Attends Seminar Judge Joan Davis was certified at the recent TwentyHour Justice of the Peace Seminar held May 15-18, 2007 in Lubbock, Texas. The seminar was sponsored by the Texas Justice Court Training Center, a division of Texas State University-San Marcos, with offices in Austin, Texas. The seminar is one of five held for elected Justices of the Peace so they can fulfill their Continuing Judicial Education Requirements as set forth in Article 27.005 of the Texas Government Code. The seminar addressed topics such as Judicial Ethics, Juvenile Law, Small Claims/Justice Court, Elements of Criminal Law, Clerkless Courts: Criminal and Civil Issues, Juvenile Sentencing, Judging Civil and Small Claims Cases, Legal Analysis, Clerkless Courts: Spanish Legal Terminology, Coping With Death Scenes, Appellate Procedures, Chapter 45, Expunctions, Court Technology: Security, Inquests Procedure, Hearsay, Ruling on Objections, Constable Duties, Court Technology: Hardware/Software, Property Code: Leases, DWI Magistration, Collections, Beginning Computers, Pretrial Motions and Post Trial Remedies.
