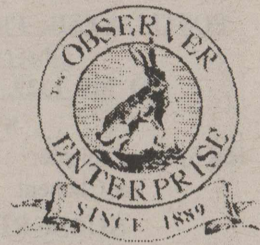

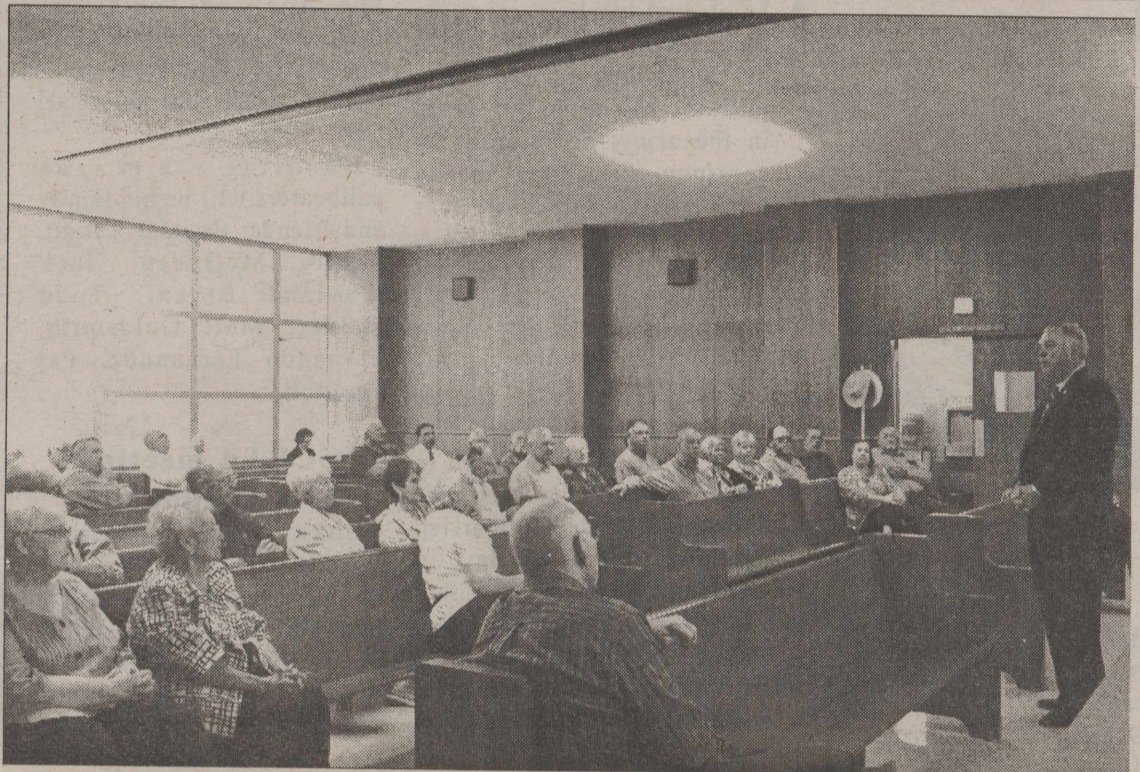
Come to the movies at the Texas Theater in Bronte

Early voting continues through Friday, October 29

Early voting for the upcoming General Election set for November 2, 2010, began in Coke County and around the state on Monday, October 18, 2010. Early voting will continue through Friday, October 29, and is being conducted at the County Clerk's office in the courthouse, 13 E. 7th Street, Robert Lee, Texas. Hours for early voting are from 8 am until 5 pm Monday through Thursday,



Darby addresses residents! State Representative Drew Darby addressed approximately 40 county residents recently in the District Courtroom at the courthouse in Robert Lee. Darby's primary focus was on the upcoming legislative session, where funding will be the focus for the next biennium. The state will have to account for 80,000 new students in the school system, adding that school funding will be a huge priority. He also noted that 1300 new residents are relocating to Texas every day, which places more demands on roads and other state-provided services.

and from 8 am until 1 pm on Fridays. In addition, branch early voting will be held at the First National Bank in Bronte on October 26 and 27, from 9 am until 1 pm.

Although this is an off-year for a presidential election, there are a couple of races of interest on the state level, and a couple that are being contested locally. Kathi Cox and Hal Spain are vying for the county treasurer's position, and Jackie Walker and Leroy Casey are running for the Justice of the Peace, Precinct #1 post.

In addition, the race for governor is heating up, with incumbent Rick Perry being challenged by former Houston mayor Bill White. Others of interest locally on the Nov. 2nd ballot are U.S. Representative, District 11 Mike Conaway and State Representative, District 27 Drew Darby.

Other uncontested races in Coke County include: County Judge - Roy Blair; County and District Clerk - Mary Grim; County Commissioner, Precinct 2 - Wendell Lee; County Commissioner, Precinct 4 - Bobby Blaylock; and Justice of the Peace, Precinct 2 - Grady Coulter.

County/District Clerk Mary Grim wants to remind voters that in this election, they may

vote for whomever they want, regardless of party affiliation. In the primary election last spring, voters were restricted to casting their ballots in the democratic or republican primaries. In the upcoming general election, voters may cast a ballot for whomever they like, regardless of party affiliation. Voters may still cast a straight party ticket on the general election ballot; however, they are urged to go through the whole ballot and make sure that all their preferences are within that party.

Other dates that are relevant to the upcoming general election include: October 26, which is the last date to apply for a ballot by mail (the application must be received and not just postmarked by this date); October 29, which is the final day for early voting; and November 2, which is general election day.

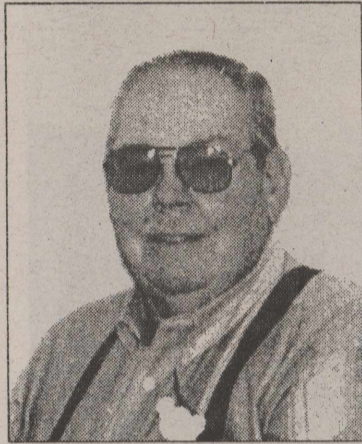

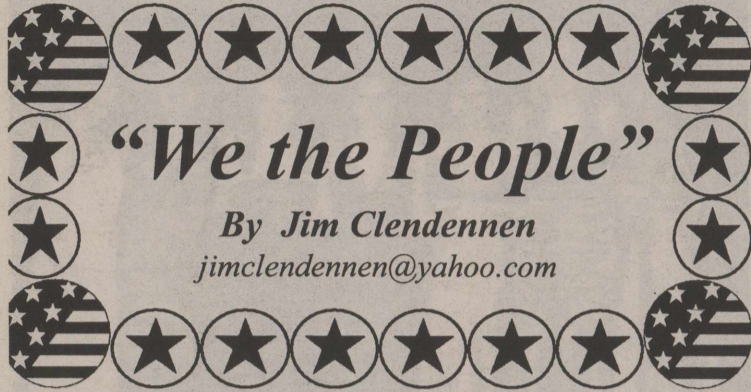

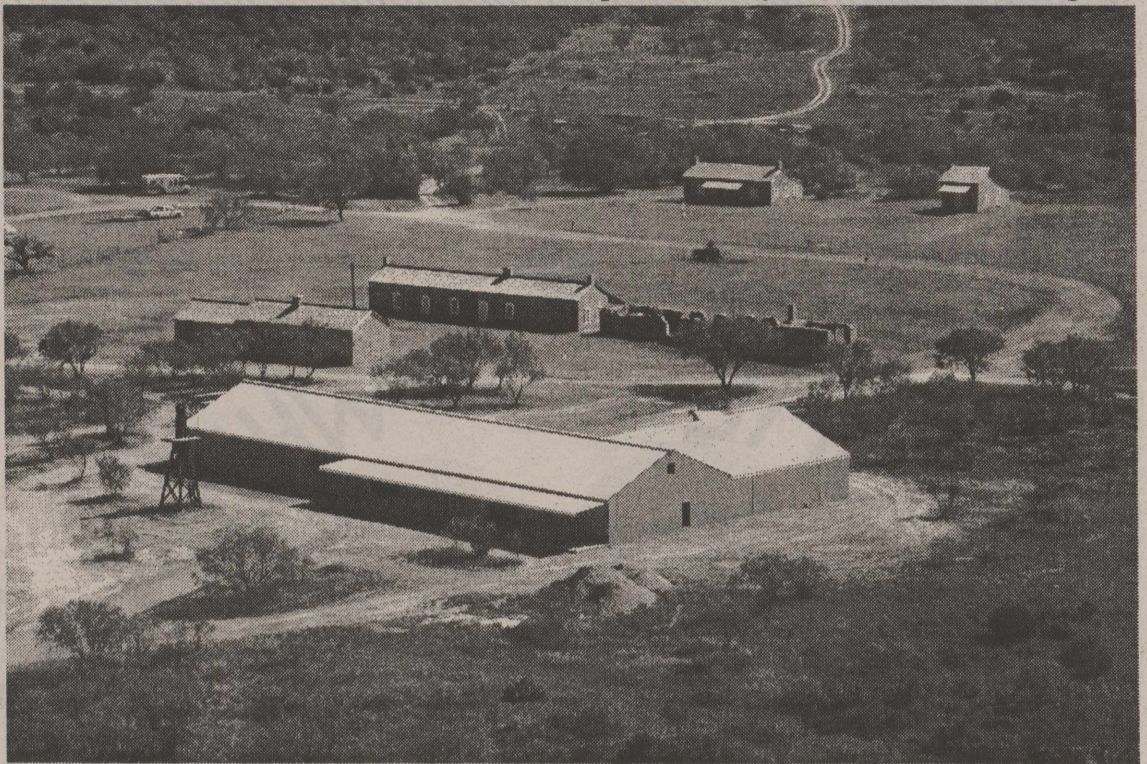
Annual Bloodsuckers blood drive to kick off Saturday

The meeting was opened with prayer by David McWright.

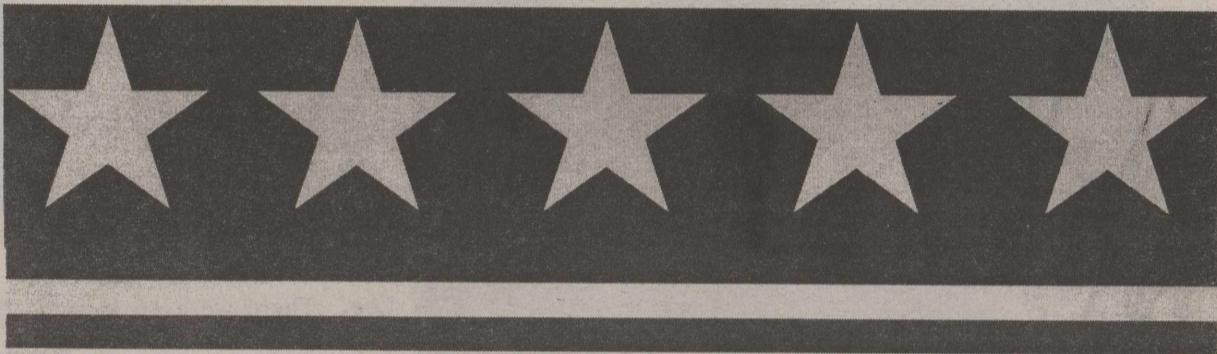
Donna Poehls gave the Principal's report. It was reported that many ex-students expressed their approval and appreciation for Bronte ISD's facilities during Homecoming.

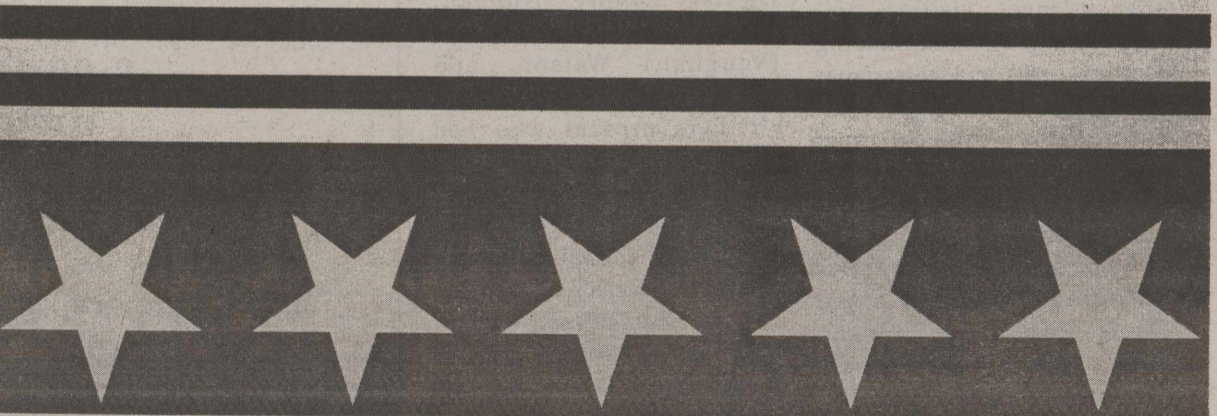

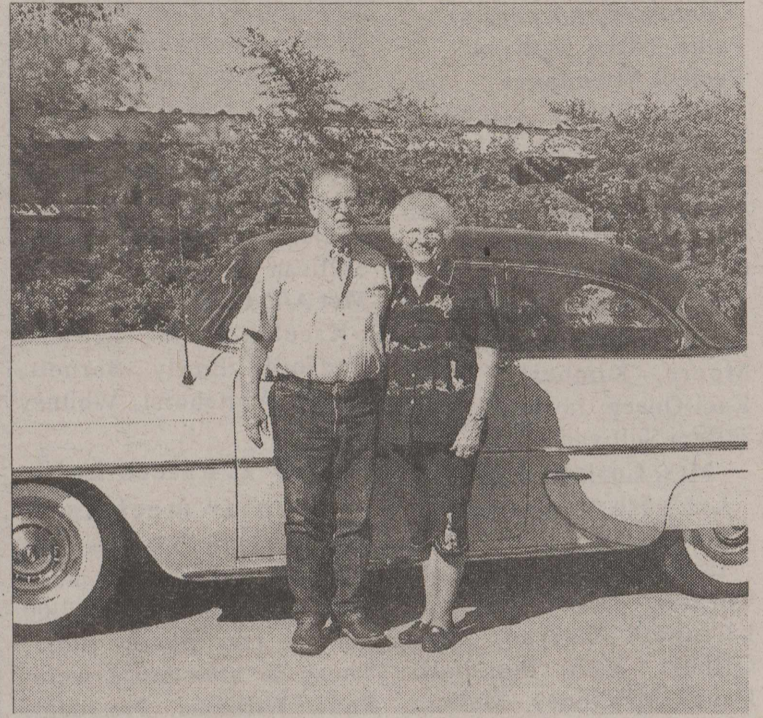

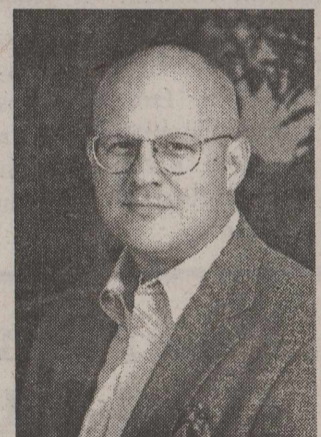

PUBLIC NOTICE

On September 17, 2010, Atmos Pipeline - Texas, a division of Atmos Energy Corporation ("APT" or the "Company"), filed a Statement of Intent to change its natural gas transportation rates for firm and interruptible customers and implement a new schedule of rates and riders applicable to all transportation customers receiving service under existing Rate Schedules CGS and Rate Schedule PT. The proposed effective date of the requested rate changes is October 22, 2010. If approved, the proposed changes will affect approximately 4 firm transportation customers and 63 interruptible transportation customers. APT's Other Revenue customer class is not affected by this filing.

If approved, the proposed rates will increase the Company's annual revenues by \$38.9 million. The proposed change in rates constitutes a "major change" as that term is defined by Section 104.101 of the Texas Utilities Code. In addition, the Company seeks to recover all rate case expenses as allowed by law. The exact amount of rate case expenses will not be known until the case is completed.

Based on the proposed rate design, the meter charge will be eliminated, and the capacity charge and usage rate applicable for each of the customer classes affected by this filing will increase by the amount shown in the table below:

STATE OF TEXAS COUNTY OF COKE

ORDER RESTRICTING OUTDOOR BURNING

WHEREAS, the Commissioners Court finds that circumstances present in all or part of the unincorporated area of the county create a public safety hazard that would be exacerbated by outdoor burning.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED by the Commissioners Court of Coke County that outdoor burning is restricted in the unincorporated area of the county for 90 days from the date of adoption of this Order, unless the restrictions are terminated earlier based on a determination made by the Texas Forest Service or this Court. This Order is adopted pursuant to Local Government Code

§352.081, and other applicable statutes. This Order does not prohibit outdoor burning activities related to public health and safety that are authorized by the Texas Natural Resources Commission for: (1) firefighter training; (2) public utility, natural gas pipeline or mining operations; (3) planting or harvesting of agricultural crops; or, (4) burns that are conducted by a prescribed burn manager certified under Section 153.048. Natural Resources Code, and meet the standards of Section 153.047, Natural Resources Code.

BE IT ALSO ORDERED THAT the purpose of this order is the mitigation of the hazard posed by wildfires by curtailing the practice of outdoor burning, with the exception of barbecuing in an enclosed fire box with water hose or fire retardant accessible at all times and someone attending the fire at all times, and materials used outdoors in activities such as welding and any other activity that could result in a fire. The purpose is to be taken into account in any enforcement action based upon this order.

A. Burns that are conducted after submission of a Natural Resources Conservation Service approved burn plan to the Coke County Judge.

Burns conducted under this section must meet the following conditions:

Prior to beginning a burn in Coke County, the Sheriff's office must be notified by calling 453-2717 on each day for each occurrence;

The person giving notification to the Sheriff's office must identify the area to be burned by describing the pasture or range by address, by location of County Road or State Highway, and also must give the name of the person requesting the burn;

A water sprayer apparatus or water containers and other fire fighting tools must be available on site;

Fire guards are to be used whenever possible;

Wind speeds must not exceed 15 MPH;

The Humidity index must be 20% or higher as determined by the Texas Forest Service for Coke County; and,

A cellular telephone or other reliable radio communication must be available on site for emergency notification and response.

B. Outdoor welding or cutting and grinding associated with welding activities are permitted under the following

circumstances:

1. Welding and cutting and grinding associated with welding activities shall not take place when the wind is over 15 miles per hour;

2. The welder must notify the Coke County Sheriff's Department before any welding, cutting or grinding begins;

3. All grass, leaves, brush and other easily combustible materials must be cleared within a fifty (50) foot radius surrounding the area where the activity is to take place before any welding, cutting or grinding begins; and

4. A spotter with water and a ready pressurized delivery system must be on hand before any welding, cutting or grinding begins and remain on hand until the activity is completed.

C. Burning of household trash is permitted under the following conditions:

1. Shall take place only when the wind speed is 15 miles per hour or less;

2. All grass, leaves, brush and other easily combustible materials must be cleared within a fifty (50) foot radius surrounding the area where the activity is to take place and before any burning of trash begins;

3. The burning takes place in a container with a mesh cover; and

4. A spotter with water and a ready pressurized delivery system must be on hand before any burning begins and remain on hand until the burning is completed.

D. Outdoor cooking is permitted under the following conditions:

1. Shall take place only when the wind speed is 15 miles per hour or less;

2. All grass, leaves, brush and other easily combustible materials must be cleared within a fifty (50) foot radius surrounding the area where the activity is to take place and before any outdoor cooking begins; and,

3. A spotter with water and a ready pressurized delivery system must be on hand before any outdoor cooking begins and remain on hand until the outdoor cooking is completed.

In accordance with Local Government §352.081 (h), a violation of this Order is a class C misdemeanor, punishable by a fine not to exceed \$500.00.
