Coke-Sterling County Farm Bureau Commemorates Food Check-Out Week

Food in America is affordable. In fact, in just five weeks, the average American will have earned enough disposable income to pay for his or her food supply for the entire year, according to the Coke-Sterling County Farm Bureau.

As a result, the Coke-Sterling County Farm Bureau is celebrating Jan. 29 - Feb. 4, 2006, as Food Check-Out Week. The latest statistics compiled by the Agriculture Department's (USDA's) Economic Research Service indicate American families and individuals currently spend, on average, just 9.5 percent of their disposable personal income for food.

> Applying the current statistic to the calendar year, it means the average household will have income -- that portion of income available for spending or saving -- to pay for its annual food supply in just five weeks.

> Not only is America's food supply the world's safest, but it's also the most affordable, said Bobby Roberts, president of the Coke-Sterling County Farm Bureau. "Our nation's increasing standard of living would certainly be reduced without the safe, abundant and affordable domestic food supply produced by America's farmers and ranchers." Food Check-Out Week tracks the amount of income needed by Americans to purchase food on an annual basis, according to Roberts.

> In comparison to Food Check-Out Week, most Americans worked until mid-April to pay their taxes in 2005, according to The Tax Foundation. Roberts said the high quality, affordable food we enjoy is a product of our successful food production and distribution system, as well as America's farmers retaining

access to effective and affordable crop protection tools.

This week should hold meaning for most Americans, he said. As food producers, we are concerned that some Americans cannot afford to buy the food they need, but we are proud of the role Texas farmers and ranchers play in making our food supply more affordable for all.

The percent of disposable personal income spent for

food has declined over the last 34 years. According to USDA, food is more affordable today due to a widening gap between growth in percapita incomes and the amount of money spent for food.

This overall decrease is made more notable by the fact that trends indicate Americans are buying more expensive convenience food items for preparation at home, as well as more food away from home.



The East Coke County Hospital District (ECCHD) was established by State legislation in 1969 to "...establish a hospital or a hospital system within its boundaries to furnish hospital and medical care to the residents of the district ... provide all necessary hospital and medical care for the needy inhabitants of the district."

DID YOU KNOW ...

- The ECCHD dba BHRC operates at a loss each year - over \$350,000 in 2003, almost \$375,000 in 2004, and over \$425,000 in 2005?
- In 2005, the nursing home had 27 deficiencies at the annual state survey third from the last compared to surrounding counties.
- · The ECCHD has operated without financials since June 2005 - spending your money without direction.
- The ECCHD should be providing medical care to all residents of the county, specifically indigents - not just subsidizing the nursing home.

AND ...

- · Corporate owned nursing homes are profitable without public funds. Look for your taxes to go up next year to cover the YE 6/30/2006 operating loss.
- All but one of the corporate owned nursing homes in surrounding counties had better survey results. Could these be better managed facilities?
- · The District has no idea if this year's budget is accurate or if they are meeting budget projections. Is this how you do your personal finances?
- Your tax dollars could support a clinic and/or an ambulance service and help the nursing home - the ECCHD will collect **\$410,000**+ in taxes this year.
