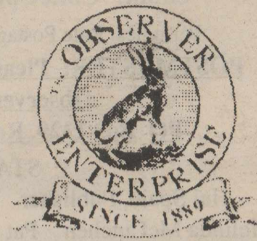

2009 Coke County Relay For Life

This year's Coke County Relay For Life will start at 7 pm on Friday, April 3 and end at 7 am on Saturday, April 4 at the Robert Lee High School football field and track.

Relay For Life is the American Cancer Society's nationwide signature event. It was started in 1985 with just one man in Tacoma, Washington. This year's theme is "Celebrating 25 years of HOPE".

A goal of 20 teams has been set for this year and so far there are 11. The annual event lasts 12 hours and involves teams consisting of 8-15 people who can be co-workers, family, friends, churches, schools, clubs or other organizations who raise money in advance, individually or as a team, through donations and fundraising to support cancer research, educational programs, patient services and advocacy. At the event, teams will camp out and take turns walking around the track for the entire 12 hours! It goes through the night because like cancer, Relay doesn't sleep. Inspirational moments

include the Opening Survivors Lap and the beautiful Luminaria Ceremony discussed below. There is a \$10 per person registration fee. All registered team members need to have their t-shirt sizes turned in by February 14, 2009, to be guaranteed a Relay For Life t-shirt.

A celebration of the lives of those who have battled cancer opens the Relay as Cancer Survivors walk the first lap around the track. The strength of these survivors inspires others to continue to fight. There is a goal of 90 survivors for this year's Relay. Loved ones lost to cancer as well as cancer survivors will be remembered during the luminaria ceremony. This year the luminaria ceremony will be a little different. Instead of using sand and tealight candles in the bags, canned goods and battery-operated tealights will be used and then the canned goods will be donated to the Coke County Food Pantry.

Because of this, help is needed to collect canned goods in advance, so by Relay time there will be enough cans to put in all of the Luminaria bags. Approximately 400 bags are estimated. Collection boxes are located at Hall's Super Save and Town and Country in Bronte; Cindy's, Mt. USDA Lamb Referendum

The U.S. Department of Agriculture announces that it will offer lamb producers, feeders, and first handlers the opportunity to vote in a nationwide referendum on whether to continue or terminate the Lamb Promotion, Research, and Information Order, authorized under the Commodity Promotion, Research, and Information Act of 1996. The referendum will be held February 2-27.

The referendum will be conducted at USDA's Farm Service Agency (FSA) county offices. To be eligible to vote, persons must certify and provide documentation, such as a sales receipt or remittance form, which shows they have been engaged in the production, feeding, or slaughtering of lambs during the period, Jan. 1, 2008, through Dec. 31, 2008.

Beginning February 2, and continuing through February 27, persons eligible to vote should obtain form LS-86 from a county FSA office either in person, by mail, fax,

or via the Internet at: <http://www.ams.usda.gov/lsmarketingprograms>. Persons must vote in the referendum at the County FSA office where their administrative farm records are maintained. For those persons not participating in FSA programs, the opportunity to vote will be provided at the County FSA office where the person owns or rents land.

Form LS-86 and supporting documentation must be returned in person, by mail, or by fax to the appropriate county FSA office. The form and documentation returned in person or by fax must be received in the appropriate county office prior to the close of business on Feb. 27, 2009. The form and documentation returned by mail must be postmarked no later than midnight on February 27, and received in the county FSA office by March 6.

USDA monitors activities of the American Lamb Board. The mandatory program is financed by producers, seed-stock producers (breeders), feeders, and exporters who are assessed one-half cent (\$.005) per pound when live ovine animals are sold. The first handler, primarily packers, pays an additional 30 cents per head on ovine animals purchased for slaughter.

Notice of the referendum will be published in the Dec. 16, 2008, Federal Register. 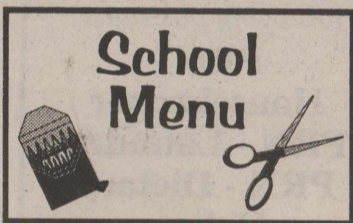

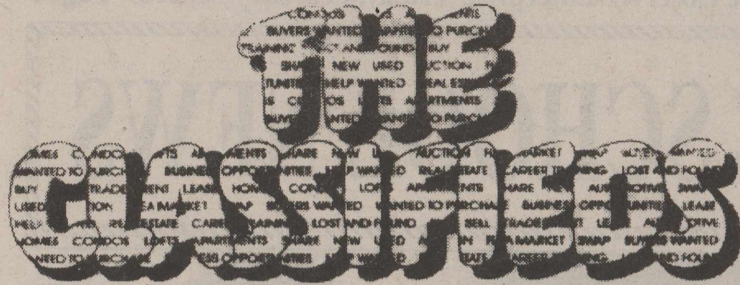

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF BRONTE, TEXAS REGULATING THE INSTALLATION OF HUD-CODE MANUFACTURED HOMES WITHIN THE CITY; REQUIRING A PERMIT FOR HUD-CODE MANUFACTURED HOMES; PRESCRIBING OTHER PREREQUISITES TO THE ISSUANCE OF A PERMIT; PROVIDING DEFINITIONS; PROVIDING FOR THE INSPECTIONS OF HUD-CODE MANUFACTURED HOMES; PROHIBITING MOBILE HOMES WITHIN THE CITY OF BRONTE; PROVIDING FEES; CONTAINING PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION OF THIS ORDINANCE; CONTAINING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; AND PROVIDING A REPEALER CLAUSE.

WHEREAS: it is deemed in the best interest of the City of Bronte for the health, safety and welfare of its citizens that an ordinance be established to regulate manufactured homes within the City of Bronte, Texas, and that mobile homes be prohibited; and

SECTION 11 - EXCEPTIONS

This Ordinance is prospective and does not apply to HUD-Code Manufactured Homes and Mobile Homes currently used and occupied as residential dwellings in the City on the Effective Date of this ordinance. HUD-Code Manufactured Homes and Mobile Homes currently used and occupied as residential dwellings are exempted as long as the current mobile home or HUD-Code Manufactured Home exists on that particular lot. If a Mobile Home (non HUD-Code Manufactured) is removed, destroyed, damaged beyond repair, or demolished, another Mobile Home (non HUD-Code Manufactured) cannot be put in its place. Otherwise, no exception to this Ordinance shall be made for any condition which existed at the time of its passage.

SECTION 12 - PENALTY FOR NON - COMPLIANCE

Any person, firm, or corporation violating this Ordinance or any part of this Ordinance or providing false information to a City official concerning licensing or permitting under this Ordinance and found guilty by the Judge of the Municipal Court, will be guilty of a Class "C" Misdemeanor, and be fined not more than \$500.00 (Five Hundred Dollars) except for health violations which may be fined not more than \$2000.00 (Two Thousand

Dollars). Each day such violation continues, or be permitted to continue, shall be a separate offense.

SECTION 15 - EFFECTIVE DATE

This ordinance shall become effective February 21, 2009. PASSED, APPROVED AND ADOPTED this 12th day of February, 2009.

The "Jarm" Team with Austin Mertz, Jaylon Seales, John Deller, and Katie Austin placed sixth.

The "Pozerz" Team with Bill Miller, and Rob Rosson placed seventh.

The "Big" Team with Kimber Lee, Kaleb Parks, Jill Scott, and Harley Wallace placed eleventh.

One Division II Robotics Team from Bronte competed in the Area contest with 32 Teams entered. The "Metalloids" Team with Kyle Kelton, Mason Hoyt, Newt McGinnis, and Ethan Sedden placed 14th.

Students in the seventh, eighth, ninth, and tenth grades have participated in the Robotics program this year. Those students with robots that could carry out the task presented by the TCEA (Texas Computer Education Association) competed at the Region 15 Contest on January 26 and then the students scoring in the top ten from Bronte were entered in the Area 15 Contest on February 16.

Students have worked diligently with their robots. Teachers and Parents are not allowed to do the work or programming for them. They must do this within their teams of two to four team members working together. They use the training missions that come with the robot kits to learn the process. Problem-solving is the key ingredient for success in this activity.

During this period of time they have learned to use programming software, build (engineer) a product that will accomplish a task in two minutes and do it consistently every time. They have been studying physics dynamics, such as speed, acceleration, kinetic energy, potential energy, net forces, Newton's three Laws of Motion, different kinds of friction, simple machines, complex machines and mechanical advantage of a machine, and more. The students formulate a plan, test it and revise it over and over to find the best and most accurate design for their robot using the scientific research method.

Mathematics is used to find a minimum 3.5 GPR with no rotation of wheels, degree of rotation, seconds of rotation, measurements of the arena board, placement of the balls, limited size of the robot, etc. Application of basic knowledge and skills during this hands-on laboratory oriented activity is very valuable for our student success in the real world.
