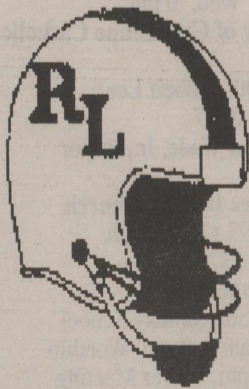

Charles Edwin Sims died peacefully in his sleep on Tuesday, October 5, 2010. He was 91 years of age and a resident of San Angelo, Texas.

Charles was born on January 23, 1919, in Bronte, Texas, to Minnie Ethel and John Marshall Sims. Charles had four sisters: Bertie Evaline, Emma Florence, Ruby Dauline and Elna Marcell; there were two brothers: Ellis Harmon and R.W. (Dub). Charles attended public schools in Bronte, Texas and in 1941 went to vocational school in Dallas, Texas to study metalsmithing. World War II prompted a stint in the Navy and he utilized his metalsmithing skills to help build B24 bombers for our country. Charles was honorably discharged in June 1946 and returned to Bronte.

In 1954 Charles married Thelma Olene Mauldin Snoddy and, along with her two sons, Ronnie and Richard, relocated in Robert Lee, Texas. Following retirement in 1993, Charles and Olene lived in Houston, Boerne and, finally, San Angelo, Texas until his death. He was a successful landowner and rancher, but his life was devoted to his family.

Charles is survived by his wife, Olene; sons Ronald and spouse Bonnie; and Richard and spouse Dana; granddaughters Penne and spouse Clifton Gooch; Kelly Sims and Teri Bentley. There are three great-grandchildren: Blake and Troy Bentley; and Alexandra Gooch. He is

also survived by his sister, Elna and spouse R.C. White; nieces Kathryn and spouse David Gulley; Jonnie Pearl and spouse Tom Lutrell; and Debra Lynn; nephews Sammy Doyle Sparks and D.W. (D. Dub) Sims; and numerous great nieces and nephews. Charles was preceded in death by his mother, Minnie Ethel Sims; father, John Marshall Sims; sisters, Bertie Evaline, Ruby Dauline Sparks and Emma Florence; brothers, Ellis Harmon Sims and Dub Sims; and nephew, Bobby Edwin Wrinkle.

Visitation was held all day Thursday and will continue all day Friday with the family present from 5 to 7 pm Thursday, October 7, 2010. The minutes from the previous meeting were presented. A motion was made by Melinda McCutchen to accept the minutes as presented, seconded by Susan Williams. All were in favor and the motion passed.

It was decided to judge Christmas decorations on December 19 with registration due by December 13 at Bronte City Hall. The public will actually be the judges this year. Ballots will be available at the bank parking lot from 6 pm to 8 pm on December 19. Ballots will be turned in through City Hall's night drop. The Teen Chamber will be assisting with this.

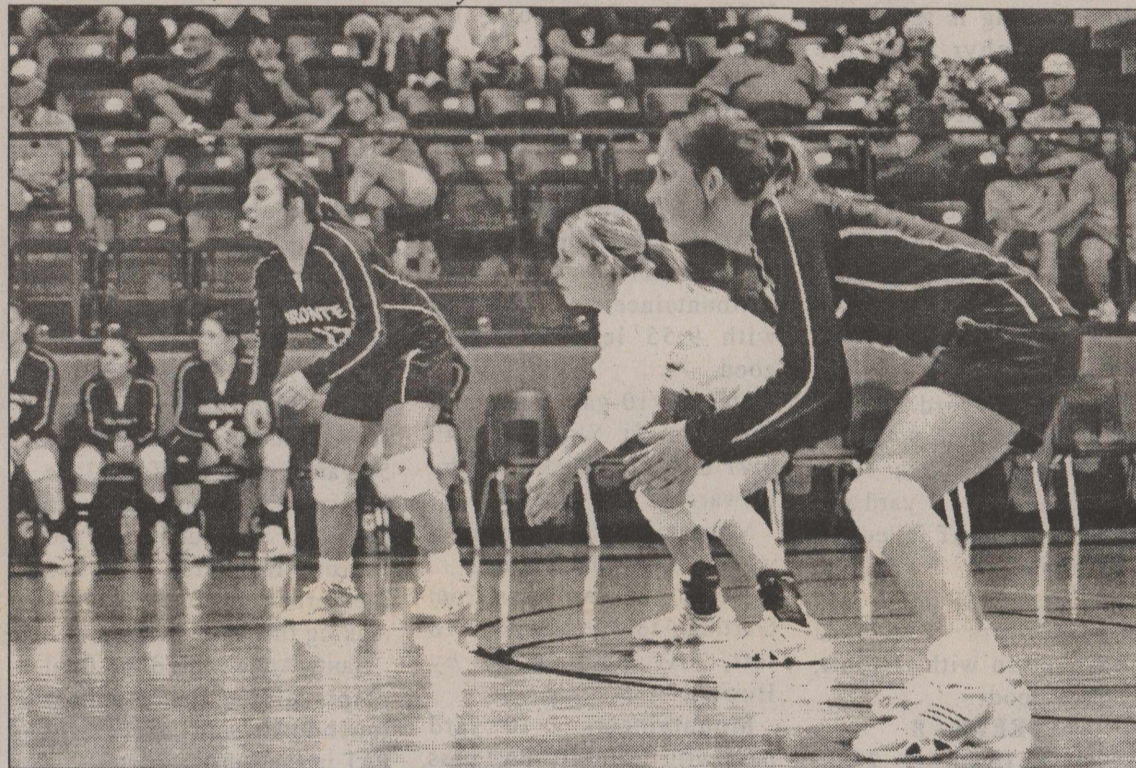

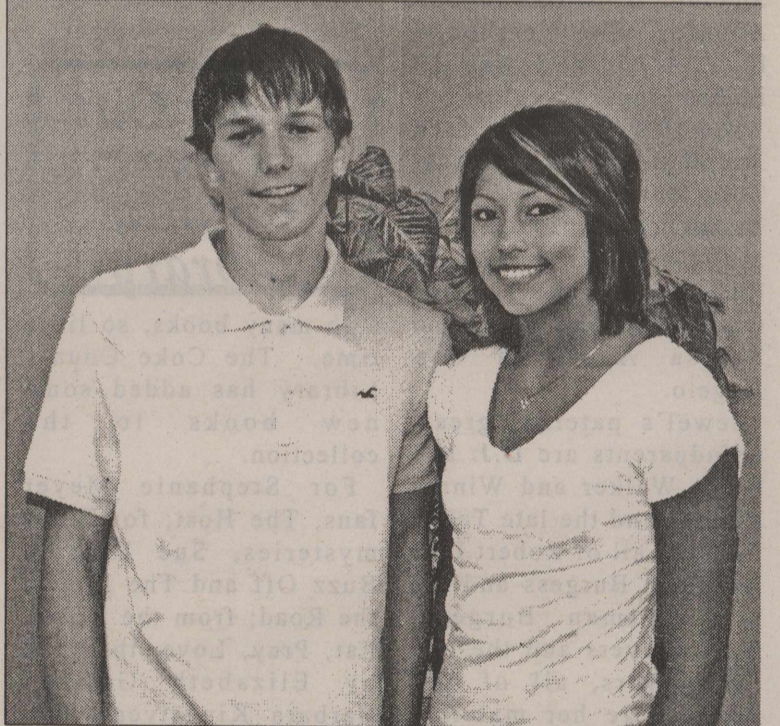
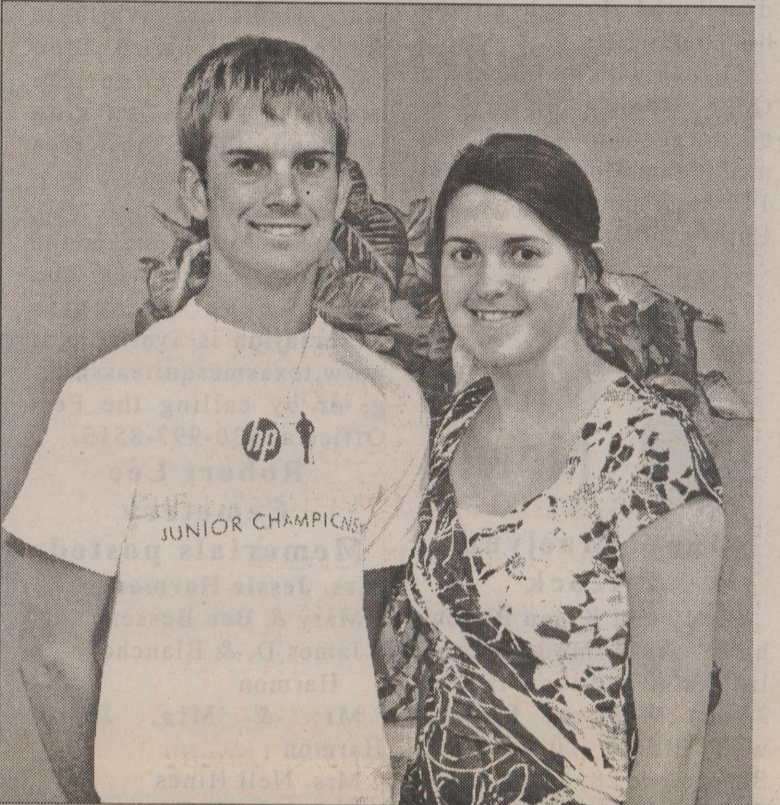
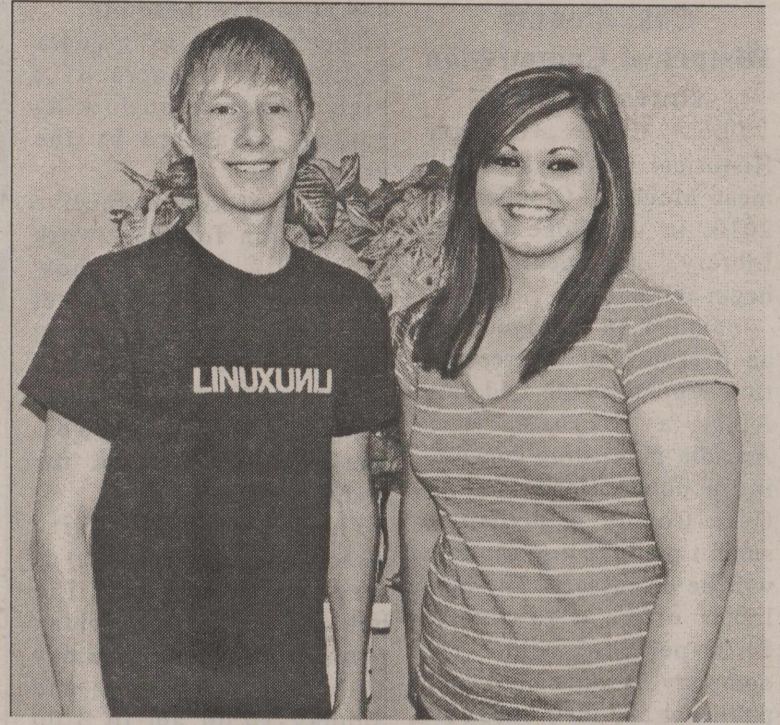
Santa Anna scored the final points of the game with a touchdown and successful PAT in the fourth quarter.

Longhorns are victorious over Cross Plains Buffaloes

The Bronte Longhorns found the win column for the second time this season with a 42-20 victory over the Cross Plains Buffaloes last Friday. The Longhorns were able to capitalize on mistakes made by the Buffaloes to jump out early and score on a much improved Cross Plains team. Creed Coalson returned an interception 85

yards midway through the first to put the Horns on the board first. Creed scored again as time ran out in the first on a twelve yard run. That score came courtesy of a fumbled punt by the Buffaloes that was recovered by John Deller inside their own 30. Being an American Essay Contest focuses on American Citizenship

U.S. high school students and their teachers are invited to compete for nearly \$115,000 in prize money by participating in the Bill of Rights Institute's fifth annual Being an American Essay Contest. Top prize winners and their teachers will also receive all-expenses paid trips to the nation's capital.

The largest high school essay contest in the country, awarding 180 students and teachers with cash prizes and attracting more than 50,000 essays last year, explores the rights and responsibilities of American citizenship. The contest is administered by the Bill of Rights Institute, a non-profit educational organization in the Washington, D.C. area devoted to educating children about the Constitution and Founding principles. The sponsors include the History Channel and the Stuart Family Foundation.

"This contest is unique in that it gives students the opportunity to think about

On September 17, 2010, Atmos Pipeline - Texas, a division of Atmos Energy Corporation ("APT" or the "Company"), filed a Statement of Intent to change its natural gas transportation rates for firm and interruptible customers and implement a new schedule of rates and riders applicable to all transportation customers receiving service under existing Rate Schedules CGS and Rate Schedule PT. The proposed effective date of the requested rate changes is October 22, 2010. If approved, the proposed changes will affect approximately 4 firm transportation customers and 63 interruptible transportation customers. APT's Other Revenue customer class is not affected by this filing.

If approved, the proposed rates will increase the Company's annual revenues by \$38.9 million. The proposed change in rates constitutes a "major change" as that term is defined by Section 104.101 of the Texas Utilities Code. In addition, the Company seeks to recover all rate case expenses as allowed by law. The exact amount of rate case expenses will not be known until the case is completed.

Based on the proposed rate design, the meter charge will be eliminated, and the capacity charge and usage rate applicable for each of the customer classes affected by this filing will increase by the amount shown in the table below:

This Rate Schedule will, consistent with the Commission's Final Order Nunc Pro Tunc in GUD No. 9869, include recovery of ad valorem taxes related to Mid-Tex's working gas in storage, as well as the return and related taxes on Mid-Tex's working gas in storage, the Accumulated Deferred Income Tax for UNICAP Section 263A and the WACOG to FIFO change related to the Mid-Tex working gas in storage. A second Rate Schedule CGS - Other is proposed for all other city gate customers that is identical to the proposed Rate Schedule CGS - Mid-Tex with the exception of the requested changes related to Mid-Tex's working gas in storage. Letter to Backyard Poultry magazine republished

[Editor's Note: Leah Rosson of Bronte recently sent us a letter by Caroline Knight that was originally published in the Backyard Poultry magazine. Its content is included below.]

I have been getting the Backyard Poultry magazine for some time and have really learned an abundance of information about raising chickens. I take my eggs to work to sell and have no problem getting rid of them. Sometimes people will ask me a question, and I feel good that I can answer them and it is all due to your magazine. One question was: When you break an egg, why is there a bit of blood visible? I read the article on the egg process and was able to give the answer.

One thing I found very interesting was the heat stress chart. I had no idea temperature and humidity played such an important role in my birds' health. When we built the coop, we used tin my husband had laying around our property.

We didn't really think about the heat the tin could draw in until the coop was built; so ventilation became the focus.

We had an old camper and used the windows from it. We put a set of windows on the east and west side. They are adjustable; so it helps against the winter winds as well as letting in light to encourage laying. Attached to the coop is a 12 X 40 foot enclosed run. We used trampoline parts for the top and one inch chicken wire.

We keep the chickens cooped in when we aren't home; otherwise they have three acres to roam. I keep the nesting boxes dusted and spray the hens with permethrin as recommended. I am in the process of putting together a dust bath to put inside the run. I read about using a kiddie pool and the mixture of diatomaceous earth, sand, and ashes.

I know how important it is for them to dust. Chickens get bored and can be brutal to one another. I have 15 hens I bought at the local feed store in May, 2009, and then I bought 18 more in March, 2010.

I have a variety of breeds, and I am really looking forward to the dark brown eggs from my Marans and Welsummers. My flock stays happy and

healthy and it is all due to your magazine and all of its information. I hope you enjoy the pictures. Loving my chickens!

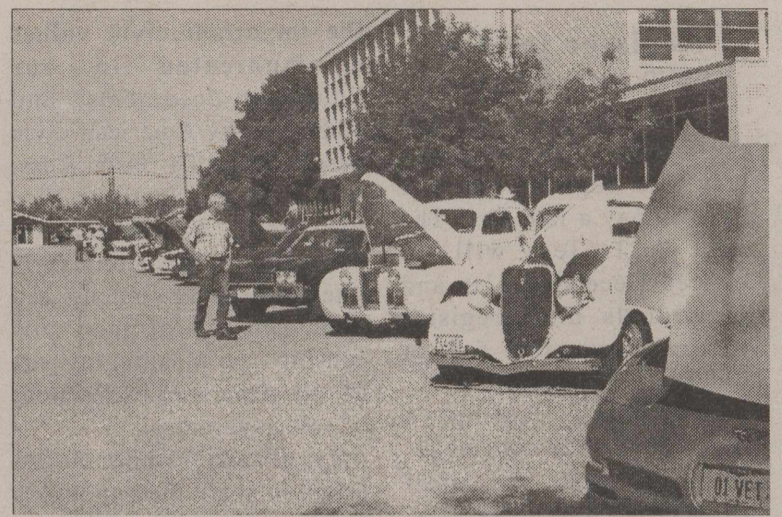

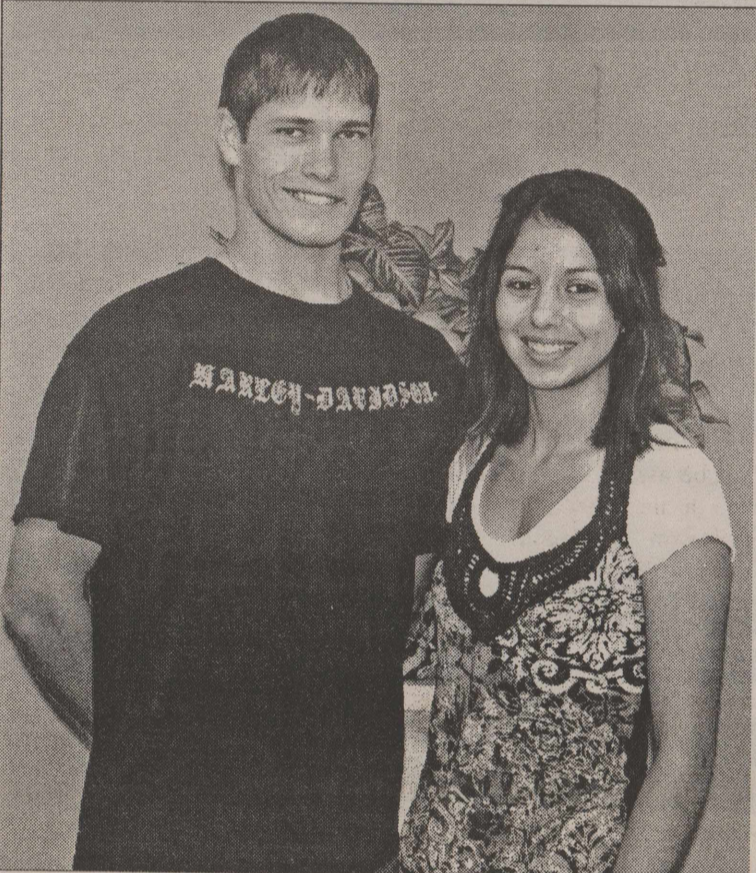

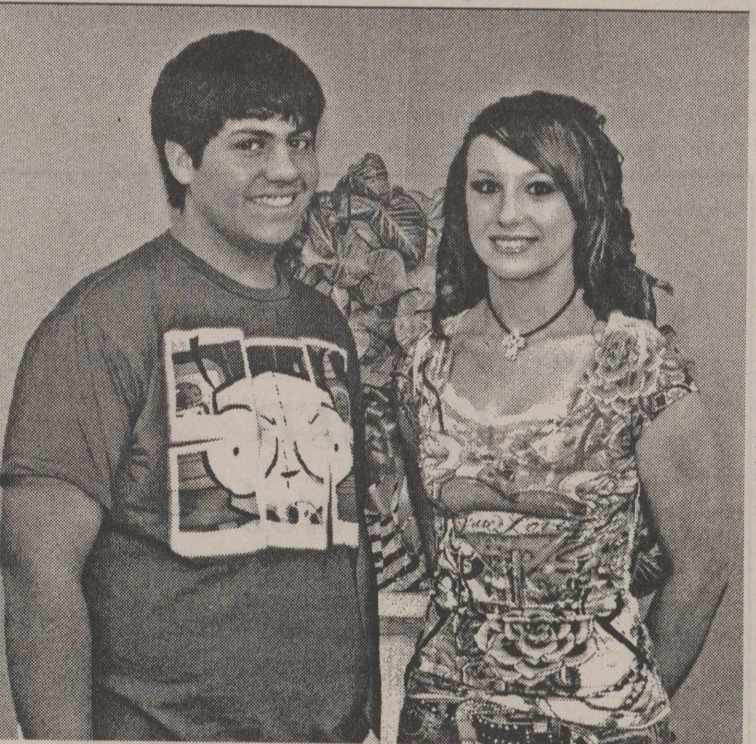

Because they received not the love of the truth, that they might be saved. For this cause God shall send them strong delusion, that they should believe a lie:

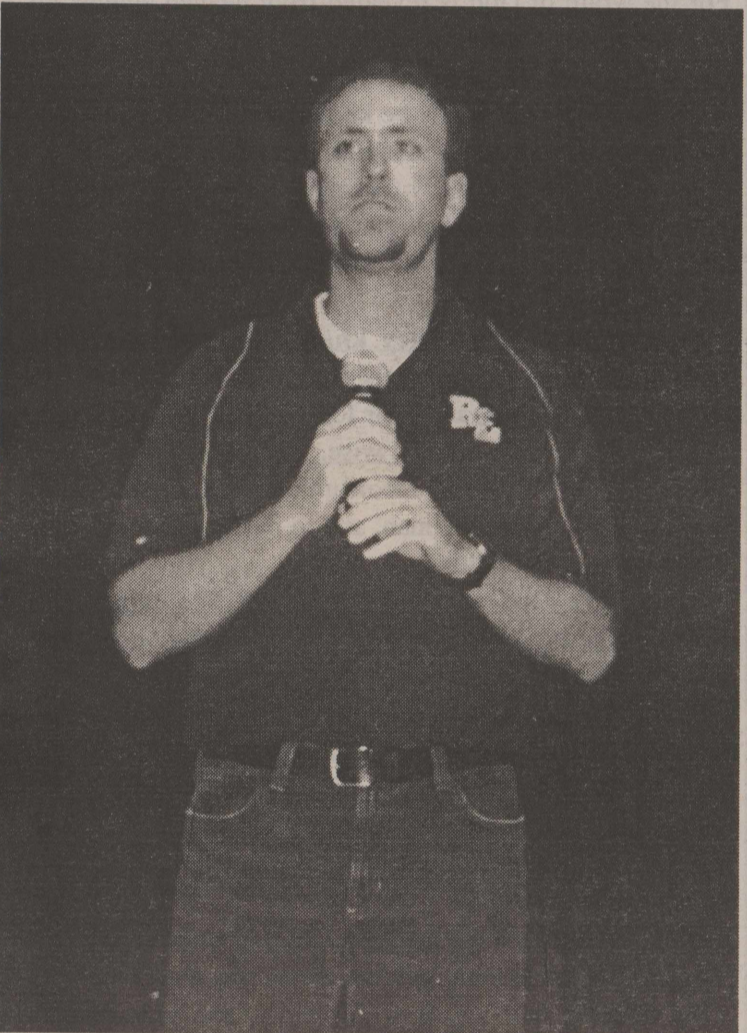
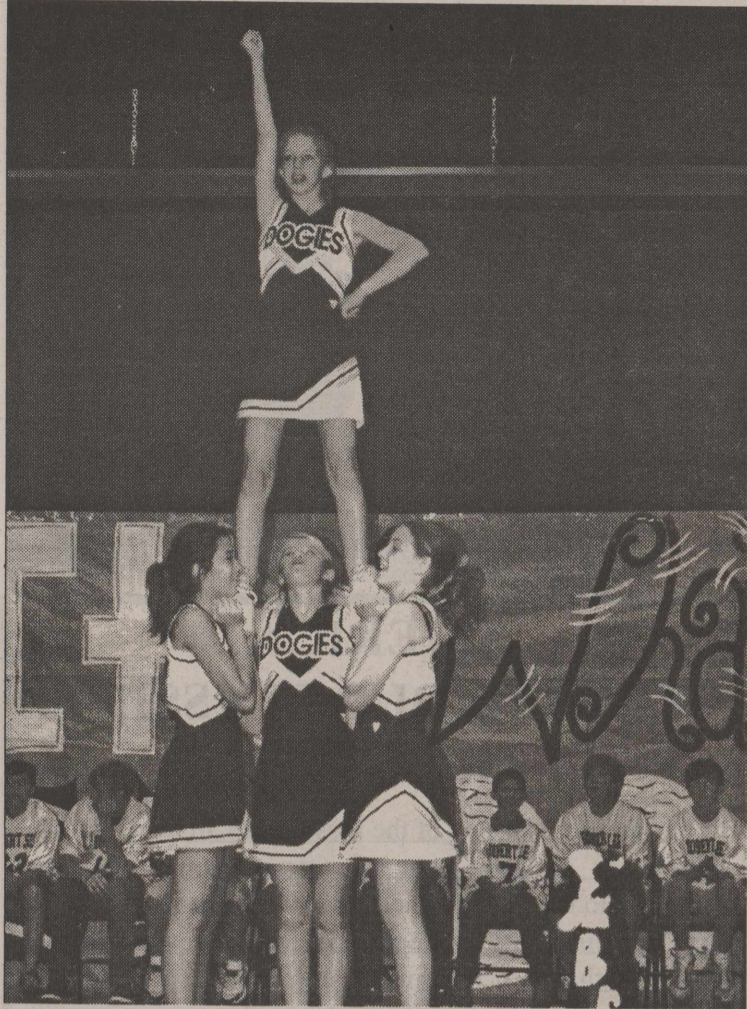
