colorado City. A meal will be catered for the meeting and North Star Helicopter will provide a slide show and movie about spraying and aerial herbicide application. The TSSWCB will have landowner agreements on hand to enroll eligible landowners with riparian property along the Colorado River and Beals Creek.

The three-year project was designed to improve water quality and increase stream flow in the Colorado River and its tributaries above the E.V. Spence Reservoir. It is a part of the implementation plan for the Total Maximum Daily Load Study for the E.V. Spence Reservoir, which was completed in 2000 by the Colorado River Municipal Water District and the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality.

The \$3 million saltcedar treatment project is funded by the Environmental Protection Agency with a 319(h) grant from the Clean Water Act and is supported by local matching funds from both the TSSWCB (brush control in the Champion Creek watershed near Colorado City) and the Colorado River Municipal Water District (water quality programs in the upper Colorado River basin).

The optimal time for treatment is during August and September. The project was originally scheduled to begin during that period in 2004, but saltcedar stands showed what experts first thought were signs of early senescence (defoliation for winter). It turned out to be an attack on the plant from a scale insect but regardless of the cause, the best tactic was to postpone application until early fall of 2005 to maximize transmission of the herbicide to plant roots. Experts are hopeful that conditions will be optimal to begin treatment in late summer on the main stem of the Colorado River below the Lake J. B. Thomas dam in Scurry County. The project will continue down river through the confluence of Beals Creek in Mitchell County and into the upper end of the E.V. Spence Reservoir. Major tributaries to the river that contain sig-

> Planning for the project has occurred over the last five years with cooperative efforts by the Upper Colorado, Howard County, Mitchell County and Coke County Soil and Water Conservation Districts, Texas Cooperative Extension (San Angelo), the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (Austin) and CRMWD. The District has participated in a concurrent project with the U.S. Agricultural Research Service aimed at biological control through introduction of the saltcedar beetle, a natural predator that feeds on the invasive plant.

> Current conservative estimates indicate that control of saltcedar in the upper basin could increase yields as much as 4,000 acre-feet of water annually in E.V. Spence Reservoir.
