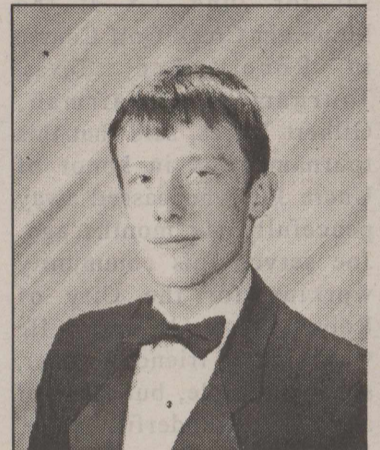
Thirty-two BJH graduates honored

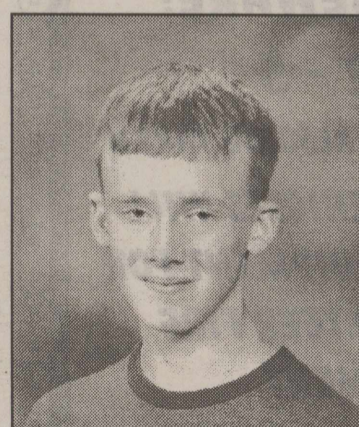
The Council will now pursue the removal of disabled/dismantled and inoperable vehicles from the City limits.

Owners of these vehicles will be offered an opportunity to have their vehicles removed from their properties.

A "car crusher" will be in Bronte the 1st week in June. If you have vehicles to be removed that week, contact the City Hall at 473-3501 to make arrangements.

The City has set a deadline of July 1, 2008, for the removal of these problem vehicles. Action will be taken if owners do not have their vehicles removed by the deadline.

The City Council hopes that everyone will take advantage of this program to improve the appearance of the City and raise funds to benefit the Fire Department.

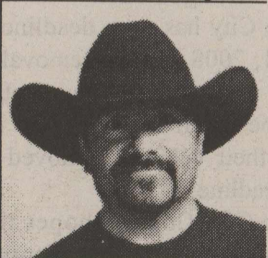
All proceeds will benefit Garrett and Jayton Torres so they may have a chance at a brighter Education and future.

Everyone will want to come out and join their neighbors in this fun-filled evening to help raise money to fight back against cancer.

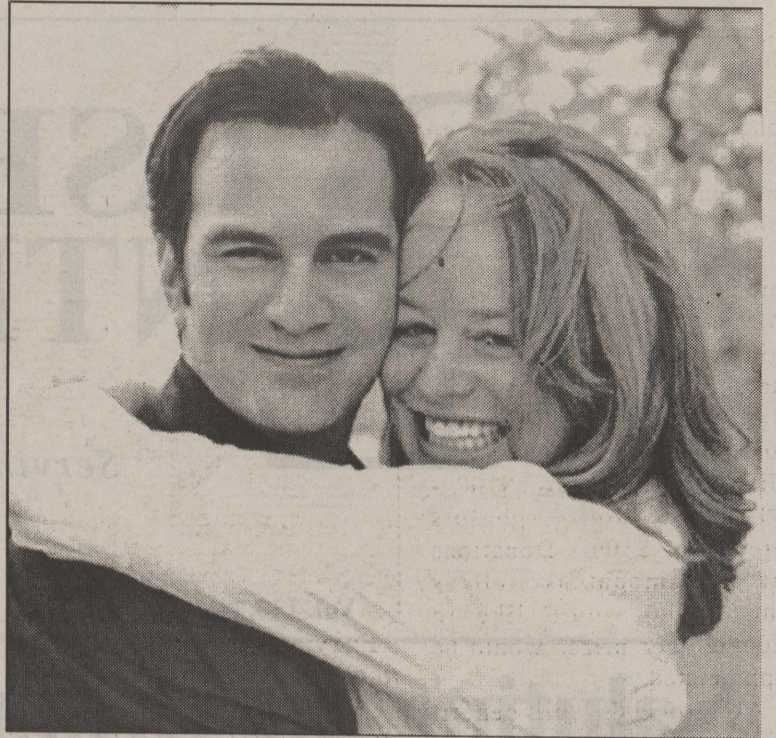

singing program and Kindergarten will also have their graduation at that time. Everyone is invited to attend.

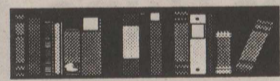
Stephens named Assistant Principal of the Year

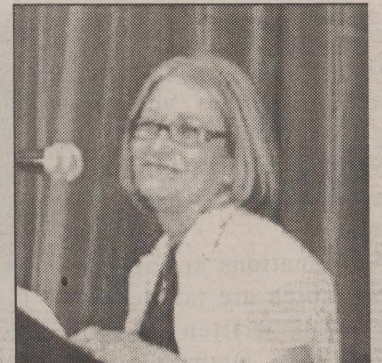
Annic Walker was welcomed as a new member.

Survey shows many still not wearing safety belts

Young adults, teens, pickup truck occupants and nighttime motorists are less likely to wear safety belts than most drivers and passengers, according to the latest survey from the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration. And those who don't wear safety belts are more likely to die in a crash.

Though safety belts have been proven effective in preventing deaths, more than half of the motor vehicle crash fatalities in these groups were unrestrained, according to the traffic safety administration.

Occupants who are ejected

from a vehicle are four times more likely to be killed. Most ejections are due to failure to wear a safety belt.

That's the reason behind the national Click It or Ticket campaign May 19 - June 1. Law enforcement officers will be especially vigilant about ticketing unbuckled people in vehicles during that period.

The message is simple - buckling up will keep you from receiving a ticket. Better yet, it may very well save your life.

Jan Yanez, FCS - AgriLife Extension Agent is helping to get the word out about the upcoming Memorial Day Click It or Ticket mobilization in hopes of reaching the groups that are still not convinced of the importance of wearing their safety belts.

On the importance of buckling seat belts, the traffic safety administration shared these facts:

*Sixty-seven percent of male drivers and 73% of male passengers between the ages of 18 and

34 who were killed in crashes in 2006 did not wear seat belts.

*Drivers and passengers between 16 and 24 have the lowest usage rate among all age groups. Data from 2006 shows that among those killed in crashes, 64 % of teenagers were not buckled up at the time.

*Drivers and passengers in pickups, especially young males, consistently have the lowest safety belt usage rates of all motorists. Half of fatalities in pickup trucks are due to rollover crashes. In a pickup rollover crash, safety belts can reduce the risk of dying by up to 80%.

*Nighttime hours between 6 pm and 6 am bring out more unbuckled drivers and passengers. Crash records show nearly two-thirds of those killed during nighttime hours were not wearing seat belts.

In 2006, 75% of ejected passenger vehicle occupants were killed, but among motorists who were buckled up in serious crashes, 77% survived.

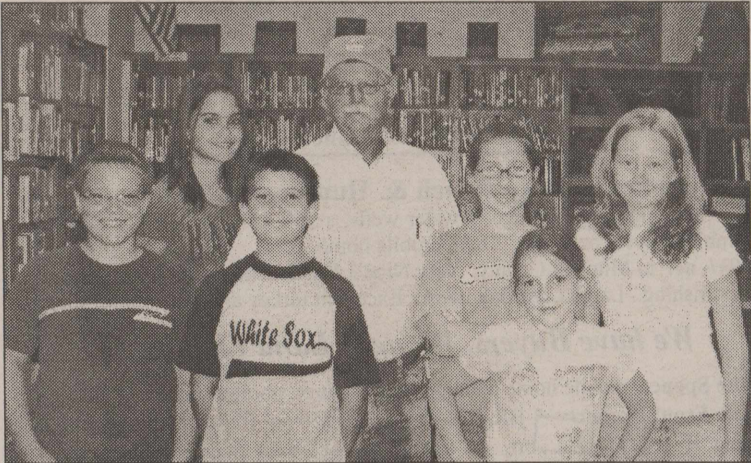

Managing money as a couple doesn't have to be hard

It's at the top of the list of things about which couples fight.

This option can make life easier for some couples by centralizing the household finances. However, it requires that both partners diligently share when they use funds out of the account.

Separate Accounts -- Some couples prefer the autonomy of separate accounts. With this financial system each person is responsible for maintaining their own account, which may include

paying some of the bills. Individuals may need to work harder to be equally involved in the financial relationship. Couples should meet on a regular basis to discuss how they are managing money to achieve a common goal.

A Combination of Accounts -- A combination of joint and separate accounts is another alternative for managing money. This financial system allows both partners to contribute

while maintaining their autonomy. Individual accounts can be used for personal purchases. The joint account can contain funds for bills and joint purchases. With a clear definition of who's paying which bills, couples can work together to bring financial

balance and emotional harmony to the relationship.

"Regardless of the financial style a couple chooses, communicating about finances is key," said Goller. "The more you discuss how and why you each spend money, the deeper and stronger your relationship will grow."

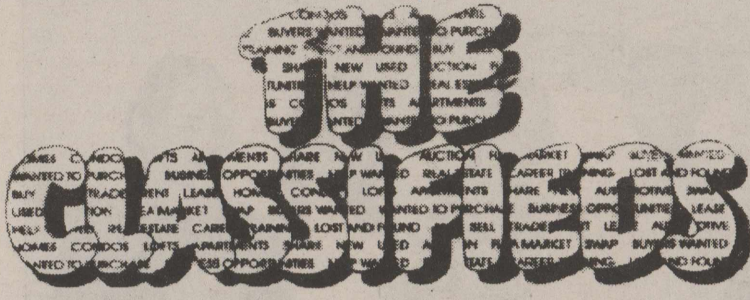

ORDINANCE #1178

An ordinance of the City of Robert Lee adopting the 2003 edition of the International Property Maintenance Code, regulating and governing the conditions and maintenance of all property, buildings and structures; by providing the standards for supplied utilities and facilities and other physical things and conditions essential to ensure that structures are

safe, sanitary and fit for occupation and use; and the condemnation of buildings and structures unfit for human occupancy and use, and the demolition of such existing structures in the City of Robert Lee; providing for the issuance of permits and collection of fees therefore; repealing Ordinance No.1005, and all amendments, of the City of Robert Lee and all other ordinances and parts of the ordinance in conflict therewith.

WHEREAS, The City Council of the City of Robert Lee, Texas does ordain as follows:

Section 1. That a certain document, three (3) copies of which are on file in the office of the City Secretary of the City of Robert Lee, being marked and designated as the International Property Maintenance Code, 2003 edition, as published by

the International Code Council, be and hereby adopted as the Property Maintenance Code of the City of Robert Lee, in the State of Texas, for regulating and governing the conditions and maintenance of all property, buildings, and structures; by providing the standards for supplied utilities and facilities and other physical things and conditions essential to ensure that structures are safe, sanitary and fit for occupation and use; and the condemnation of buildings and structures unfit for human occupancy and use, and the demolition of such existing structures as herein provided; providing for the issuance of permits and collection of fees therefore; and each and all of the regulations, provisions, penalties, conditions and terms of said Property Maintenance Code on file in the office of the City of Robert Lee are

hereby referred to, adopted, and made a part hereof, as if fully set out in this ordinance, with the additions, insertions, deletions and changes, if any, prescribed in Section 2 of this ordinance.

Section 2: The following section is hereby revised: Section 103.5 - Inspection fee - \$35.00

Section 7. That this ordinance and the rules, regulations, provisions, requirements, orders and matters established and adopted hereby shall take effect and be in full force on June 1, 2008, from and after this date of its final passage and adoption.
