In Bronte, Jimmie Guthrie reported 1.1 inches at Bronte, with Dewey Luckett recording 1.4 inches in town and 1.8 inches in the country. Ed Cumbie reported 1.4 inches north of Bronte, and Wayne McCutchen recorded the most with 2.4 inches total

Local elections set for May 10

Several local taxing entities will be conducting elections on May 10 to determine who will serve in leadership capacities for our schools and cancellation of election is discussed below:

The Bronte Independent included in this issue. School District has five candidates who have filed for same dates as the BISD 2 positions on the board of election, and election day is trustees. Incumbents Kendall Gibbs and Scott Frasier will be joined on the ballot by Shane Kelton, David McWright, and Paul Williams. Early voting will be conducted at the school from April 28 through May 6, with election day voting to be held at City Hall on May

In years past, with no contested spots on the RLISD school board, the election may have been cancelled. However, the RLISD ballot contains a bond election issue on this year's ballot. By law, the trustee election cannot be cancelled due to the bond proposal on the ballot.

(for or against) The issuance of \$15,000,000 of bonds for Robert Lee Independent School District and levying the tax in payment thereof. 2.
