Coke County Foundation formed to serve residents

A new, non-profit organization has been formed to serve residents of Coke County. The Coke County Foundation (CCF) is a community foundation designed to serve a broad range of needs of local citizens.

The Foundation's purpose is to provide a vehicle through which donors may make gifts for charitable, educational, and health uses. The ultimate goals are to improve the quality of life of our communities' residents, promote equality of opportunity, and assist those in need or at risk in Coke County. Funds can support areas of particular interest such as scholarships, children, the arts, education, or needs of the elderly, for example.

The CCF concept was started by a group of local citizens (the Coke County Roping Club) as they applied for a grant to cover the outdoor arena in Bronte. Initially, the group thought that by improving the facility and thereby attracting bigger events, more money could be generated to be returned to the community in the form of academic scholarships to benefit students from

Coke County. Prayers were answered when the Scarborough-Lineberry Foundation committed \$160,000 to the cause, and additional monies are being sought through grants to match the Scarborough-Lineberry contribution.

However, as the Coke County Foundation finalized its direction, the initial vision was expanded to benefit all citizens of the county. It will act as an endowment pool, and is structured as a non-profit 501(c)3 corporation. The CCF can accept contributions in the form of cash, grants, assets and/or estates. Donors can establish a legacy on their behalf or assets can be managed to meet the accepted goals of the Foundation. The CCF has already received individual contributions for the scholarship program - memorial scholarship contributions can be made to honor a local resident or loved one. 



The school year is about to begin and students will be returning from their summer vacation. This 2005 - 2006 school year, our school district will reduce bus routes from three (3) to two (2). *Robert Lee's school district considers State Highway 158 and 208 as hazardous crossings for students living inside the 2 miles restriction for being identified as an eligible bus rider. Our school district will appeal to the transportation department of the Texas Education Agency to allow students who cross these highways to be allowed to ride the school bus. Until permission is received from the Texas Education Agency, only eligible riders will be transported each day. RLISD encourages our parents and community to be patient as the school district awaits the Texas Education Agency's response. 


