# School bond issue passes; voters also elect school board and city council members in local elections

By a 3 to 1 margin, Robert Lee Independent School District voters approved the school bond issue on Saturday, May 10, in local election results. The first bond proposal was for "the issuance of \$15,000,000 of bonds for Robert Lee Independent School District and levying the tax in payment thereof", for the purpose of building a new school. Voters approved the proposal by a 332-92 margin. Concerning the second bond proposal, for "a maintenance tax as limited by Chapter 45 of the Texas Education Code", voters approved this proposal by a 316-87 margin.

RLISD voters also elected Jeffie Roberts and Irma Torres to three year terms, with 306 votes for Roberts and 274 for Torres. Brandi Brosh was also elected to the board for a one year unexpired term with 341 votes.

In Bronte Independent School District voting, newcomers David McWright and Paul Williams were elected to the school board with 127 and 89 votes, respectively. Shane Kelton received 86 votes, with Kendall Gibbs receiving 57 votes and Scott Frasier 35 votes.

Joe White was returned to office with 207 votes over challenger Richard Cantrell, with 52 votes. In the RL City Council race, John Jacobs and Bonita Cartrite will serve on the new council, with 200 and 146 votes, respectively. Trey Sawyer received 86 votes in the election for city council members.

Three local elections were cancelled due to no contested Alvin Jones, Jim races. Guthrie, and Buzz Gohman will serve on the Bronte City Council for 2-year terms. Gerald Sandusky filed for reelection as mayor and will serve in that position for the new term.

In the East Coke County Hospital District election, Alonzo Robbins, Garry Bivins, and Lee Wommack will serve 2-year terms as board members for the district.

Pat Stephens, Mike Lomas, and Marilyn White will be serving 2-year terms as well on the West Coke County Hospital District board of directors, as their election was also cancelled.







#### Steers Capture State Title

The Robert Lee Steers golf team completed a near perfect season, capturing the Class 1-A State Championship last week (May 5-6) in Austin at the Morris Williams Golf Course. The Steers ousted the Class A competition with a 21 stroke victory over second place finisher, Iraan. The Steers jumped out to their big lead after the first round with a score of 328, followed by a 330 on day two, giving them a 658 total. Iraan was second at 679 and Goldthwaite was third at 696, edging out the Steers district rival, Garden City, by four strokes.

Logan Philley led the Steers with a 74-79-153 total over the two-day event, good enough to finish as the State Runner-up in the medalist competition. Brody Dillard finished tied for 10th with his 83-82-165 and Cameron Hodge was a stroke behind Dillard at 85-81-166. Haden Dillard shot 86-88-174 and Mason Ross rounded out the team scoring with 87-91-178 total.

The State Title, the first for the Steers since 1992, topped off a great season which saw the Steers win seven tournaments and finish

State 2-A champions, Salado, at the San Saba Invitational early in the year. Freshman, Logan Philley topped the Steers in scoring with a 74.3 average, winning four tournaments and finishing 2nd or tied for 2nd in the Steers' remaining four tournaments. Seniors Brody Dillard and Cameron Hodge finished in the 2nd and 3rd spots in scoring average with an 82.4 for Dillard and 82.6 for Hodge. Dillard tied for 3rd medalist at Bentwood and was 3rd in the District Tournament. Hodge was 3rd medalist at Robert Lee, 5th at District, and 12th at Regional. Freshman Haden Dillard had an 84 average and was District runner-up to Philley. Junior Mason Ross had an 84.9 average and was 7th at the District Tournament. Senior Taylor Percifull was 2nd at Robert Lee, 5th at the District Tournament, and had an 84.7 average. The returning Steers next tournament will be in February of 2009 and the Senior Steers will be missed.

# Expert says pecan nut casebearers need attention soon

When it comes to saving dicted date for the first sigpecans from the pecan nut casebearer, time is of the essence, according to a Texas AgriLife Extension Service expert.

"In Texas, May can be a make-or-break month for pecan (nut) production," said Dr. Chris Sansone, AgriLife Extension entomologist at San Angelo. "It's also the month pecan nut casebearers hit the crop, leaving only a very short window when control measures are effective."

The pecan nut casebearer is one of the worst scourges about 1/3 inch long, flies at night and hides by day. They lay up to 150 eggs on the tips of developing nutlets. The eggs hatch and the larvae tunnel into the nutlets shortly after pollination, often the nut-load to preserve the destroying all the nuts in the cluster.

Sansone said the best control method is a springtime are two insecticides commerinsecticide application, but cial producers can use, the timing is all important.

"Fortunately, AgriLife Research and Extension entomologists have developed two helpful tools to assist producers and homeowners with the decision," he said. Two web sites, http://pecankernel.tamu.edu and http://PNCforecast.tamu.edu,

can help them determine the best time for insecticide applications.

"May 17 is the decision window set for Tom Green County. But understand, May 17 is not the actual date to spray, unless eggs are present and some hatching has occurred. The date is the prenificant egg lay in the county. Consider spraying when two or more eggs are found while inspecting 10 nut clusters per tree or 310 total clusters if it's a sizeable orchard. The eggs are barely visible to the naked eye and are greenish-white when first laid. Ideally, one should spray when the hatch has started and is increasing."

Temperature fluctuations have a strong bearing on the moths' activity, according to Sansone. He recommends the trees be scouted for eggs and affecting pecans, Sansone the decision to spray not be said. The adult stage, a moth made solely on the prediction models.

> Sansone said some producers anticipating a "branchbreaking" crop may opt not to spray at all, but instead will let the casebearers thin health of the tree and the quality of the remaining nuts.

> Confirm<sup>®</sup> and Intrepid<sup>®</sup> Sansone said. Homeowners are limited to products containing spinosad, Bacillus thuringiensis (commonly called Bt), carbaryl or malathion.

> Sansone warned users to read and follow label directions and make sure the products are specifically labeled for use on pecans.
