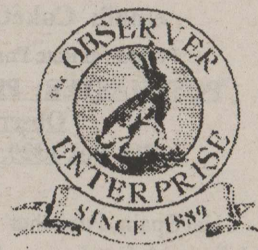

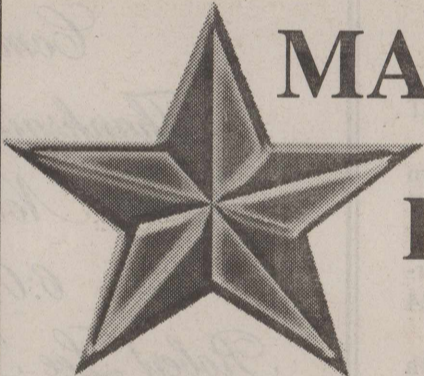
prayer for Jerrod's brother Jesse now stationed in Germany.

Small Grain Forage test established

We have established a small grain forage demonstration on Phelan Wrinkle's place just north of Robert Lee on Sanco Road (begins where Washington street ends - road going in front of the school parking lot). The plot begins on the south end with one drill width of Jagger wheat, one drill width of Jagalene wheat, two widths of Fannin wheat, two widths of Sturdy 2K wheat, two widths of Winmaster wheat, one width of Cutter wheat, one width of Cutter and Australian Winter Peas mixed. Beginning past the road there is one width of Abilene Ag Exp. Wheat, two widths of Longhorn wheat, one width of Tamcale 5019 triticale mixed with Purpletop turnips, one width of Tamcale 5019, two widths of Plot

Spike oats, two widths of Horizon 314 oats and two widths of Walken oats.

This plot was established with the assistance of Farm Bureau directors John Stephens, John Jacobs, Bobby Roberts and Sutton Page on October 27. We will be harvesting forage samples beginning in early spring to determine the forage production levels and comparisons between the varieties. Signs will be posted on each variety later on and producers are invited to watch this test as the year progresses.



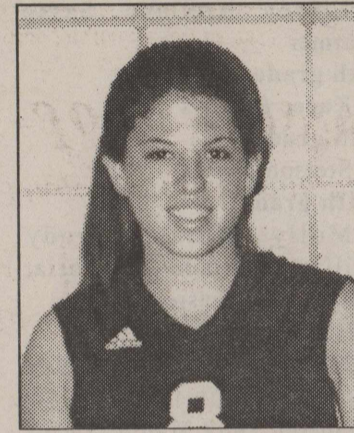
