Whatever happened to La Nina?

Okay, so it's toward the end of June. After a wonderful start (up to twelve wet received from at least one to inches of rainfall in some places during the first two quarters of 2010), we seemed to be reverting back to a generally dry summer weather pattern.

For one thing, we had suffered through about thirty hot days in June without a significant rainfall for the most part.

The weather forecasters were predicting our area back in a La Nina weather pattern, which is the dry one (the wet weather pattern is El Nino). And the third reason we were thinking hot and dry is that summertime has proven to us to be mainly hot and dry. Pastures and hay crops were curling up their toes due to the dry weather, and the outlook wasn't too rosy, unless you just happen to like extreme wildfire conditions.

Just when we thought we were in the soup for the summer, so to speak, the last four days of June started a complete turnaround in our moisture situation. It rained inches during the first two

by Hal Spain, Publisher pretty generally at least three of the last four days of June. Most areas of the county four inches of rain by June 30.

> Then the hurricane rains hit Coke County, and we got another four days of rain through July 4th. All told, most of us didn't see the sun for about eight days from June 27 through July 4. It has rained so many days at my place I can hardly remember the totals anymore. But I'll give it my best shot. According to my rain gauge, I had .6, .5, and 9, for a total of two inches the last four days of June. Since July 1 arrived, I have had .6, .5, .1, and 1.1, for a total of 2.2 inches since the first of July.

The first thing I'd like to point out about the accompanying table from our weather cooperators is that their July totals so far are not included in their results, because the second quarter ended on June 30. Not everybody has gotten the big totals in the first few days of July, but I did hear from Dolores McCabe. She reported a total of 16.19

Most businesses have been accounted for, but any business or service new to the area wishing to be included is encouraged to call before July 15.


The brochure is available for new residents, visitors, area tourist destinations and local business counters. There is no charge to be included.

Passport fees to increase

Ever travel to Mexico to get your teeth fixed or visit relatives? If you do, or if you travel anywhere out of the country, the cost will increase as of July 13, 2010.

According to Mary Grim, County/District Clerk, passport fees will increase as of July 13. The amount of the increase will be approximately \$35 for passport books. Passport books are usually required to travel out of country by air or sea. The new fees will be \$135 for adults 16 and over, and \$105 for minors under 16 years of age.



No man can serve two masters: For either he will hate the one, and love the other; or else he will hold to the one, and despise the other. Ye cannot serve God and mammon.


