This free service is offered to the residents and business owners of the City and is an opportunity to get rid of clutter and unwanted items. Volunteers are needed.

There will be no curbside service. Roll-off dumpsters will be located at the County Precinct 3 Yard located on Coke Street between E. 6th and 7th Street. This location will be open on Friday, October 16, from 9 am until 3 pm, and on Saturday, October 17, from 8 am to 12 noon.

Items that will be accepted are appliances, household and yard items. Batteries will be accepted. Absolutely NO tires, household trash, wet paint or chemicals. Appliances must have refrigerant removed.

Brush, tree limbs, and wood material need to go to the landfill. Take advantage of the FREE disposal offered at the City Landfill during this clean-up event. The Landfill will be open, weather permitting, from 9 am until 12 noon on Saturday, October 17.

Farm Bureau to host open meeting

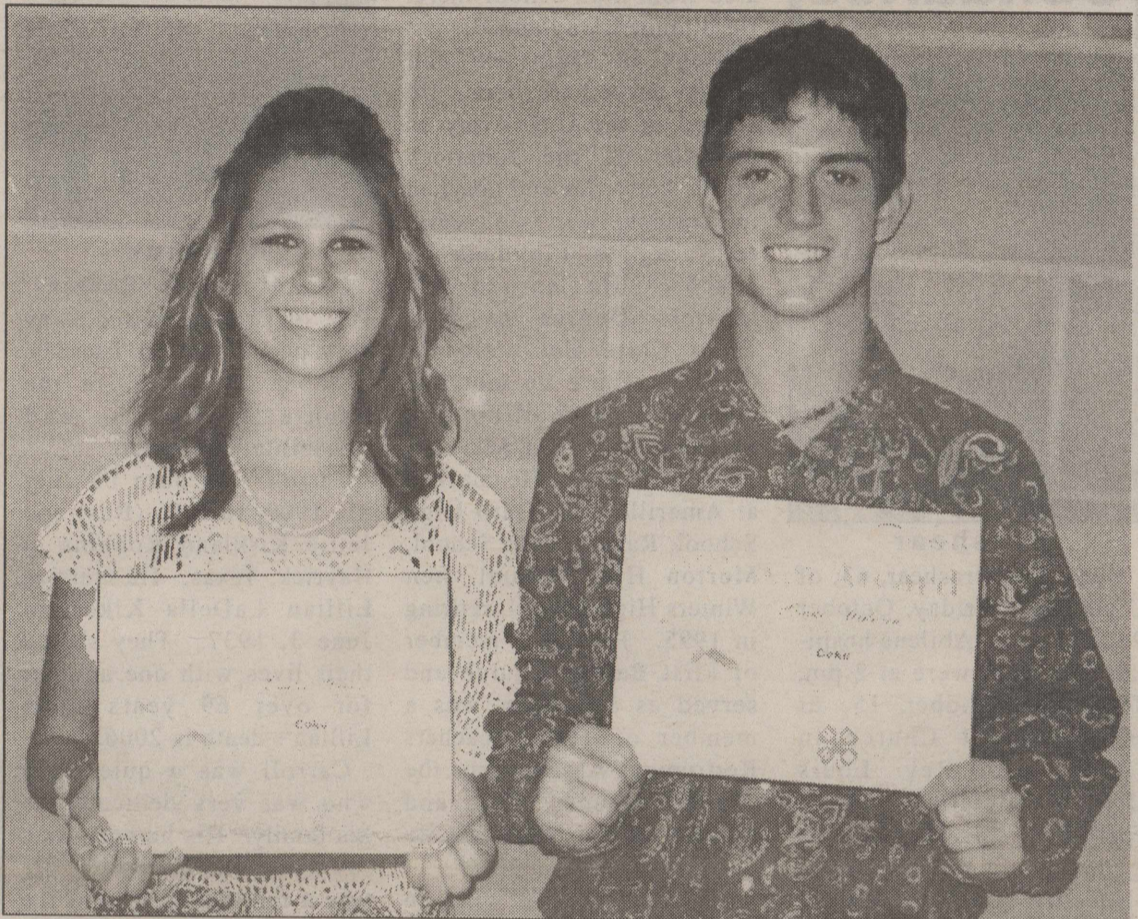

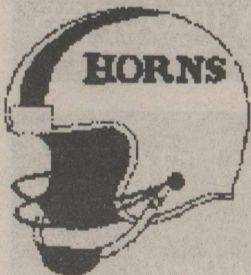

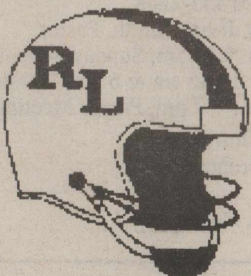

Bobby Jack "Bob" Shields, 74, of Winters, died Thursday, October 8, 2009, at his residence. He was born September 1, 1935, in

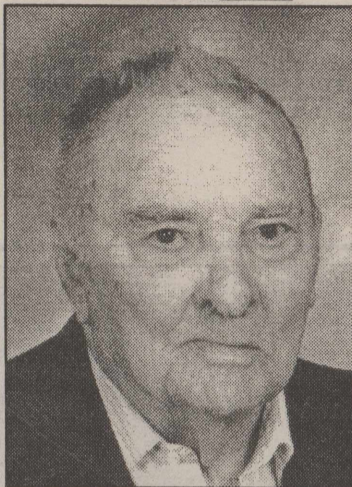

"We the People"

Over the years much of what the Congress has enacted as law has been con-

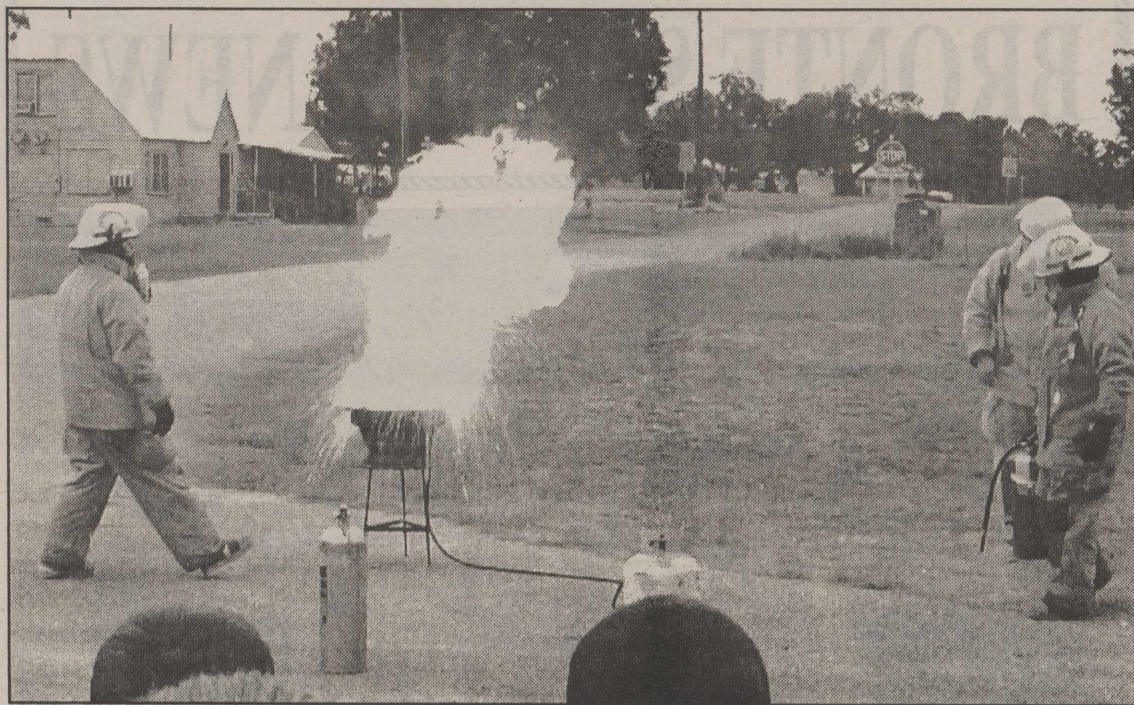
trary to specific Articles of the Constitution and additionally, contrary to the 10th Amendment.

If the House followed this rule, then the members would be intimately familiar with the Constitution and most laws would not even be written in the first place. Let's make them follow their own rules and more importantly the big rule, the Constitution. I have copies of the Constitution I will gladly give to anyone who asks. Please ask, read it, and then apply.

USDA set referendum for proposed amendments

The U.S. Department of Agriculture recently announced that a referendum will be conducted among U.S. Upland producers and importers. The referendum is scheduled for Oct. 13, 2009, through Nov. 10, 2009.

The Agricultural Marketing Service (AMS) is proposing to amend the Cotton Research and Promotion Order (Order) to implement section 14202 of the Food, Conservation, and Energy

Act of 2008 (2008 Farm Bill) that amended the Cotton Research and Promotion Act (ACT). The 2008 Farm Bill provided that the states of Kansas, Virginia and Florida be separate states in the definition of "cotton-producing state."

According to the Act, a referendum among cotton producers and importers is required to implement, amend, continue, or when appropriate, to suspend, or to terminate the Order or any of its provisions. According to the Act, the AMS will

provide an opportunity for all eligible persons to vote on the amendments to the Order.

Producers will have an opportunity to vote by mail or through their respective Farm

Service Agency County office and by mail for importers. All known cotton importers will be mailed a ballot and referendum instructions. Ballots will also be available on the Internet at <http://www.ams.usda.gov/cotton>.
