## 14th annual Coke County Ranch Rodeo set for Saturday

The 14th annual Coke County Ranch Rodeo will be held Saturday evening, June 18, 2005, at the Coke County Arena in Bronte. The event will begin at 5:00 pm. There is no charge for admission to the rodeo, but organizers request spectators to help out Coke County's youth by visiting the concession stand, which will be manned this year by Bronte's sophomore class.

Interesting additions to this year's show are an adult boot scramble for all contestants, as well as the 8 and Under children's boot scramble. Also new for this year is a street dance, which will be held from 9:00 pm until 1:00 am on the street next to the arena. Bobby Rountree and his band will be providing the music, and the admission to the dance is set at \$5 per person.

Concerning the ranch rodeo, Mark Saunders will again be judging, with Hal Spain serving as line judge, and Wayne McCutchen on the microphone announcing all the action.
