Dodge Jones Foundation emergency grant benefits **Big Country VFDs**

Overtaxed volunteer firefighters in the Big Country region of West Texas are receiving a welcome boost, thanks to the generosity of the Dodge Jones Foundation, based in Abilene. The foundation made emergency grant funding available through the Texas Forest Service to help replenish equipment and protective gear for 106 fire departments in 22 counties, which each have a \$2,500 grant awaiting them.

"The Dodge Jones Foundation came to us during the height of the wildfire siege and asked what they could do to address the immediate needs of the departments in the Big Country region," said Texas Forest Service Director James Hull. "By giving each department a grant for \$2,500, each one can purchase the items most vital to their continued operation, such as personal protective gear, replacement pumps and vehicle repairs. This will be a great benefit to their communities and the thousands of Texans they serve."

Most of these 106 volunteer fire departments (VFDs) are the first responders to wildfires in their areas, and they have seen more than their share of the state's largest and most

destructive fires during the recent wildfire siege. Many of these departments responded to the 35,300-acre Carbon Fire and the 7,600-acre Cross Roads Fire that burned through the town of Cross Plains.

"This has been a tough fire season, and we're a very small department, only four years old, so we're grateful for any help we can get," said Fire Chief Raymond Helberg with Promontory Park VFD in Comanche County. "We lost all our wildland firefighting gear when our brush truck was burned over on the Carbon Fire. All of our wildland hose, nozzles, everything burned up including our medical supplies. It was quite a loss. We were fortunate that our firefighters only received 2nd degree burns, and they're both fine now."

The Dodge Jones Foundation gift will provide emergency individual grant funds to volunteer fire departments in the following counties: Brown, Callahan, Coke, Coleman, Comanche, Eastland, Erath, Fisher, Haskell, Irion, Jones, Mitchell, Nolan, Reagan, Runnels, Sarry, Shackelford, Stephens, Sterling, Taylor, Throckmorton and Tom Green.



The East Coke County Hospital District (ECCHD) was established by State legislation in 1969 to "...establish a hospital or a hospital system within its boundaries to furnish hospital and medical care to the residents of the district ... provide all necessary hospital and medical care for the needy inhabitants of the district."

DID YOU KNOW ...

- The ECCHD dba BHRC operates at a loss each year - over \$350,000 in 2003, almost \$375,000 in 2004, and over \$425,000 in 2005?
- In 2005, the nursing home had 27 deficiencies at the annual state survey third from the last compared to surrounding counties.
- · The ECCHD has operated without financials since June 2005 - spending your money without direction.
- The ECCHD should be providing medical care to all residents of the county, specifically indigents - not just subsidizing the nursing home.

AND ...

- · Corporate owned nursing homes are profitable without public funds. Look for your taxes to go up next year to cover the YE 6/30/2006 operating loss.
- All but one of the corporate owned nursing homes in surrounding counties had better survey results. Could these be better managed facilities?
- · The District has no idea if this year's budget is accurate or if they are meeting budget projections. Is this how you do your personal finances?
- · Your tax dollars could support a clinic and/or an ambulance service and help the nursing home - the ECCHD will collect **\$410,000+** in taxes this year.


Do not blame the schools but do not make yourself totally dependent on their timetables, either. The average teacher in Texas has 3.5 minutes per student per day to answer questions. This is not enough time for most students. Also a good coach knows that a student has the best chance to win a race when that student practices in the exact conditions

So....Parents and Students who are reading this....Do you want to not only pass the TAKS but to make Commended Performance on it? Go website the TEA (www.tea.state.tx.us/student. assessment/resources/release/) and download three copies of the released TAKS tests along with the answers. Two copies should be grade appropriate and one test should be one grade above the level of the student. The student then goes through the first test and decides which questions are clear, which are confusing, which have what are called distracters or mental traps. Working through three tests one question at a time and checking the answer immediately helps the brain record only the information and format that is correct. Problems should be spaced out over the three weeks prior to the test. The student is in control. There is no incorrect learning and the student spots questions designed for failure. If the chosen answer is wrong, immediate help by parent or mentor will keep the student from storing incorrect information.

REMEMBER IT IMPORTANT TO MAKE ALL YOUR MISTAKES BEFORE IT COUNTS. BUT THE MISTAKES HAVE TO BE CORRECTED **IMMEDIATELY** TO GUARANTEE MENTAL ACCURACY. Otherwise your child is storing as much wrong information as he or she is storing correct. Reward your child for the effort. Find another student and parent who can use your knowledge. And ask your school's PTA to host test-taking workshops for students and parents, it makes you an independent thinker and prepares you for college. Do not let the TAKS own you; YOU own the TAKS.





Rural Rental Housing available through USDA **Rural Development**

Bryan Daniel, USDA Rural Development State Director, announced recently that USDA Rural Development is accepting applications for the Guaranteed Rural Rental Housing Program. Funding in the amount of \$99 million nationwide is available to guarantee loans for the construction, acquisition, or rehabilitation of rural multifamily housing.

"The Guaranteed Rural Rental Housing Program not only provides decent and affordable housing, but is an important

development efforts," said Daniel. "The availability of affordable rental housing is often a key element in whether a business decides to locate or remain in a rural community."

NTESCHOOL

The Guaranteed Rural Rental Housing Program is intended to fund construction, acquisition, or rehabilitation of rural multifamily housing for low-income occupants. The program guarantees up to 90% of the amount of the loan from a private lender to a housing developer. Residents of the completed housing facility must be very low-to moderate-income households; or elderly, handicapped, or disabled persons with income not in excess of 115% of the median income of the surrounding area.

Eligible lending partners for the Guaranteed Rural Rental Housing Program are those approved and considered eligible by the Federal National Mortgage Association, Federal Home Loan Mortgage Corporation, State Housing Finance Agencies, and a member of the Federal Housing Finance Board or the Department of Housing and Urban Development. Other lenders have the opportunity to enter into a correspondent bank relationship with approved lenders in order to participate in the program. The terms of the loans guaranteed may be up to 40 years, and the loans must be fully amortized.

Under Federal guidelines posted in the Notice of Fund Availability, interested and eligible lenders must submit loan applications to the USDA Rural Development State Office, Housing Programs, 101 South Main, Suite 102, Temple, Texas 76501 by June 16, 2006. Child Passenger Safety Week

The week of February 12-18th is national Child Passenger safety week. Nation wide, crashes kill more than 1,600 child passengers a year and injure more than 210,000. There is no excuse for an unbuckled child.

* Infants and toddlers ride in safety restraints more than 90 percent of the time, but children ages 4-7 ride in safety restraints only 73 percent of the time.

* Kids who have outgrown car seats (usually 40 pounds, but some car seats are rated for 60 pounds or more) are safer and more comfortable on a booster seat until they are 57 inches tall and 80 to 100 pounds.

Car seats reduce the risk of fatal injury in passenger cars by up to 71 percent for infants and 54% for toddlers. Booster seats for older kids reduce the risk of injury by 60 percent compared to safety belts alone.

* Just going around the corner? Most crashes occur on short trips close to home and on low speed roads, not highways.

* You'll hold your child tightly in your arms? Holding a 10 pound baby in a 40 mph crash is like jumping out a window holding a 400 pound weight.

* If your child rides in a car pool, make sure all drivers follow the correct safety rules based on age, height and weight for everyone in the car.






