RLISD slates special election

The Robert Lee Independent School District will have two propositions on their ballot on May 8, in addition to electing two school board members. In the school board election, Tod Reed and Beverly Sinclair have filed for two positions on the board of trustees.

In addition, RLISD will have two propositions on the ballot which concern wealth equalization. Proposition 1 authorizes the board of trustees to purchase attendance credits from the state with local tax revenues. Proposition 2 authorizes the board of trustees to educate

students of other school districts with local tax revenues. It should be noted that the board had five options to choose from for this special election, and these were the two options which they endorsed.

Early voting by personal appearance will be at the Coke County Clerk's office at the courthouse at 13 E. 7th in Robert Lee between the hours of 8:00 am and 5:00 pm from Monday, April 26, 2010 until Tuesday, May 4, 2010. Early voting on Friday, April 30, 2010 will be between the hours of 8:00 am and 1:00 pm.

Election day voting will be conducted from 7:00 am to 7:00 pm on May 8, 2010 at the same location in the courthouse.

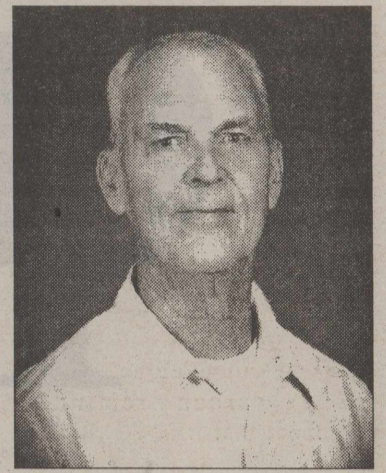
He was preceded in death by his wife of 49 years, Sonja.

The students who earned 95% or above were awarded with a Silver Science Super Bowl medal. These two students are Kacelyn Follis and Tristin Minjarez.

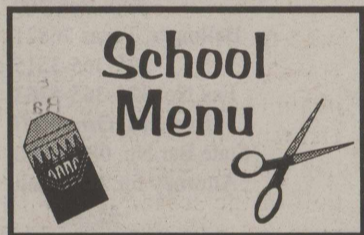

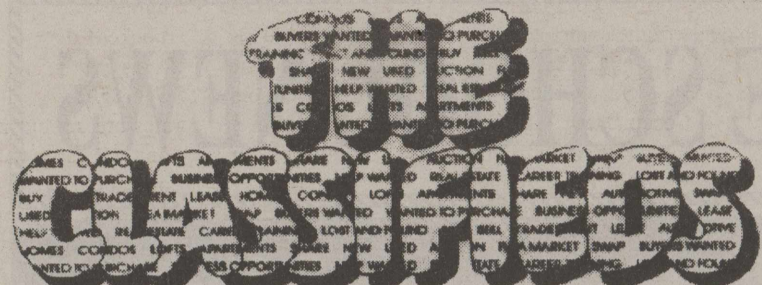

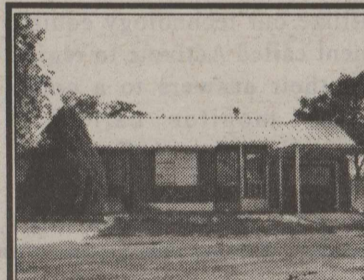

Relay for Life raises over \$31,000

The Coke County Relay For Life was held this past weekend and was deemed a success. Eleven teams participated, two from Bronte and nine from Robert Lee. Over 90 cancer survivors were registered online and approximately 50 survivors and 20 caregivers participated in the opening lap at this year's event. The very emotional Luminaria Ceremony included over 500 luminaria candles which lined the track and spelled out "HOPE" in the visitors stands. Approximately 1,000 canned goods were used in the luminaria bags and then donated to the Coke County Food Pantry. The Fight Back Ceremony included a skit which was funny but had several good ideas about

prevention and early detection of cancer. Over \$31,000 was collected with more money still to be turned in. All money goes to help the American Cancer Society's efforts in the areas of research, patient services and education.

DJ, Tommy, from KKC 103.1 was on hand all night to keep things lively and everyone awake! Wonderful breakfast burritos were served up by the Robert Lee-Silver Lion's Club to all remaining walkers on Saturday morning.

Awards given out at the closing ceremony on Saturday morning included: Best T-shirt - Sole Savers; Best New Team - Sole Savers (B); Best Campsite - Rabbit Twisters; Most Spirited Team - RLCC Party Girls; Night Owls Team - RL First United

Methodist Church Flames; Vanishing Team - Sorosis Club-Bronte; Top Online Fundraising Team - RLSB Pink Ladies; Top Fundraising Team - RLSB Pink Ladies. The Super Team trophy, which is on a point system for a combination of fundraising and participation at the event, went to the Rabbit Twisters team for the 3rd year in a row.


Many of you may wonder why we walk all night...Relay For Life starts at dusk and ends the next morning. The Relay begins in the evening just before sunset, which symbolizes the time a person is diagnosed with cancer. As the evening progresses, it gets colder and darker - this

represents the patients' struggle as they endure the emotions of being a cancer patient. The time between 1 to 2 a.m. represents when the cancer patient starts treatment. They become exhausted, some sick, not wanting to go on, possibly wanting to give up. As a participant in the Relay, you have been walking and feel much the same way. Like the cancer patient, you cannot stop or give up. The time around 4 to 5 a.m. symbolizes the completion of treatment for the cancer patient. Once again, they are tired, but they know they will make it. The sun rising represents the end of treatment for the cancer patient. They see the light and have hope that life will go on. The morning light brings on a new day, full of life and excitement for new beginnings. As a participant, you will feel the brightness of the morning and

know that the end of the Relay is close at hand. When you leave the Relay, think of the cancer patient leaving their last treatment. Just as you are exhausted and weak, so is that person, but there is hope in the new day! The money raised at Relay will support patient services, lifesaving research, education, and advocacy efforts...and that is why we Relay! There is no finish line until we find a cure!

The 2011 & 2012 Coke County Relay For Life events will be held in Bronte. 
