### Voters to head to polls Saturday in local entities elections

tomorrow, Saturday, May 8, 2010, in both Bronte and Robert Lee.

In Bronte, there are five candidates vying for the two Bronte ISD Board of Trustees full three year terms. Incumbents Shane Kelton and Quinda Feil-Duncan will face Kay Styles, Jeanna Lee, and Fred Thomas. Polls will be open from 7 am to 7 pm at City Hall, 114 South Washington, in Bronte.

The City of Robert Lee will Lee. have to choose a new mayor and two council members. Manuel Abalos and John Jacobs are vying for the mayoral slot. The candidates for the council positions include Bill Torres, Richard Johnson, Sid Burns, and Jeanette Meeks.

Lee The Robert Independent School District will have two propositions on their ballot, in addition to electing two school board members. In the school board election, Tod Reed and Beverly Sinclair have filed for two positions on the board of trustees.

In addition, RLISD will have two propositions on the ballot which concern wealth equalization. Proposition 1 authorizes the board of trustees to purchase attendance credits from the

Voters will go to the polls state with local tax revenues. Proposition 2 authorizes the board of trustees to educate students of other school districts with local tax revenues. It should be noted that the board had five options to choose from for this special election, and these were the two options which they endorsed.

If the mountain won't come to Mohamet-well, the town of Robert Lee, Tex., will follow the example of the prophet and move to the water that won't come to it, except in an unwanted manner. The town of 1,000 inhabitants is preparing to move to its third site in 57 years in quest of an adequate supply of

water. Present site will be several feet under the reservoir of the \$7,000,000 project contemplated by the U.S. bureau of reclamation, which proposes construction of Buffalo dam across the Colorado river in Coke county.

### Coke County slow in returning census forms

The national response rate to the mail-in Census 2010 campaign is 72%. response is at 69% statewide. Coke County stands at 43% response to the mail-in campaign.

Beginning in May, census workers will be going doorto-door to help folks get counted. These workers are neighbors who have taken on a part-time job and will be wearing Census 2010 identification. Most workers will be local folks who will be known to households or who will know someone who knows them.






