ORDINANCE #1141

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGE REGULATIONS WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE CITY OF ROBERT LEE, TEXAS; PROVIDING LICENSING REQUIREMENTS, PROVIDING POWER TO REVOKE A LICENSE, ESTABLISHING HOURS OF SALE, PROVIDING A PENALTY, PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY AND REPEAL, PROVIDING AN **EFFECTIVE DATE**;

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ROBERT LEE, TEXAS:

It shall be unlawful for any person to manufacture or brew any alcoholic beverage, liquor, beer or wine and vinous liquor for the purpose of sale, or to import into the City of Robert Lee, or to distribute, or to sell any alcoholic beverage, liquor, beer, or wine and vinous liquor for the purpose of sale within the City of Robert Lee, without having first obtained the appropriate license from the City Secretary's office, as herein provided, which license shall at all times be displayed in some conspicuous place within the licensed place of business.

The City Secretary's office is authorized to collect a license fee of one half the state permit fee for each license issued for premises within the City of Robert Lee, Texas.

Any license issued under the terms of this article shall be for one year and shall be nontransferable.

No person who may engage in the sale of beer or other alcoholic beverages within the corporate limits of the City of Robert Lee, Texas, shall offer for sale or sell any beer or other alcoholic beverages within the corporate limits of the City of Robert Lee, Texas, on Sunday between the hours of two o'clock (2:00) a.m. and

twelve o'clock (12:00) noon and on all other days at any time between the hours of two o'clock (2:00) a.m. and seven (7:00) a.m.

The violation of any such provision of this code or any such ordinance shall be punished by a fine not exceeding five hundred dollars (\$500.00).


