## Blueborinet

 Brigade decides to wait untilnext year by Hal Spain After consulting with several of our local bluebonnet experts and cooperators, the decision has been made to wait until next year to continue the group effort to harvest and distribute bluebonnet seedThere are a number of environmental factors which made this an easy decision, concerning this year's harvest. The dry weather that extended from the end of October through March was probably the most critical factor. As most bluebonnet enthusiasts know, the little plants emerge in the fall and remain close to ground level until the late winter and spring rains cause them to grow and put on the beautiful flowers.
This year's dry fall and winter stressed this year's crop, and many didn't make it until the rain
finally came in March. What bluebonnets we did have were somewhat stunted and short, although in some areas we did have some pretty spots, at least for a short time. As was pointed out in the Standard Times, Coke County once again had the prettiest bluebonnets around this year, as the Hill Country of Texas suffered another year of limited production
The good news is that the bluebonnet is a perennial flower with a very hard seed coat. The state flower is very adept at compensating for dry conditions, as that hard seed can remain viable for up to ten years, waiting for the right time to germinate. If conditions improve next year, we could very easily have an abundance of the pretty flowers. If that happens, we'll be ready to harvest some more seed and distribute them throughout the county.
It may not be too late for some individual efforts this year, if you have a good stand of bluebonnets you'd like to harvest and spread around. If you do, you'll have to act quickly, cause the seedheads are shattering quickly with the heat and dry conditions.
As far as our brigade efforts, we'll just wait and plan on getting together next year to continue our seed distribution. Over the course of several years, we hope to make Coke County "the place to visit", if they want to see the prettiest bluebonnets in Texas.

The best way to control the red imported fire ant is the Texas Two Step method. This plan follows an integrated pest managemen approach that involves minimal risk to people, pets, and the overall environment. The first step is to broadcast bait. The bait should contain a food source and an insecticide. This is carried by the worker ants to the rest of the colony, where it becomes a shared food source and kills the entire colony. The second step is to treat mounds individually Applying a mound drench will provide immediate control but should only be done in mounds around a home's foundation or in high traffic areas.
