RL Landfill Winter Schedule

As of November 1, the Robert Lee Landfill will be open on the first and third Saturday of the month from 9 am - 12 noon. An evaluation of customer usage of the landfill during the winter months shows zero to only a few customers on Saturday. Due to low activity and budget constraints, the new schedule will remain in effect until March 1, 2010.

FSA accepting applications

The Farm Service Agancy (FSA) is now accepting applications for Emergency Farm Loans resulting from damages and losses caused by drought, above normal temperatures and associated wildfires on January 1, 2009, and continuing.

Coke and Sterling Counties have been named contiguous disaster counties where eligible farmers may qualify for FSA EM loan assistance. Farm Loan Manager, Justin B. Holland, asks farmers who want to apply for emergency loans to submit their applications as soon as possible. The deadling for applications is July 2, 2010, but if farmers wait too long, a backlog will develop and cause delays.

Generally, farmers who have lost 30 percent of their production due to designated disasters are eligible for emergency loans. The FSA office is located at 103 W. Florida Avenue in Sweetwater or contact your local office

BISD Board holds special meeting

On October 27, 2009, the Bronte ISD Board of Trustees held a Special Called Board meeting at 7:52

Doug Tounget opened the meeting with a prayer.

Call Roll Establishment of Quorum -At 7 pm, the Board commenced its regular meeting. Those present were David McWright - President; Ericka Knight; Doug Tounget; Shane Kelton; Wayne Coalson; Quinda Feil-Duncan and Paul Williams. Also present were Alan Richey - Superintendant; Donna Poehls - Principal; Gerald Sandusky- Mayor of Bronte; Tammy Royall -BISD Nurse; Tammy Thorn -City of Bronte; Misti McGlothlin (Methodist Nurse); Lisa Miller - BISD Teacher and PA.

Telemedicine Program for the Bronte ISD - Primarily led by Misti McGlothlin, a group of citizens representing Bronte and health care explained to the Board about Telemedicine program sponsored by Texas Tech University and how it would impact the BISD. Funded by a grant program for two years, the Telemedicine program would provide doctor services to the juveniles of Bronte via a two-way computer connection. The equipment involved will allow the nurse to examine a patient with the doctor watching in real time, and transmit vital signs. For the first two years, the grant would fund most if not all of the cost associated with the program. The patient would still be responsible for payment of services rendered by Texas Tech. The hope of this group is that the program could eventually stand on its own financially and become available to all the citizens of the surrounding area. Paul Williams made the motion to approve the Telemedicine Program for the BISD and David McWright seconded the motion. Seven voted for, 0 voted against.

After School Program - Mr. Richey explained to the Board that two ladies in the community had expressed interest in starting an afterschool (for profit) program utilizing the school facilities. No action was taken by the Board.

Bus Proposals - David McWright made the motion to purchase a 2004 VH 2045 bus from the ABC Company for an amount not to exceed \$260,000.00 with the stipulation that Alan Richey along with a third party mechanic test drive, inspect and approve of the bus. Countdown to the Thanksgiving Holiday

As Thanksgiving approaches, cooking the traditional turkey dinner gives rise to anxieties and questions. What kind of turkey should I buy? Should I buy a frozen turkey or a fresh one? How do I store my turkey?

A few simple steps will not only ease your holiday fears, but will ensure a delicious and a safe meal for you, your family, and your friends. The following information may help you prepare your special Thanksgiving meal and help you countdown to the holiday.

Plan Ahead

Plan your menu several weeks before the holiday. Shopping early will ease the countdown tension for your Thanksgiving meal. Ask these questions to help plan your meal. Do you want a fresh or frozen turkey? Do you have enough space to store a frozen bird if purchased in advance; if not, when should you purchase a turkey? What size bird do you need to buy?

Fresh or Frozen

If you choose to buy a frozen bird you may do so at any time, but make sure you have adequate storage space in your freezer. If you buy a fresh turkey, be sure you purchase it only 1-2 days before cooking. Do not buy a

prestuffed fresh turkey.

Use the following chart as a helpful guide:

Whole bird - 1 pound per

Boneless breast of turkey -1/2 pound per person;

Breast of turkey - 3/4 pound per person;

Prestuffed frozen turkey - 1 1/4 pounds per person – keep frozen until ready to cook. Thawing

In the refrigerator

Place frozen bird in original wrapper in the refrigerator (40 °F or below). hours per 4 to 5 pounds of 1-2 days.

Refrigerator

4 to 12 pounds of turkey - 1 immediately after thawing. to 3 days;

12 to 16 pounds - 3 to 4 days; 16 to 20 pounds - 4 to 5 days; 20 to 24 pounds - 5 to 6 days.

In cold water

If you forget to thaw the turkey or don't have room in the refrigerator for thawing, don't panic. You can

Allow approximately 24 submerge the turkey in cold water and change the water turkey. A thawed turkey can every 30 minutes. > Thawing Time in Cold Water 4 to 12 pounds of turkey - 2 to 6 hours;

12 to 16 pounds - 6 to 8 hours; 16 to 20 pounds - 8 to 10 hours;

20 to 24 pounds - 10 to 12 hours.

Microwave thawing is safe if the turkey is not too large. Check the manufacturer's instructions for the size turkey that will fit into your oven, the minutes per pound, and the power level to use for thawing. Cook immediately after thawing.

Preparation

The day before Thanksgiving

Make sure you have all the ingredients you need to prepare your holiday meal. Check to make sure you have all the equipment you will need, including a roasting pan large enough to hold your turkey and

a food thermometer. Wet and dry stuffing ingredients can be prepared ahead of time and refrigerated separately. This may also be done on Thanksgiving Day. Mix ingredients just before placing the stuffing inside the turkey cavity or into a casserole

Thanksgiving Day

If you choose to stuff your turkey, stuff loosely. The stuffing should be moist, not dry, since heat destroys bacteria more rapidly in a moist environment. Place stuffed turkey in oven immediately. You may also cook the stuffing outside the bird in a casserole. Judging cooking time for your turkey

will be easier if the following chart is used. The times listed are for a fresh or thaw.ed turkey in an oven at 325 °F. These times are approximate. Timetables for

Roasting (325 °F oven temperature)

Cooking Time — Unstuffed 8 to 12 pounds - 2 3/4 to 3

12 to 14 pounds - 3 to 3 3/4

14 to 18 pounds - 3 3/4 to 4 1/4 hours;

18 to 20 pounds - 4 1/4 to 4 1/2 hours;

20 to 24 pounds - 4 1/2 to 5

Cooking Time — Stuffed 8 to 12 pounds - 3 to 3 1/2
