Pine Trees Turning Brown? Around the county there are several cases of pine trees turning brown with dead areas scattered over most of the tree. This

has been occurring over the last couple of years. There have been some large trees that have eventually died and had to be removed, especially around Bronte.

The cause of this browning effect is called Diplodia which is basically a fungus "diplodia pinea". It usually occurs following some type of stress to the tree, winter freeze damage, extended drought, improper watering or hail injury. Many of

the so-called drought tolerant pines, such as the Afghan Pine, are not as drought tolerant as we thought and the extended dry conditions we have been in the last few years has been a major cause of diplodia.

There is no cure for this disease and the tree will gradually develop more and more dead areas and eventually die completely. The root system is not very stable once a large pine tree dies and there is a possibility heavy winds can cause the tree to fall. Since a lot of these trees are close to houses, it is best to "bite the bullet" and have the tree removed. Once it gets diplodia it is a "goner" and gradually looks worse and worse - so the best thing to do is remove these damaged trees and possibly plant new species.

Tent Caterpillar on **Mountain Laurels**

This past week I have had calls on caterpillars eating foliage on

shrubs. The ones I found were on mountain laurels and had the top third completely defoliated. These are a species of tent caterpillars that specifically attack the mountain laurel. They can be identified as caterpillars that are about the size of pencil lead 1 -2 inches long, greenish gold in color with a black head, hairs on each segment of the body and small black and white spots on each body segment.

These tent caterpillars can completely defoliate a shrub, preventing it from blooming this year and next year also. They can be easily controlled with a general use insecticide such as Sevin, Malathion, Merit or with a growth regulator called BT (Bacillus Theringensis) which is organic. If you get these caterpillars, they are easily controlled if caught early, but you can expect one to two more generations about 45 days apart.

The taller you allow your turfgrass to grow, the more volume there is you should increase your mowing height by several inches during the hot summer months to encourage development of the root system.
