## Brewers establish largest scholarship fund in Coke Co.

After a life of dedication and service to the education of students all over West Texas, it is only fitting that Jack and Nina Brewer would establish a scholarship fund that will continue to benefit Robert Lee students forever. Jack and Nina established the scholarship fund in 2003, which goes to graduates of Robert Lee High School, with preference given to those attending the First United Methodist Church of Robert Lee. In those short four years, the fund has awarded \$22,300 to more than thirty Robert Lee graduates, with \$9800 being presented this past spring.

As an endowed scholarship, the fund will continue to award scholarships to Robert Lee students forever. What a tremendous resource for the young people of Robert Lee, and what a mag-

nificent legacy by this inspiring West Texas couple.

Jack was born in Stilwell, Oklahoma in 1927, and attended public schools there. After graduation, he volunteered for the Navy and served until the end of World War II. Following his discharge, he played football at Oklahoma Eastern A&M and graduated from Northeastern State at Tahlequah. He then moved to Borger, Texas to begin a 36-year coaching career.

Nina (Starkey) was born at Hart, Texas, raised at Muleshoe, Texas, and graduated from Texas Tech with a degree in physical education in 1950. She met and married Jack Brewer when they were both coaching and teaching at Borger, Texas.

Jack moved up the ladder to coach at Howard Payne University for three years,

and Nina taught physical education in the women's department. They then moved to La Vega High School in Waco, where Jack was head coach from 1956-1958, with Nina also serving in a coaching position.

Jack and Nina next moved to Odessa and the Ector County ISD, where Jack continued his service as a coach and athletic director. Nina coached in junior high for 28 years in the Ector Co. ISD, and then taught special education the last seven years of her teaching career at Odessa.

Jack and Nina retired and moved to Robert Lee in 1986. They both loved to fish and spent many happy hours together at Lake Spence and Lake Ivie. The Brewers were also involved in church activities and loved doing civic work.

### Pine Trees Turning Brown?

Around the county there are several cases of pine trees turning brown with dead areas scattered over most of the tree. This has been occurring over the last couple of years. There have been some large trees that have eventually died and had to be removed, especially around Bronte.

The cause of this browning effect is called Diplodia which is basically a fungus "diplodia pinea". It usually occurs following some type of stress to the tree, winter freeze damage, extended drought, improper watering or hail injury. Many of

the so-called drought tolerant pines, such as the Afghan Pine, are not as drought tolerant as we thought and the extended dry conditions we have been in the last few years has been a major cause of diplodia.

There is no cure for this disease and the tree will gradually develop more and more dead areas and eventually die completely. The root system is not very stable once a large pine tree dies and there is a possibility heavy winds can cause the tree to fall. Since a lot of these trees are close to houses, it is best to "bite the bullet" and have the tree removed. Once it gets diplodia it is a "goner" and gradually looks worse and worse - so the best thing to do is remove these damaged trees and possibly plant new species.

### Tent Caterpillar on Mountain Laurels

This past week I have had calls on caterpillars eating foliage on

shrubs. The ones I found were on mountain laurels and had the top third completely defoliated. These are a species of tent caterpillars that specifically attack the mountain laurel. They can be identified as caterpillars that are about the size of pencil lead 1 - 2 inches long, greenish gold in color with a black head, hairs on each segment of the body and small black and white spots on each body segment.

These tent caterpillars can completely defoliate a shrub, preventing it from blooming this year and next year also. They can be easily controlled with a general use insecticide such as Sevin, Malathion, Merit or with a growth regulator called BT (Bacillus Thuringensis) which is organic. If you get these caterpillars, they are easily controlled if caught early, but you can expect one to two more generations about 45 days apart.

### Summer Lawn Care Tips

**Increase Mowing Height** - There is a correlation between the cutting height and the total amount of root mass. The taller you allow your turfgrass to grow, the more volume there is to the root system. Therefore, you should increase your mowing height by several inches during the hot summer months to encourage development of the root system.

**Water Smart** - Water, either too much or not enough will hurt the health of your lawns. Overwatering is not much of a problem this time of year. Lack of sufficient water is a more common problem in the summer-time, especially with lack of rainfall we are experiencing. It is best to water just before your lawn starts to wilt. In the early stages of wilt, your grass will take on a dull, purplish cast and begin to roll. Also, if you walk across your lawn and you can

see your footprints in the grass, it is time to water.

**Aerate Your Soil** - all plants, including turfgrasses, need oxygen to survive. If the soil is compacted through years of traffic, the plant roots cannot get oxygen in sufficient amounts to continue good growth. Next to proper watering, aeration is probably the most important thing you can do to improve your lawn.

**Compost-Yes! Fertilizer-No!** - Do not apply any synthetic fertilizer during the hot dry summer months. Lawns that are highly fertilized require more water, more frequent mowing and are likely to suffer during the winter months. Instead, wait until September and apply one of the winterized fertilizers that contains a slow release form of nitrogen. You can apply a two to three inch layer of compost now. If you notice iron chlorosis (yellow leaves) on your St. Augustine turf, apply iron sulfate or a chelated iron according to the label directions.

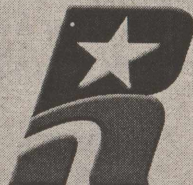
