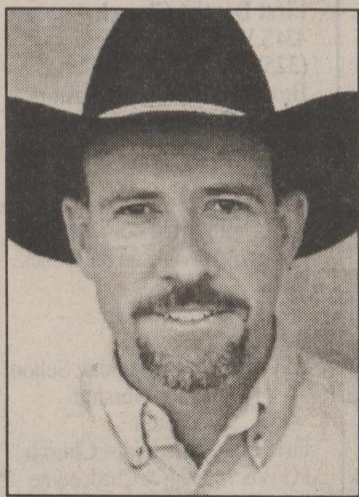

Community visions across the Texas Midwest Community Network will be combined to form a regional vision. This will create a larger picture to take to legislators and agencies on a state and national level. Planning for the future of Robert Lee and for the region will be based on what its citizens see as desired improvements for growth.

Robert Lee and other rural communities are being affected by conditions and legislation outside of rural control. A positive outcome of this meeting should be a unified vision for Robert Lee's future and eventually for the network of communities which are also primarily rural.

A survey of issues affecting Robert Lee is available at City Hall. By attending this meeting, residents of Robert Lee will have a clear understanding of the issues facing rural Texas. By seeing the issues from all sides, a way to surmount these issues should become clearer.

AN ORDINANCE BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BRONTE ORDERING THAT A SPECIAL ELECTION BE HELD IN THE CITY OF BRONTE, TEXAS FOR THE PURPOSE OF VOTING ON A PROPOSITION ON THE QUESTION OF ESTABLISHING AN AD VALOREM TAX FREEZE ON RESIDENCE HOMESTEADS OF THE DISABLED AND OF THE ELDERLY AND THEIR SPOUSES IN THE CITY OF BRONTE, TEXAS; MAKING PROVISIONS FOR THE CONDUCT OF SUCH SPECIAL ELECTION AND RESOLVING OTHER MATTERS RELATED TO THE CONDUCT OF SUCH SPECIAL ELECTION.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Bronte (the "City") has received a petition signed by the 135 registered voters of the City calling for a special election to establish an ad valorem tax freeze on residence homesteads of the disabled and persons sixty-five (65) years of age or older as authorized by Article VIII, Section 1 - b (h) of the Texas Constitution; and

WHEREAS, the City Council calls that a special election to be held in the City on September 10, 2005 for the purpose of voting on a proposition on the question of establishing an ad valorem tax freeze on residence homesteads of the disabled and of the elderly and their spouses in the City; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BRONTE, TEXAS:

SECTION 1. A Special Election shall be held on September 10, 2005, a uniform election date, in the

City of Bronte, Texas, which date is not less than sixty-two (62) days from the date of the adoption of this Ordinance for the purpose submitting the following proposition to the qualified voters of the City:

PROPOSITION

"THERE SHALL BE A CITY OF BRONTE AD VALOREM TAX LIMITATION ON RESIDENCE HOMESTEADS OF DISABLED PERSONS AND PERSONS SIXTY-FIVE (65) YEARS OF AGE OR OLDER AS AUTHORIZED BY ARTICLE VIII, SECTION 1 - b (h) OF THE TEXAS CONSTITUTION."

SECTION II. This Ordinance shall be in force and effect from and after the date of its adoption, and it is so ordained.

ORDINANCE #379

AMENDMENT TO ORDINANCE #274

THE AMENDMENT TO ORDINANCE #274 IS AS FOLLOWS:

ORDINANCE #274 of the City of Bronte, Texas, is hereby amended as to Section G, Section I and adding Section J to read as follows:

SECTION G COLLECTION CHARGES

(a) Premises used for private residences, single or double unit apartment houses, single mobile home sites and/or locations, shall be charged \$11.50 per family unit as to occupied residences, apartments, and units.

(b) Premises used for commercial business, and/or public purposes not receiving sanitation container service as described herein shall be charged \$12.80 per month for 1 through 7 containers per week.

(c) Premises located outside the City Limits shall be charged at a rate of 1.5 times above the rate charged the City by its trash collection provider. Said premises must be served by another City utility for which a bill is sent.

SECTION I CONTAINERIZED SANITATION SYSTEM:

(1) After the effective date of this ordinance, certain public, private, business and/or commercial locations and sites, including the City of Bronte are to receive sanitation container system service for the removal of garbage and trash under the rates and rules hereinafter set forth. Pursuant to the sanitation container system services, the City of Bronte will furnish a container or containers to be used in the collection and/or removal of garbage and trash. The following formula shall be used as to the fees charged for garbage and/or trash hauling to-wit:

SECTION J METHOD OF BILLING:

(1) City shall, through its garbage and water departments, include the fees for the services herein provided on monthly bills to such persons receiving water from the City. In the event any person is not receiving water services, the charges for the garbage services shall be directed to

the person receiving the garbage service.

(2) Garbage bills are due on or before the tenth (10th) day of each month (the "due date"). If payment of any bill is not made by the due date, the City may add a late charge of 10% of the unpaid bills, charges and expenses.

This Ordinance Amendment supersedes any previous Amendments to the Section G, Section I, and Section J of Ordinance 274.

IT IS FURTHER ORDAINED that said Amendment shall be effective as of July 20, 2005 Billing.
