## City of Robert Lee receives \$3,987 for clean-up purposes

The City of Robert Lee received \$3,987 to clean up unauthorized trash dump sites located throughout the city and county. Collections during the clean-up included: 1600 passenger tires, 425 truck tires and 41 tractor tires. Other materials gathered were furniture, white appliances and various types of metals. Funding was provided through the innovative approach to resolve enforcement actions accessed by Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ). The Supplemental Environmental Program (SEP) policy provides an alternative payment of amount of an administrative penalty incurred by a local entity to be used for improving environmental quality. A respondent in an enforcement action may negotiate an agreement to perform a SEP contract in return for a reduction in administrative penalty.

As a result of the tire recycling, other clean-up efforts in the community have been coordinated by the city and other non-profit groups.

Local coordination for the clean-up was provided by the City of Robert Lee, Coke County Commissioners Court and Concho Valley Resource Conservation and Development (RC&D) Area.

Please feel free to share this with anyone who might be a possible donor. This special little boy and the family will need all the help and prayers that they can get.

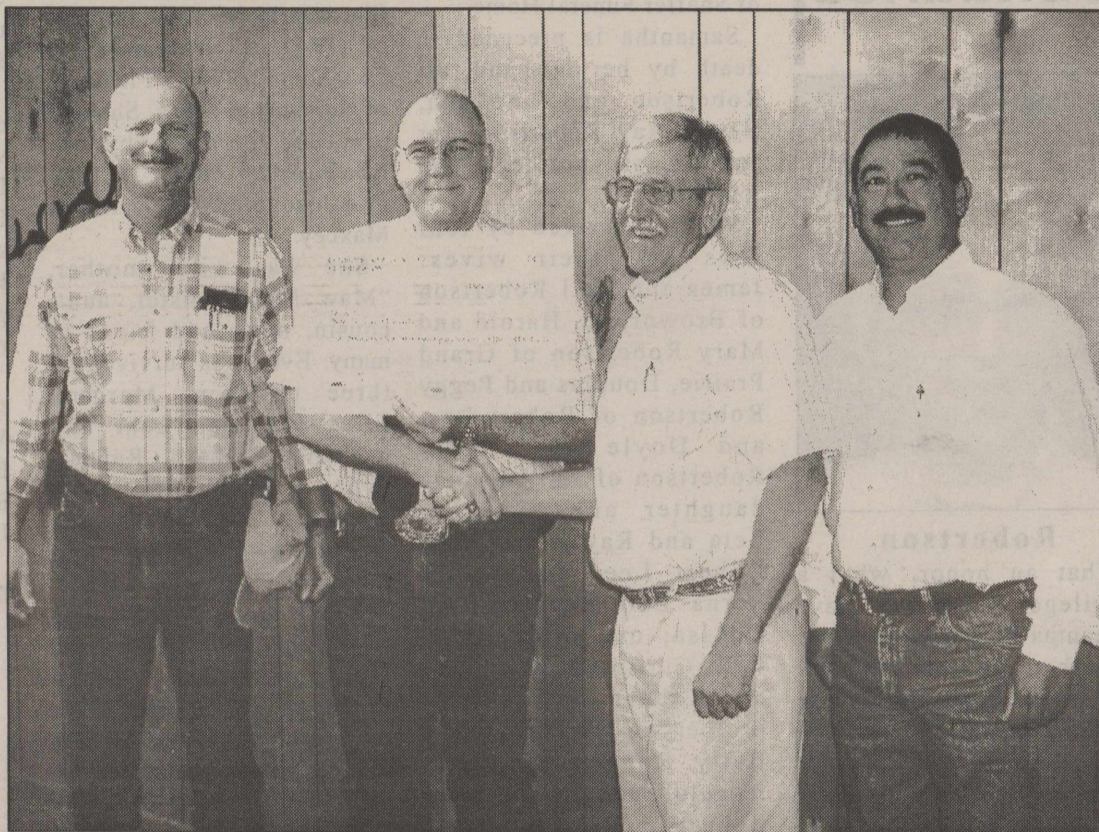
### Family Council and Caregiver Support Group meeting set

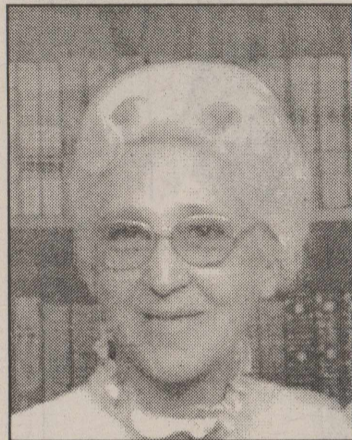
**Area Agency On Aging meeting slated for July 25**

### A&M Beef Cattle Short Course Set for Aug. 6-8

The 53rd annual Texas A&M Beef Cattle Short Course will be held Aug. 6-8 at Texas A&M University in College Station. "Planning committee members from around the state have met with us and helped us put together another outstanding program," said Dr. Jason Cleere, Texas Cooperative Extension beef cattle specialist and conference coordinator.

"This year's short course will address cost increases in fertilizer, fuel, equipment and grain and how they affect a rancher's profits," Cleere said. "Increasing feed and fertilizer costs continue to put a lot of pressure on beef cattle producers to look for new ways to produce a pound of beef more economically," he said. "In the near future, economics may override traditional ranch practices." The short course, sponsored by Texas Cooperative Extension, will address these issues as well as other topics during the three-day event, providing information for the novice rancher as well as for the most seasoned one.

"The 2007 short course will be one of the most important programs of the year for today's beef producers looking to the future," said Dr. Larry Boleman, assistant deputy vice chancellor and conference director.

"Previous participants always comment on the variety of topics that are offered during the Beef Cattle Short Course," he said. "One of the most popular features of the short course is the 'Cattleman's College', where participants can choose workshops and topics from a field of approximately 17 different subjects on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday. The concurrent workshops will feature information on ranch management, nutrition, reproduction, genetics, pastures, carcass evaluation, record keeping, organic and natural beef production." In addition to the Cattleman's College sessions, a key general session will be offered on Monday afternoon. The Wednesday "Cattleman's College" sessions are designed to offer a more hands-on approach to calf working, cattle handling, cattle selection, carcass evaluation and record keeping. Participants will also have an opportunity to obtain a Private Applicators License that day.

In addition to the Cattleman's College sessions, a key general session will be offered on Monday afternoon. "The goal of the Beef Cattle Short Course each year is to provide the most cutting-edge information that is vital

to beef cattle producers," said Cleere. "Changing Dynamics of the U.S. Beef Industry" will be the theme of the general session this year, and we have already lined up some of the nation's top speakers.

Participants can earn numerous pesticide continuing education units (CEUs) if already licensed. The trade show will feature more than 100 agricultural businesses and service exhibits, Cleere said. Registration is \$140 per person before July 30, and includes educational materials, a copy of the 300-page Beef Cattle Short Course proceedings, trade show admittance, tickets to the prime rib dinner, five additional meals and daily refreshments. Registration information and tentative schedule will be mailed to previous participants in June and can also be found on the short course web site. ### West Texas Deer Study Group to Meet Aug. 7-8 in San Angelo

The West Texas Deer Study Group will have its 10th annual program August 7-8 at the Texas A&M University System Research and Extension Center in San Angelo. Anyone interested in deer management is invited to attend. The meeting starts with registration at 8 a.m., August 7.

Dr. Dale Rollins, Extension wildlife specialist at San Angelo, said this year's theme is "Enterprise Aspects of the Deer Business."

"The interest in what I call 'intensive' deer management continues to climb in Texas, and throughout the whitetail's range for that matter," Rollins said. "Some of that growth is prompted by personal interest in 'how big a buck can I grow,' and some is prompted by economic interest. The two rationales may not always jibe.

"Our aim for this year's meeting is the business

aspects of deer management; that is, to see why or why not the two schools of thought don't always go together. We'll also have a host of other topics addressing everything from ethics to recipes."

A sampling of those topics includes: "The Business of Deer and Deer Hunting," "Maximum Profits - Minimum Headaches," "Integrated Captive Breeding," "Culinary Side of a Hunting Lodge," and "Cashing in on Does, Culls and Misfits."

The group was formed in 1998 to advance sound deer and habitat management in West Texas, the region considered west of Interstate 35 and north of U.S. Highway 90, Rollins said.

### Big Country Beef Conference Set for August 9 in Abilene

Texas Cooperative Extension's Big Country Beef Conference has been set for August 9. The biennial conference starts with registration at 8 a.m. in the Big Country Hall adjacent to the Extension offices at the Taylor County Expo Center grounds.

This year's event will cover everything from effects of ethanol production to agroterrorism. The conference is the largest and most comprehensive educational beef program in the Big Country. We typically draw speakers and participants from across Texas and Oklahoma.

Session 1 of the program will begin with a beef industry outlook given by Mr. Eldon White, Executive Vice President of the Texas and Southwestern Cattle Raisers Association. Dr. David Anderson, Extension Economist from College Station will then discuss current market trends and Impact of Ethanol production on grain, feed and cattle markets.

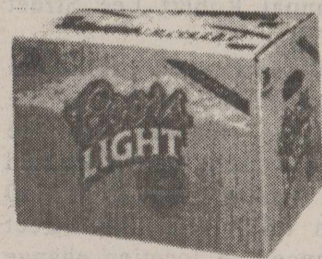

Session 2 will begin with Dr. Bruce Carpenter, Extension Livestock Specialist from Fort Stockton discussing beef quality management and proper chuteside management. Tim Turner D.V.M. with Southwestern Livestock Mineral in San Angelo will conclude this session with a presentation on selecting a livestock mineral program for cows, calves and stocker cattle.

Session 3 will begin after lunch with Dr. Robert Wells, Livestock Specialist with the Noble Foundation from Ardmore, Oklahoma. Dr. Wells will be covering recent beef cattle and small grains research. Ben Weinheimer with the Texas Cattle Feeders Association will then discuss the USDA Quality System Assurance (QSA) programs for age and sources verified cattle.

In the 4th and final session, Dr. Allan McGinty, Extension Range specialist, from San Angelo will discuss the need for weed and brush control on your ranch. Gary Macnoll, FBI special agent from Abilene will conclude our conference with a special look at agro-terrorism in a post 9/11 environment.

The conference will be conducted by the Extension offices in Callahan, Shackelford and Taylor counties. Two Texas Department of Agriculture continuing education units will be available for private pesticide applicator license-holders. Individual registration is \$5 if you pre-register by August 3, and \$15 thereafter. Registration includes entire program and noon meal.

Mickey West has agreed to chair the booth organization and will make his barber shop on Austin Street the central location for the

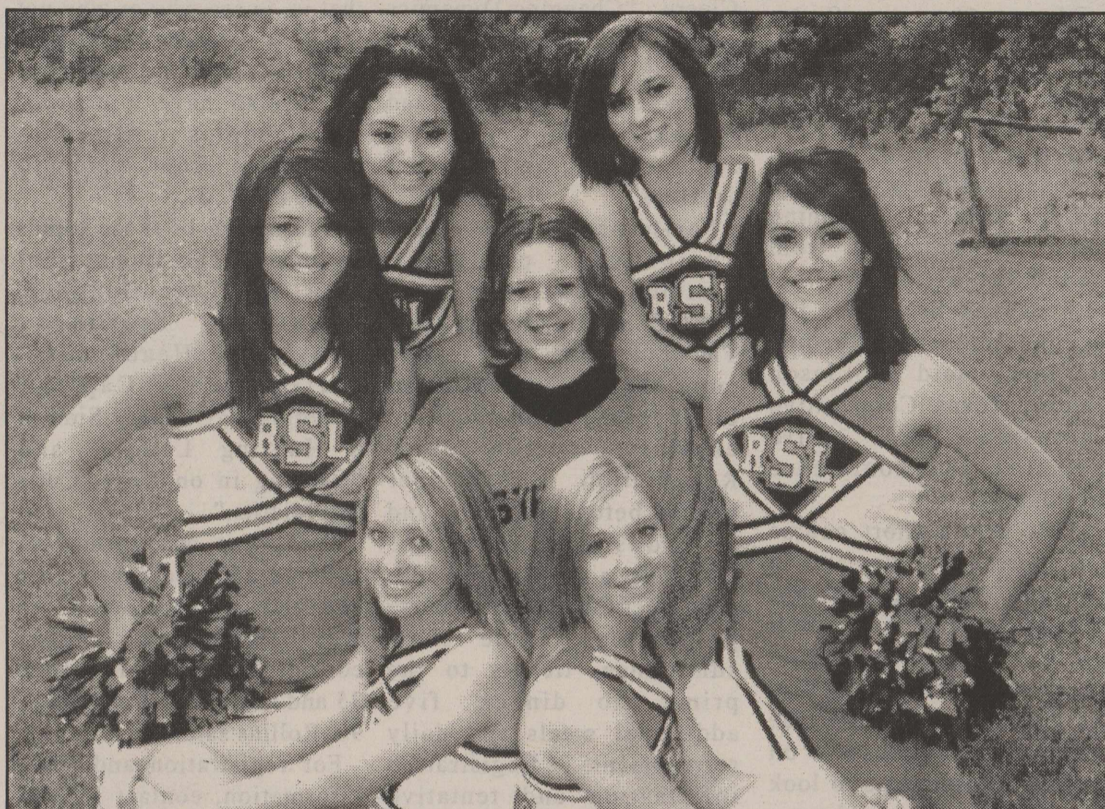

**ORDINANCE #398**

Amendment to Ordinance #274

ORDINANCE #274 of the City of Bronte, Texas, is hereby amended as to Section G and Section I to read as follows:

**SECTION G - COLLECTION CHARGES**

(a) Premises used for private residences, single or double unit apartment houses, single mobile home sites and/or locations, shall be charged \$13.15 per family unit as to occupied residences, apartments, and units.

(b) Premises used for commercial business, and/or public purposes not receiving sanitation container service as described herein shall be charged \$14.60 per month for 1 through 7 containers per week.

(c) Premises located outside the City Limits shall be charged at a rate of 1.5 times above the rate charged to the City by its trash collection provider. Said premises must be served by another City utility for which a bill is sent.

**SECTION I - CONTAINERIZED SANITATION SYSTEM:**
