Dove season opens Saturday

By Hal Spain, Publisher Last year at this time we were moaning about the dry weather and the slim prospects for the then upcoming dove season. And, we were right. Last year's dove harvest in Coke County was limited to a very few dove near water sources and not many elsewhere.

This year should be a complete turnaround. The dry conditions we endured last year have been replaced with one of the wettest years in the history of the county. Locals have seen above average dove numbers so far, and feeding locations are abundant. In fact, that may be part of the problem dove hunting this year. Feeding locations are so abundant that dove may not congregate in only one or two feeding areas, especially if they get much hunting pressure. Some of us, at least, feel that is a good problem to have as opposed to last year's situation.

I can't think of any new hunting regulations which have been implemented since

While you're at it, you'll probably want to purchase an upland game bird endorsement for another \$7.00, which is required to hunt turkey, pheasant, and quail. If you plan on hunting turkey or deer with a bow, you will need an archery stamp endorsement (\$7.00), and a duck stamp (\$17.00) if you plan on doing any duck or goose hunting.

All migratory game bird hunters will need to be certified in the HIP Program, which is available at the time you purchase your new license. Just indicate to the clerk where you buy your new license that you will be hunting migratory birds, and you can answer a few questions and receive your certification.

Dove season will open in our area (the Central Zone, basically the area between Interstates 10 & 20), on Saturday, September 1 and run through October 30. The late dove season will be from December 26, 2007 through January 4, 2008. Daily bag limit in the Central Zone is 12 mourning, white-winged, and white-tipped (white-fronted) doves in the aggregate, to include not more than two white-tips. Daily bag limit in the North Zone (above Interstate 20) is 15 per day, which is a little confusing as close as we are to Colorado City, Sweetwater, and Abilene. All areas north of those cities are in the North Zone, and the limit is 15. However, areas south of those cities and north of Interstate 10 are in the Central Zone, and our limit is 12 per day. As in the past, possession limit is twice the daily bag limit, or 24 in the Central Zone.

Legal shooting hours for dove are from 1/2 hour before sunrise to sunset. Don't forget to plug those auto loaders and pumps; so that they are incapable of holding more than three shells for migratory bird hunting. Hunting over baited areas such as deer feeders is prohibited, as is hunting from a vehicle.
