Runoff election set for April 8

County and District Clerk Mary Grim has informed the newspaper that there will be a runoff election in Coke County and throughout the state on Tuesday, April 8. In the Democratic Primary, there is a runoff election for Texas Railroad Commissioner between Mark Thompson and Dale Henry. The first day for early voting in the runoff election is March 31. Early voting will continue through April 4. The last day to apply for a ballot by mail for the runoff election is April 1. Mrs. Grim reiterated that the application must be received by the April 1 deadline, and not mailed or postmarked by the deadline date. The voting procedure will be a little different for the runoff, according to Mrs. Grim. Precincts 1 & 3 will be combined to vote in the courthouse, and Precincts 2 & 4 will be combined to vote at the Senior Citizens'

Building in Bronte on election day. As usual, voting hours will be from 7 am until 7 pm on Tuesday, April 8.

Only those who voted in the Democratic Primary election on March 4, and those who did not vote on March 4, but are registered to vote, are eligible to participate in this runoff election. If you voted in the Republican Primary election, you are ineligible to vote in the Democratic runoff election.
