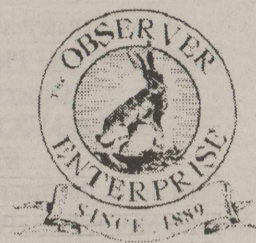

Groundbreaking held for new Robert Lee school facility

Construction has begun on the new Robert Lee ISD school facilities. Groundbreaking ceremonies were held on Tuesday, May 26, 2009, at 2:30 pm with a large crowd attending.

Superintendent Aaron Hood introduced each speaker for the groundbreaking ceremony, which began with a blessing by the Rev. Ray Aldridge. Garrett Blair, as student body president, addressed those present. School Board President Kevin Roe also took a turn at the microphone.

Short presentations were made by Cadco Engineers representatives Richard Rogers and Steve Ellinger, as the lead architects for the project.

Representing the construction firm of W. B. Kibler Construction was Dale Parker, with a short presentation to those present.

The new facilities will consist of a K-12 building, which will be approximately 75,000 square feet. Scheduled completion date on the new K-12 building is August of 2010. The new gymnasium and lobby will encompass approximately 30,000 square feet, with a scheduled completion date of July 2011. Total cost of the new facilities is \$13.5 million.

To conclude the groundbreaking ceremonies, Superintendent Hood quoted from a 1955 article of the Robert Lee Observer. At that time, the school at Robert Lee had just begun to build a new school facility. The article quoted by Hood read, "We are going to give a building to our young people which is second to none." To which the superintendent added in his own words, "and a faculty that is second to none."

RL City Council to hold open forum

The Robert Lee City Council met on Monday, May 11, to discuss the best plan to fund the necessary repair and renovation of the Robert Lee water tower. The tower was built in 1992. While the water tower has had several overhauls, it is now showing its age with a lead overage and interior and exterior corrosion.

The total cost of renovating and repairing the tower will amount to \$229,088 with a three-year payout. A line item review of the City budget indicates that the City can pay the first year at \$57,272. For the remaining payout period, a customer share of the cost will be implemented.

By spreading the cost among 588 City meters, 221 rural water meters, 7 Snead Corbin line meters, and 42 housing units at the Housing Authority, a cost share charge will amount to \$5.56 per meter and will go into effect with the July billing.

By spreading the cost of the renovation among 588 meters, the Robert Lee water tower can be made safe and stable. The cost of the renovation includes a regular maintenance schedule for the life of the water tower. This type of maintenance agree-

ment should prevent further large payouts to keep the water tower properly functioning.

The public is invited to attend the Open Forum to learn details of the cost of the renovation at the next Robert Lee City Council meeting, which will be held at 7 pm on Monday, June 8.

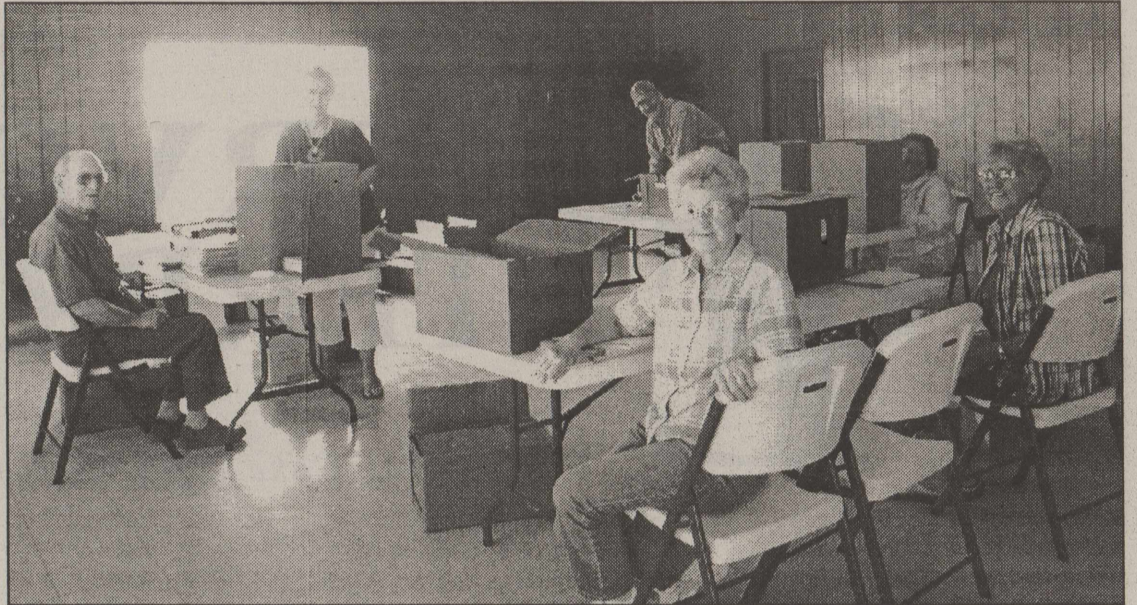

Bronte Recycling Center Update

For the month of May, 12 bags of plastic and 4 bags of aluminum were collected for recycling. Please remember to separate your plastics and aluminum. What kind of aluminum can be recycled? Aluminum beverage cans only. These cans should be rinsed out. What kind of plastic can be recycled? #1 PETE - Plastic soda bottles: clear and green. Other juice, liquor or water bottles made of #1 PETE are OK. The lids should be thrown out and the bottles should be rinsed out. #2 HDPE - Plastic milk, water, juice, detergent and bleach containers. The lids

should be thrown out and the bottles should be rinsed out. The revenue made from the sell of aluminum will be used for scholarships for a graduating senior.

On April 19, at a ceremony held in Austin, Texas, Aaron P. McConnell was commissioned as a Second Lieutenant (2LT) in the U.S. Army.

McConnell graduated from the eight week Accelerated Officer Candidate School (OCS) held at Fort McClellan, Alabama, in late March.

During (OCS), McConnell and fellow officer candidates studied and learned troop leadership procedures, day and night land navigation tactics, and operations procedures. The candidates successfully met all physical, academic, leadership and tactical requirements for the 2nd OCS Battalion Officer Candidate Class 53A. This academy provides training and professional development for National Guardsmen from across the nation. McConnell was 1 out of 13 candidates from Texas and 1 out of 185 nationally to complete the training.

At the commissioning ceremony held in Austin on April 19, McConnell was sworn in by his father, Col. Richard McConnell (Ret.) and his rank was pinned by his wife, Cyndi, and his mother, Janet

McConnell. McConnell's commissioning was witnessed by a number of family and friends.

County receives rainfall in varying amounts

Beginning Memorial Day weekend, Coke County has been the recipient of some scattered showers and some good rains which have continued for a period of about ten days. Most locations in the county have received from one to two inches at least from these showers, and some have received three to four inches as a result.

The good news is that most parts of the county have received some really good showers. The bad news is that it has been almost impossible to keep up with the totals. The area from Humble Crossing to Silver started out the Memorial weekend with up to 3 inches in that area, with Robert Lee reporting from one inch to 1.8 inches. If memory serves me correctly, somebody stated that Bobby Roberts recorded up to 1.8 inches in the Valley View area that weekend.

Our area at Lake Spence got shorted at .3 inch both Friday and Saturday nights of Memorial weekend. We did get a wild thunder boomer on Tuesday, May 26, which dumped .8 inch in about fif-

teen or twenty minutes.

Bronte recorded about .5 inch on that Friday and another .6 inch on Saturday of Memorial weekend.

Other storms and showers were recorded during this ten day period, but rainfall was spotty and didn't cover a wide area.

The storms returned on Sunday night and Monday morning, May 31 and June 1, with Robert Lee receiving over an inch and up to 1.7 in some places, and Bronte getting another .5 or .6 inch, depending upon your location.

Our area around Lake Spence received .6 inch from this storm, and Sterling City was the big winner with 2.5 inches that same night.

The good news is that everything is pretty and green as a result. The bad news is that we are not getting any running water from these storms at all.

We can all take some solace in the fact that if it can come a good rain in traditionally dry Sterling City, and particularly in our Valley View area, which seems to be one of our dryer areas of the county, then maybe there is some hope for the rest of us.

News Flash! I knew I wasn't quite through writing this story. Tuesday evening, June 2 (last night, as I write this), a fast moving cool front hammered Robert Lee with some small hail and about an inch of rain. We were kind'a in the edge of it out at Lake Spence, and we recorded .8 inch. Bronte recorded .2 to .3 inch. Hopefully we'll have more to report next week.

We have another small chance of rain today, and from then on we're supposed to be dry for the weekend. And the temperature on Saturday (June 6) is forecast to get to 100 degrees.

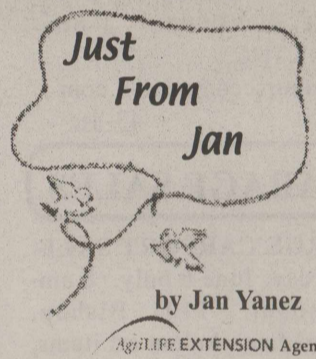

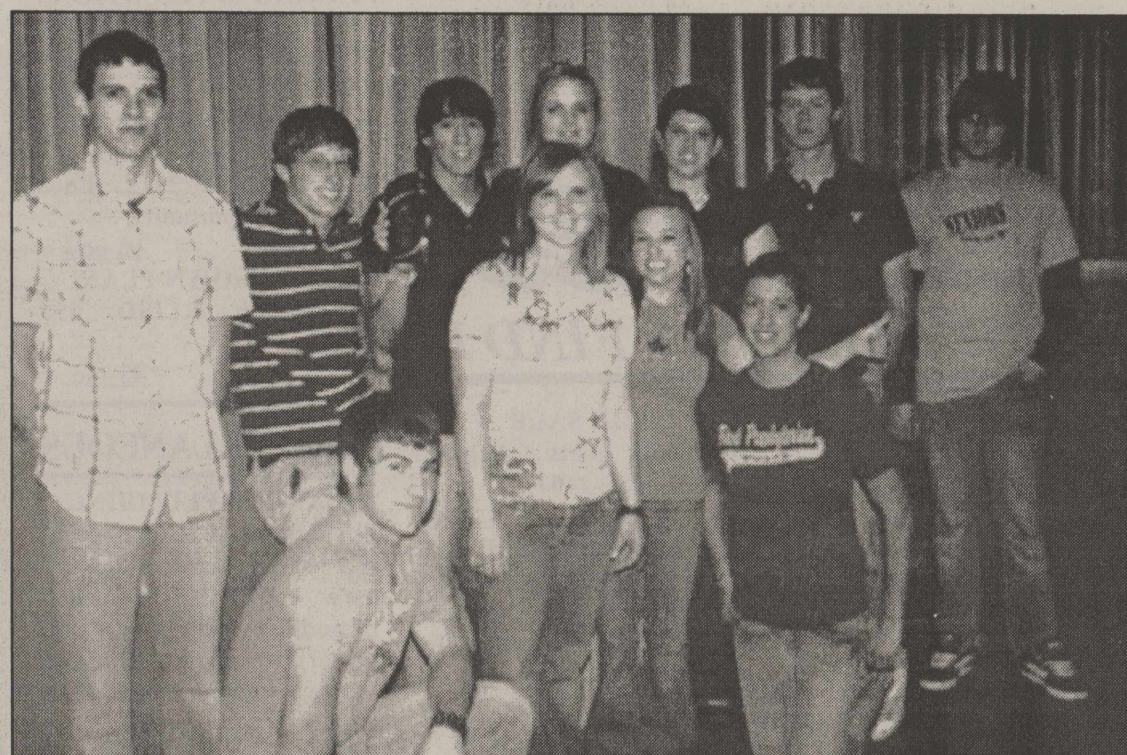

Did You Know?

- A child can drown in a pool in the time it takes to answer the phone.
- A young child can drown in just inches of water.
- More than 300 children under the age of 5 drown in residential swimming pools each year.
- Drowning is the leading cause of injury death for children 1 to 2 years of age.
- Drowning is second

leading cause of accidental death for Americans ages 5 to 44.

- Supervision combined with barriers and safety devices are the keys to pool safety.

How To Keep Children Safe Around Water

- Always supervise children in or near water - pool, stream, lake, tub, toilet, bucket of water - no matter how shallow the water. A child can drown in just inches of water. Even children who have taken swimming lessons must be supervised.
- Don't rely on flotation devices and inflatable toys to replace parental supervision. These devices can deflate or slip out from beneath a child, leaving that child in danger.
- Always have children use approved life vests.
- Stay within an arm's length of any infant or toddler who is in or around water.
- Keep a cell phone with you at the beach; keep a cordless phone or install a phone by the pool so you can call 9-1-1 in an emergency.
- Go over pool rules and general swimming instructions with children

before you leave for the pool or the beach. Once you arrive, children may be too excited to listen closely.

- Have children use the buddy system and explain how it works.
- Don't allow running or rough play around the water.
- Encourage children to "Stop, watch and walk into the water."
- Teach children to swim at an early age.
- Learn American Red Cross Infant/Child CPR and insist that babysitters, grandparents and others who care for your child know CPR.

Pool Supervision For Children

- Never leave a child unattended in or near the pool area for any reason, even for a moment. Don't run inside to answer a phone or the doorbell. If you must leave the pool area, take the child with you, and make sure the pool gate is securely latched.
- Always keep your eyes on children in and around water.
- Designate a child watcher when you attend a party or have friends or family over.
- Check the pool first if a child is missing. Go to the

edge of the pool and scan the entire pool, bottom and surface, as well as the surrounding pool area.

- Attend a Red Cross CPR class. Make sure anyone watching young children around a pool-babysitter, grandparents and you - learn CPR and are able to rescue a child if necessary.
 - Keep children away from pool filters. The suction force could injure them or prevent them from surfacing.
 - Post and enforce pool rules: "No running," "No roughhousing," "No dunking" and "Never swim alone."
 - Encourage neighbors to follow pool safety guidelines, including keeping their back gates and doors locked, and their pool gates securely closed and latched.
 - Never dive into an above-ground pool and check the water depth before plunging into an in-ground pool. Keep clear of the area near a diving board.
- Pool Barriers And Safety Devices**
- Childproof your pool. Install one fence around your backyard and another fence (at least 4-foot-tall) around the pool. Most young children who drown in pools wander out of the house and fall into the pool.

- Use gates that self-close and self-latch, with latches higher than your children's reach.
- Use a power safety cover that meets the standards of the American Society for Testing and Materials (ASTM). This should not be used in place of a fence between your house and pool.
- Lock any door leading to the pool area.
- Install alarms on access doors.
- Keep rescue equipment by the pool, including a shepherd's hook, rope and personal flotation devices (PFDs), and know how to use it.
- Keep a cell phone or cordless phone by the pool so you can call 911 in case of emergency.
- Never leave furniture near a fence that would enable a child to climb over the fence and into the pool area.
- Remove all toys from the pool after use so children aren't tempted to reach for

them.

- Keep CD players, radios and other electrical devices away from pools or nearby wet surfaces.

Working Smoke Alarm - It Could Mean Your Life

By Mark Sides, RLVFD Chief

An average of three children per day die in home fires and 80 percent of those occur in homes without working smoke detectors. Non working smoke alarms rob residents of the protective benefits home safety devices were designed to provide. The most commonly cited cause of non working smoke alarms is dead or missing batteries.

Changing smoke alarm batteries at least once each year is one of the simplest, most effective ways to reduce these tragic deaths and injuries. In fact, working smoke alarms nearly cut in half the risk of dying in a home fire.

Tragically, fire can kill selectively. Those at risk include:

Children - Approximately 1000 children under the age of 20 die each year in home fires. Fire is the third leading cause of accidental death among children under the age of five, placing them at twice the risk of dying in a home fire.

Seniors - Adults over the age of 75 are three times more likely to die in home fires than the rest of the population; those over 85 are 4.5 times more likely to die in a home fire. Many seniors are unable to escape quickly.

Low-Income Households - Many low-income families are unable to afford batteries

for their smoke alarms. These same households often rely on poorly installed, maintained, or misused portable area heating equipment - a main cause of fatal home fires.

Coming to your water bill soon; the question "Do you have a working smoke alarm?"

The Robert Lee Volunteer Fire Department is hoping to team up with the State Fire Marshal's Office to provide Robert Lee residents, especially elderly and low income residents, with working smoke alarms during Fire Prevention Week. We plan to install the alarms where needed and also take the opportunity to point out any potential fire hazards in your home.
