

Frank Tubb family enjoys visit from fellow comrade

After 64 years, Quentin Stambaugh retired as district judge from Spring Grove, Pennsylvania, and then drove a combined total of 3700 miles to Robert Lee, Texas. Quentin came to Robert Lee to visit family members of Frank Tubb (deceased). Quentin and Frank were both radio operators and tail gunners on B-25's. They met while in gunnery training. The men were in the Air Apaches 345th Bombardment Group. Frank was in the 500th Squadron, while Quentin served in the 498th Squadron.

Quentin and Frank were both stationed in the Philippines while making missions needed to defeat the enemy.

Frank Tubb was killed March 15, 1945, on Bold Venture B-25 while bombing a Japanese freighter. The impact from the bomb knocked all the controls out. Their plane crashed 16 miles from Hong Kong, killing all the crew on board. After Frank was killed, Quentin wrote a letter to Frank's mother, Mary Tubb, hoping to console her. He exchanged several letters with Mary Tubb. He told her he hoped to be able to come by and visit Frank's family. Frank told him he wanted him to come by after the war to get some fresh apricots from the Tubb orchard.

After Frank was killed, Quentin went on to finish 39 combat missions. After one mission, Quentin was radio operator with other Falcon crew members. They were bombing off the coast of Japan. The pilot told them to look out the windows and they witnessed in the distance the first atomic bomb being dropped on Japan in August of 1945.

The following is an account by Quentin of his experience on his last mission. It is an excerpt from a letter written by Quentin Stambaugh.







The swimming pool Next action for the golf replacements and repairs are costly. The total amount is expected to reach \$300,000. In an effort to ensure a summer opening, the Economic Development Sales Tax board has agreed to release up to \$100,000 that have accumulated in the fund's account. The EDC4A funds have accumulated due to the restrictions placed upon expenditures of the funds by the state legislature. The funds in 4A can be spent only to create jobs unless other expenditures are approved by a vote of the citizens. The funds have accumulated in hopes that a manufacturer chooses to locate in this area. As this has not been the case, nor is it likely with the economy the way it is, the board determined to allow this money to be applied to the repair of the swimming pool. The thinking was that the money would be well spent to provide a safe place for summer activities. Another asset of a pool is that the water can be used to fight fires if needed.

Because of the rulings of the state, this proposal must appear on a ballot for approval by the citizens of Robert Lee. It is hoped that a "yes" vote will result in support for releasing the money to repair the swimming pool. Our neighbor, Bronte, faced a similar situation last year. * Words + Words = More Words! As your baby begins to speak, encourage him by adding extra words. For example, if your child points to his toy and says, "Truck," add some words. "Yes, that's

* Rhyme Time. Read rhyming stories with pre-schoolers and recite nursery rhymes. Pause at the end of lines and let your child fill in the rhyming word. This encourages children to listen carefully to the different sounds.

* My Name Is Special! Sharon Darling, president Children are fascinated by the letters in their names. Playing word games with these letters can get them learning about language. Write the letters on paper, cut them apart and put them in an envelope. Let your child pull out the letters and put them in order. Look for things in your home that start with that letter or the first letter of her name.

* My ABCs. Look for ABC books that match your child's The experts at the NCFL interests -- animals, foods, children's names, machines. You can also help your child make her own alphabet book. You could start by looking for one picture for each letter in her name.

> * Book Time. Point out the title and the illustration on the cover. Read the title and author's name out loud. Let your child turn the pages. Follow along with the text, running your finger under words. Learning how books work are important steps toward learning to read.



Use your tax refund wisely


By Jason Alderman More and more Americans are filing, and paying, their taxes electronically. The IRS projects the number of individual tax returns filed electronically in 2009 to exceed last year's record of nearly 90 million taxpayers.

On the flip side, they'll also receive any tax refunds electronically as well, which dramatically speeds up the process. But before you rush out and spend your refund on the latest gadget, check out these recession-smart ways to invest it:

Pay down debt. This strategy will have the most pronounced impact on your financial well-being because the interest you carry forward month after month can significantly magnify the cost of the money borrowed.

For example, suppose you carry a \$1,000 balance on a credit card with 18 percent interest and you're only making the minimum monthly payment (\$40, assuming a 4 percent minimum payment). Even with no additional purchases made, it will take more than seven years to pay off the balance and cost an extra \$516 in interest. Simply doubling your monthly payment to \$80 could cut the payoff time in half and lower the interest paid to \$216.

Save for emergencies. Even in the best of times, financial planners recommend socking away at least three to six months of living expenses in easily accessible savings in case of job loss or other unexpected emergency. If you don't already have a savings account, use part of your refund to open one and have money automatically deposited from each paycheck.

Because regular savings accounts currently offer very low interest rates, you may want to shop for a higheryield money market savings account or short-term CD at a site like www.bankrate.com.

Save for the future. With so many pressing needs today, it's easy to overlook the importance of saving for tomorrow. If your debt and emergency savings are under control, consider stashing at least part of your refund in an IRA or 401(k) plan, particularly if your employer matches employee 401(k) contributions, since that's like getting free money.

Practical Money Skills for Life, Visa Inc.'s free personal financial management site, contains detailed retirement financial planning information such as how 401(k) plans work, tax ramifications and interactive retirement savings calculators (www.practicalmoneyskills.c

om/401k).

Invest in yourself. We've all seen how quickly jobs .and whole companies - can become obsolete and disappear. Make sure you have additional skills to fall back on and boost your earnings potential by enrolling in college courses or vocational training. See if your employer will help pay for job-related education.

Invest in your family's future. Another good use for your refund is to set up a 529 Qualified State Tuition Plan or a Coverdell Education Savings Account to fund your children's or grandchildren's education - all while lowering your tax bill. Visit the websites of the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission (www.sec.gov/investor/pubs/intr o529.htm) and the IRS (www.irs.gov/taxtopics/tc310.ht ml) for information.

too much tax withheld, you're just giving the government an interest-free loan - money you could use to pay down your own interest owed throughout the year. Ask for a new W-4 form at work and recalculate how much is being deducted each pay period. Your goal should be to receive little or no refund.

One last suggestion: Spend part of your refund on a session with a financial planner who can help you map out a long-term financial strategy. If you don't know one, www.plannersearch.org is a good place to start your search.
