Coke County Livestock Show slated for this weekend

This weekend will be the 70th edition of the Coke County Junior Livestock Show, held at the Sterling Lindsey Memorial Exhibition Building in Robert Lee. This year's show will feature animals in the Market Lamb, Market Goat, Market Swine and Market Steer shows, but more importantly, more than 50 youth exhibitors from around the county.

The county stock show offers the youth of Coke County an opportunity to exhibit their livestock projects, which they have worked with for more than 11 months, in many cases. Besides being a worthwhile educational activity for our youth in teaching them responsibility, working with others and numerous life skills, it is an important economic endeavor when you consider the animals purchased from county producers, feed purchased locally and the premium sale monies that come in from this county and other areas. The total amounts of monies generated by these exhibitors amounts to over \$150,000 per year that is circulated in the county.

The show will begin Friday, January 15, at 6:30 pm with the Market Lamb show, followed by the Market Goat show. These will be judged by Jessup Yeaman, Sheep and Goat Specialist Assistant with Texas Agrilife Extension from San Angelo, Texas. Saturday, January 16, the market swine show gets under way at 8:30 am, followed by the market steer show at 11 am, judged by Jason Byrd, Texas AgriLife Extension Agent from Lampasas, Texas. Showmanship judge is Cody Bundick, Texas Agrilife Extension Agent from Eldorado, Texas.

The Buyers Appreciation Barbecue will be served at 12 noon. Following the barbecue, the premium sale will be held at 2 pm to honor the prize-winning animals and exhibitors. Persons wishing to donate to the Coke County Livestock Show can contact either the

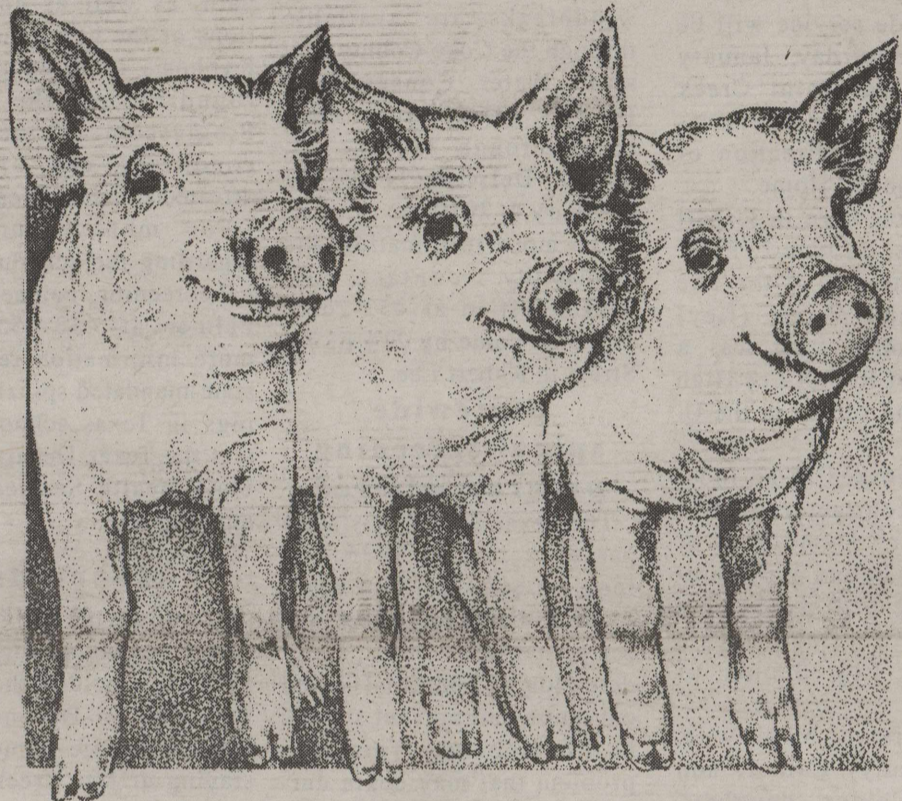
WTRC Telethon slated for Saturday

Statewide spinal screening program offered

The Texas State Legislature passed a law in 1985 that requires all sixth and ninth grade students to be screened for spinal deformities. Early detection of abnormal spinal curvature can prevent serious health problems. This is a problem that may begin during the early adolescent years (from 10 - 14 years of age), with an estimated 1 in 10 adolescents having some degree of abnormal curva-

ture. Curves that are detected early may only require periodic observation by a specialist. Moderate curves may require the wearing of a brace, which is usually supervised by an orthopedic specialist. In most cases, need for major surgery for this deformity can be eliminated through early detection.

Spinal screening for Robert Lee ISD school children has been scheduled to begin on Wednesday, January 20, 2010.

Children will be screened for two types of spinal deformities: scoliosis and kyphosis. Scoliosis is a condition in which the spine is twisted, causing misalignment of the upper body or lower back. This condition can worsen and lead to much pain, as well as complications of the heart and lungs. Kyphosis is an exaggerated rounding of the spine. Progression of these two conditions can often be arrested if detected early.

Audubon Bird Count held

The annual Audubon Bird Count was held in the Robert Lee area on December 19. Fifteen people came, some staying at Mt. Creek Lodge and having their meals at Cindy's.

The group noted 89 species in an eight hour count. A large number of water birds

were counted: 530 Great White Pelicans, 345 cormorants, 383 sandhill cranes, 150 Bonapart Gulls, 300 ring-billed gulls. Also, desert dwelling birds counted included Western Scrub-Jay, Chihuahuan Raven, Cactus Wren, Mockingbird, Roadrunner, doves, hawks, and cardinals.

Rare species sited include the Bufflehead duck, belted kingfisher, and painted bunting, but no yellow-head sparrow as was sited last year.

**Census Day set
 for April 1**

April 1, 2010 is Census Day, the day every U.S. resident will be counted, a mandate in Article 1, Section 2 of the U.S. Constitution. Census data is used for the apportionment of U.S. Congressional seats and for distribution of more than \$400 billion in federal funds to states and communities annually.

The 2010 Census questionnaire will be the shortest in history. It will include 10 questions, take fewer than 10 minutes to complete and will affect life in your community for the next 10 years.

The Census Bureau is now recruiting temporary workers to manage this year's count with pay running from \$8 to \$24 an hour. Those who wish to schedule a basic skills test to qualify for positions should call (866) 861-2010.

More than 9,000 high school band students from across Texas auditioned in twenty different regions for a place in their respective all-region bands. The top chairs in each region advanced to one of the five area auditions held this past weekend across the state and only 240 of these 1360 students were selected for all-state honors.

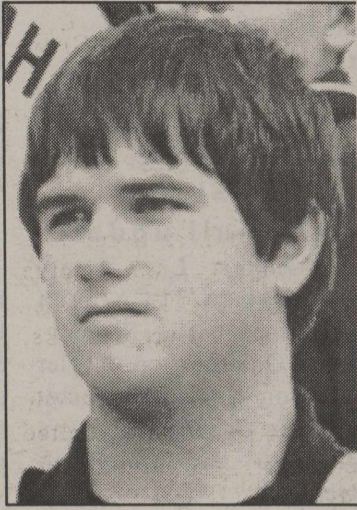
The ATSSB All-State Bands will meet in rehearsals in San Antonio, Texas, February 10-13, and will present a concert beginning at 2 pm on Saturday, February 13, 2010, in the Texas Ballroom of the Grand Hyatt Hotel in downtown San Antonio.

Glenn Kostur, Director of Jazz Studies at the University of New Mexico, will be the clinician-conductor of the All-State Jazz Ensemble. Mark Camphouse from George Mason University in Fairfax, Virginia, will be the clinician-conductor of the All-State Symphonic Band. Dr. Sarah McKoin, Director of Bands at Texas Tech University, will be the clinician-conductor of the All-State Concert Band. The Concert Band will also present the premier performance of Paramount Park by Eric Rath, winner of the 2010 ATSSB Composition Competition.

Jonathan Dannheim, a member of the Bronte High School Band, was selected as a member of this band. He was chosen for this honor in competitive auditions held this year across the state at region and area levels. Dannheim is a private student of Keith Lloyd and plays Percussion at school under the direction of Wayne Dannheim, who is a member of the Association of Texas Small School Bands, a 1000-member group of band directors in class 1A, 2A, and 3A high schools in Texas. This is Jonathan's first time to perform as a member of the ATSSB All-State Band. He is also active in church activities at 4th and Elm Church of Christ. 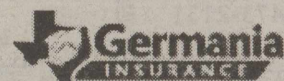

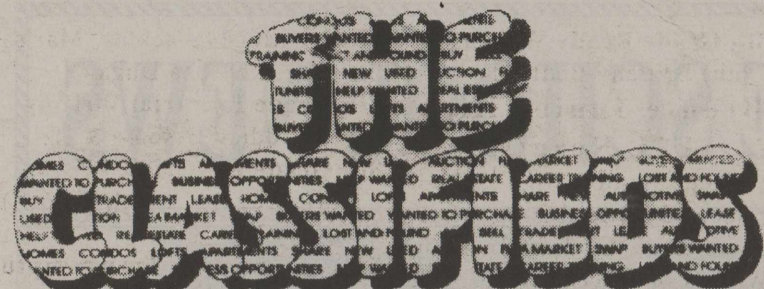

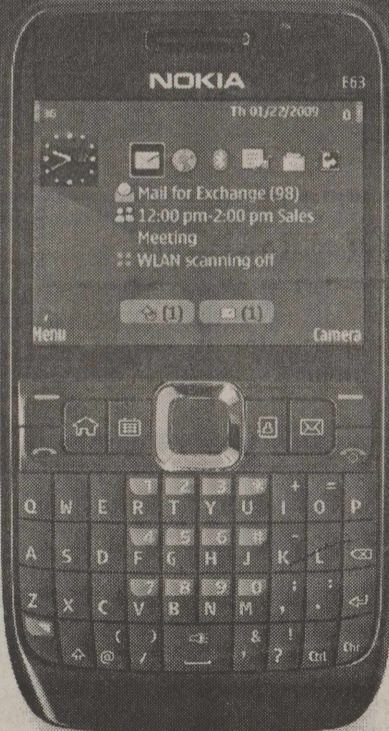
