Early voting in May 13 local elections begins Monday

Early voting in the May 13, 2006, local elections is scheduled to begin Monday, May 1, and continue through Tuesday, May 9, 2006.

Only two local entities, Bronte Independent School District and the City of Robert Lee, will require an election.

Early voting for the Bronte

ISD election will be conducted in the BISD Superintendent's office from 8 am to 4 pm Monday through Friday.

Three 3 year terms will be on the ballot for the Bronte Independent School District Board of Trustees. The terms of Wayne Coalson, Jeff Schoenfield, and Bob Frazee are expiring. The incumbents will be joined on the ballot by Paul Williams.

Early voting for the City of Robert Lee election will be conducted in the Coke County Clerk's office at the Coke County Courthouse from 8 am to 4 pm Monday through Thursday, and from 8 am to 1 pm on Fridays.

The City of Robert Lee will have to fill the position of Mayor - two year term, Two (2) Council Members - two year terms, and One (1) Council Member - One Year Unexpired Term. City Officials terms expiring are: Mayor, Joe White, Council Members, Beth Prather, Bonita Copeland, and Gary Payne. All incumbents and Brenda Williams have filed for places on the ballot.

Outdoor activities and conservation videos are very instrumental in illustrating the importance of human responsibility to maintain a healthy active environment.

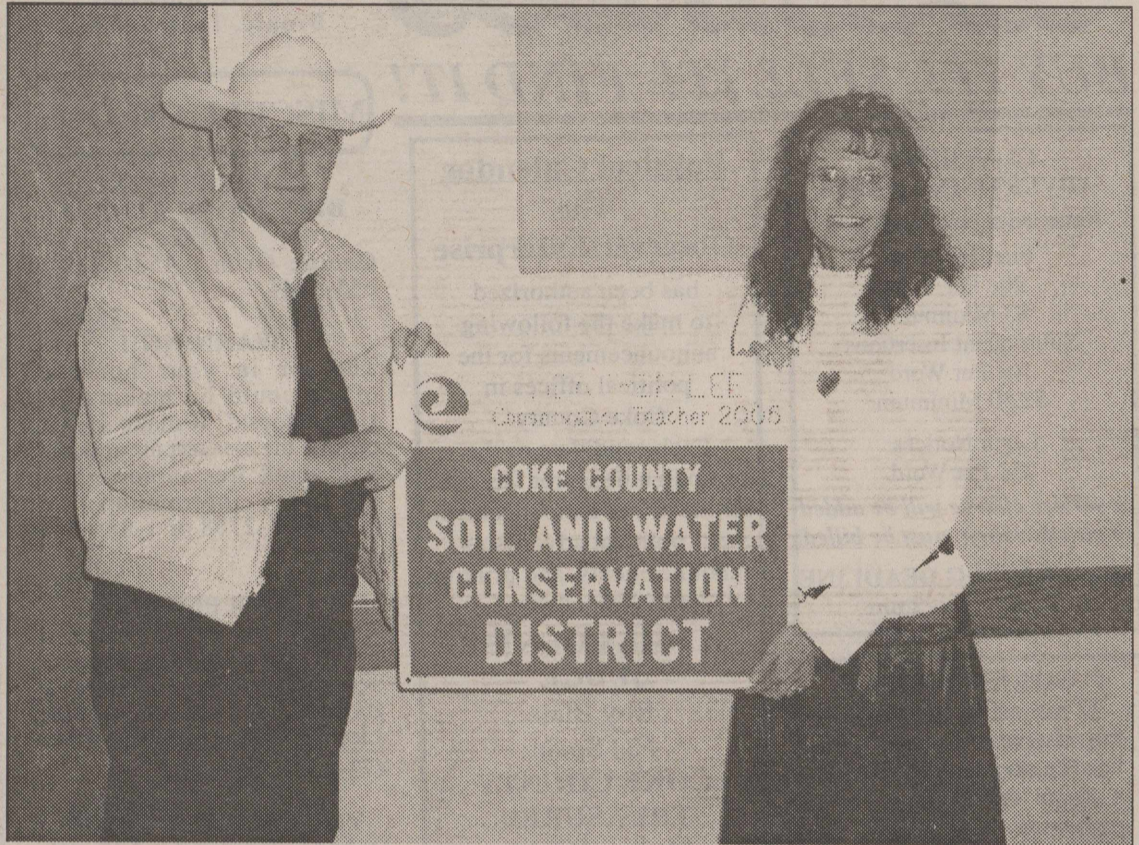

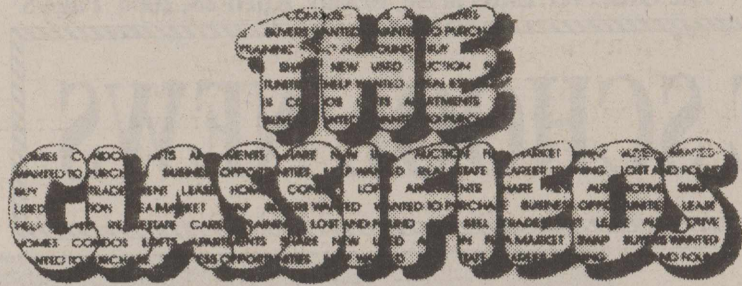
