





Justin B. Holland, Frm Loan Manager, said farmers may be eligible for loans of up to 100% of their actual losses or the operating loan needed to continue the agricultural business, whichever is less. For farmers unable to obtain credit from private commercial lenders, the interest rate is 3.75 percent.

As a general rule, a farmer must have suffered at least a 30 percent loss of production to be eligible for an FSA emergency loan. Farmers participating in the Federal Crop Insurance program will have to consider proceeds from those programs in determing their loss.

Applications for loans under this emergency designation will be accepted until December 13, 2010 but farmers should apply as soon as possible. Delays in applying could create backlogs in greater than 12" in size) on processing, with possible delays into the new farming season.

"HSUS certainly doesn't mind the name confusion, though," he added. "In fact, they bank on it. People donate to them mistakenly thinking that they're helping animals when in fact those donat

> Of the millions of dollars in donations HSUS collects each year under the guise of helping homeless cats and dogs, recent tax filings show less than 1 percent is actually used for its intended purpose. "HSUS' goal is to end animal agriculture in America," Bobby Roberts said. "By misleading donors in television and direct mail campaigns, HSUS has developed a war chest that strikes right at the heart of animal agriculture. For the sake of our profession and the future of our food supply, we cannot let the deception continue."



... Recent Rainfall (Continued from Page 1) some pretty spring, and we haven't had one like it in at least several years.

Some areas of the county have received over a dozen inches of rainfall since the first of the year. And even those who haven't seen that much rainfall have been blessed with eight or nine inches so far this year.

Pasture grasses came out early this year (I don't know why, because it seemed too cool, particularly soil temperatures) for grasses to emerge right along with the weeds. Some of these pasture grasses are approaching knee high. Speaking of weeds, every species of weed known to man has come up this year. The good news there is that we have had a wonderful bluebonnet and wildflower year to go along with it, which also helps with the pretty part mentioned earlier.

If you disagree with me on the prettiest spring, let's get to some rainfall figures for the county that may not be official, but they're as accurate as I can get on such short notice. If you want to wait for the real rainfall totals, we will have them sometime after June 30th, which is the end of the second quarter, and our cooperators will report their second quarter totals at that time.

Speaking of cooperators, we are happy to report that we had some response to our appeal for rainfall cooperators, especially one to fill the shoes of Bob Blackwood, who ranched in the area about four miles east of Robert Lee. Upon hearing of Bob's death and our appeal for his replacement, Paul Shefler responded, and we are grateful. Paul's place is about one mile north of Bob's; so he essentially will be reporting on the same area of the county.

Also, Jerry and Susan Wellborn have volunteered to send us results from their area, which is out past Pecan Baptist Church west of Robert Lee on Hwy. 158. We'll start out with their rainfall total for the weekend, because they emailed it in early on Monday morning. The Wellborns reported 1.15" on May 14 and .25 on May 15, which unfortunately makes theirs the lowest rainfall reported for the county for the weekend. All along I thought my total was going to be the lowest for the weekend, and it was 2.2 inches. I confirmed this with my neighbor, Ron Hill, who got 2.25 for the weekend; so there's probably nothing wrong with his or my gauges except they just don't get used enough.

Last, but certainly not least, the big winner in the rainfall totals for the weekend was the Bronte area, specifically the easternmost areas of the county. The City of Bronte got somewhere around 3.5 to 4 inches for the weekend, mainly because they got a good 1.6 to 1.8 inch storm on Thursday that missed the west side of the county. Rainfall totals for the area around Oak Creek to Maverick were sketchy, but estimates were somewhere around four or five inches on Thursday in these areas, with more over the weekend.

The THC is committed to involving the public as part of the Statewide Preservation Plan development process, by conducting planning forums throughout the state begin-








