



In Gaines County there are very few of the old ranch houses still standing. The above home was built by Ulyass Dalmont in 1906 or 1907. The lumber was freighted from the old Burton Lingo Lumber Company in freight wagons. How many freight wagons it would take to freight this huge house through the sand is not known. The home still stands 20 miles east and approximately ½ mile south of Seminole on the Lamesa Highway. It was once owned by the M. S. 

THE PROPOSED MEMORIAL HOSPITAL FOR SEMINOLE






One hundred thirty nine interested people met last Thursday night at the 106th District Courtroom to discuss pros and cons of Proposition #1 and Proposition #2 concerning the vote on the new hos pital. The question seems to be not whether to vote for #1 or #2, but how to vote for #1 or against #1, which is the 50 bed hospital proposition in Seminole. It was pointed out if Proposition #1 passed it would raise taxes on a \$15,000.00 home \$6.08 a year. Dr. Norman Cunningham from Menard, Texas, one time Seminole resident and married to the former Mary I ou Brown, a teacher, said, "We live at Menard. They wouldn't vote for a new hospital until they did without a doctor a year or two, then they were willing to vote for anything. Businessmen there will tell you when people leave town to go to the doctor and the hospital, they buy their clothing, they shop for groceries, and they buy their drugs other places. Menard almost dried up and blew away."

Huge cedar trees stand on the north and east sides of the house. A windmill can be seen in the background that sets in the corral area south of the old homestead. A huge concrete porch encircles the east, the north and the west sides. Twenty columns support the roof over the porch area. Weather vanes can still be seen, along with the chimney coming from the basement. More than one person thought that the house was purchased from Sears Roebuck but evidently that was the house across the highway, or the present Whitaker ranch that sets approximately 3 miles north.

"That was my room upstairs on the east side, " said Dee Coker. "Actually it had four or five beds in it where the cowboys stayed. The O'Neal boys and myself worked there when they were dipping cattle. It was my job to keep the cattle moving in and moving out of the dipping area. We dipped thousands of head. I'll tell you, they fed good. They knew how to go out and pick up an 8 or 9 month old beef that was still sucking. "

But, back to the house. On the west side a portion of the porch is screened in where the kitchen and the pantry are located. Three doors led off this enclosed portion to the office (den or library), to the kitchen and to the pantry. Besides the pantry, the kitchen and the office, there was the parlor downstairs, a living room, a huge hallway, a den or a bedroom and a dining room that would seat upwards to thirty people. The house had seven doors going outside. There was a cistern on the west side of the porch area and another cistern on the east side. There was a basement that opened up from the pantry area or could be entered from outside. The furnace in the basement evidently burned coal. It has long since been removed.

Upstairs were four huge bedrooms, most of them having three windows each, looking out three directions. There was a large landing above the stairway and a seating area, plus the only bathroom in the house. In the bathroom in a closet was a ladder leading to the attic. One lighting system used in the home, it may have been the original system, was carbide with copper and/or brass fixtures and chandeliers.

On the south side of the highway the ranch was thought to cover 37 to 40 sections. It was believed to cover 12 to 15 sections on the north side of the highway. The business of dipping cattle for all area ranches set just north of the highway where the ranch foreman lived. (The house still stands.) The dipping vat was built about 40 feet long, approximately 2 feet at the bottom and 3 feet at the top. Cattle were jumped off into the vat and swam toward the other end to a gradual incline where they walked out. Mr. Coker said, "A lot of times we had two or three herds laying out ready to come in and be dipped."



FACTS

Editoria

I feel there's a number of things that need to be discussed concerning the new hospital.

l. A fifty bed hospital can house patients for a staff of four or five doctors. Hence, the findings of the original firm that studied the hospital needs for Gaines County.

2. The story that's been circulated that other people will be glad to come in and build a hospital is a bunch of baloney. It is true that Hospital of America, Inc. has built hospitals in some areas. If my information is correct, there's been many guarantees made for them which spells nothing but dollars.

3. It is true that the hospital in Seminole has lost money. It was not set up to make money. The court that set it up decided it would be better for the many residents of the area to share in the cost of people unable to pay hospital bills than it would be to divide the cost among only the sick and the users of the hospital. This came about this way - If one hospital bed being used was unable to pay, the court felt it unfair for the other beds to make up that share. Hence, a loss will keep on occurring under such an arrangement. Originally it was set up if 100% paid, the hospital would break even. It is unfortunate that our times are causing small businesses to go broke, small schools to close and small hospitals to cease operation. It may not be good in every case but unfortunately it is still so.

4. Another false statement concerning a new hospital is the amount it would cost in taxes. Taxes would not go up 25%, as has been stated many times, but would only go up a small percent of the county taxes only. Example: An estimated \$6.08 for a \$15,000 home, a 160 acre farm at \$300 an acre - \$28.36. It was pointed out that at the present time Medicare and Medicaid pay 27% of the overall operation and cost a running hospital. It is estimated by 1975 that this will raise to 66%. The hospital is at present collecting $86\frac{1}{2}\%$ of all charges made.

The group of people representing the Seagraves Chamber of Commerce stated at the public meeting Thursday night that they did not want a new hospital. Seminole people will vote Saturday on a proposition that will increase the facilities for the sick, where there will be room for four doctors.

I thought I had a heart attack in 1966. I passed out. I came to and and Dr. Koberg was running in and out of my room, making necessary arrangements for my relief. Fifteen minutes before I would have have paid any amount not to have driven to Brownfield, Hobbs, or Andrews. I hope there's enough of you who feel the same way that will cross in one square, voting Saturday and voting YES on Proposition #1.





I responded like a person on drugs and came to like a person on drugs.

I cannot imagine anyone not wanting full command of their thinking facilities. How terrible it would be to worry about, when under full power, to realize some of the things you might have done. If I'm ever unfortunate enough to make another trip, I hope I'm fortunate enough to come to surrounded by those who care and it will be accidental again and NOT ON PURPOSE!
