**ORDINANCE NO. 1204**

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF ROBERT LEE, TEXAS REGULATING AND PROHIBITING THE PURCHASE, SALE, DELIVERY, OFFER OR GIFT OF ILLEGAL SMOKING MATERIALS; THE USE OR POSSESSION OF ILLEGAL SMOKING MATERIAL; THE USE OR POSSESSION OF ILLEGAL SMOKING MATERIAL PARAPHERNALIA; PROVIDING AFFIRMATIVE DEFENSES TO PROSECUTION; ESTABLISHING A PENALTY; PROVIDING FOR REPEALING, SAVINGS AND SEVERABILITY CLAUSES; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Robert Lee, Texas ("City Council"), has been provided with documentation from competent, well recognized medical professionals and law enforcement officials of the growing presence of a new and potentially dangerous substance affecting the public health, safety and welfare of the citizens, particularly the youth of the City of Robert Lee ("City"); and

WHEREAS, in response to these warnings, the City Council has secured information indicating that this threat is presented in the form of retail products sold or distributed as a mixture of dried vegetation that when covered or mixed with certain specific chemicals, produces the physiological and psychological effects of a controlled substance such as marijuana; and

WHEREAS, the substances identified above are considered to be generally described as

synthetic cannabinoids or salvia divinorum which may be distributed, sold and marketed under such names as "K-2", "K-2 SUMMIT", "K-2 SEX", "GENIE", "DASCENTS", "ZOHAI", "SAGE", "SPICE", "KO KNOCK-OUT 2", "SPICE GOLD", "SPICE DIAMOND", "YUCATAN FIRE", "SOLAR FLARE", "PEP SPICE", "FIRE N' ICE", "BLAZE", "RED X DAWN", and "SALVIA DIVINORUM," among others; and

WHEREAS, the synthetic cannabinoids may be presented under a variety of street names but share common ingredients, including JWH-018 and JWH-073; and

**Penalty.**

(a) Any person who violates any provision of this Ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, punishable by a fine not to exceed \$500.00.

(b) Every act in violation of this Ordinance shall constitute a separate offense.

(c) Unless otherwise specifically set forth herein, an allegation and/or evidence of culpable mental state is not required for the proof of an offense of this Ordinance.

(d) The penal provisions imposed under this Ordinance shall not preclude the City of Robert Lee from filing suit to enjoin the violation of this Ordinance. The City retains all legal rights and remedies available to it pursuant to local, state and federal law."

SECTION 6: Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective from and after the date of its final

passage and publication as provided by law, and it is accordingly so ordained.

WHEREAS, it is deemed in the best interest of the City of Robert Lee for the health, safety and welfare of its citizens that an ordinance be established to regulate manufactured homes within the City of Robert Lee, Texas, and that mobile homes be prohibited; and

WHEREAS, this Ordinance shall be known and cited as the "Manufactured Home Ordinance" of the City

Robert Lee, Texas.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF ROBERT LEE, TEXAS:

**SECTION 1 - DEFINITIONS**

D. HUD - Code Manufactured Home - A structure constructed on or after June 15, 1976, according to the rules of the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development, transportable in one or more sections, which, in the traveling mode, is eight feet or more in width or 40 body feet or more in length, or when erected on site is 320 or more square feet, and which is built on a permanent chassis and designed to be used as a dwelling, with or without, a permanent foundation when connected to the required utilities and includes plumbing, heating, air conditioning and electrical systems.

E. Mobile Home - A structure constructed before June 15, 1976, according to the rules of the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development, transportable in one or more sections, which, in the traveling mode, is eight feet or more in width or 40 body feet or more in length, or when erected on

site is 320 or more square feet, and which is built on a permanent chassis and designed to be used as a dwelling, with or without, a permanent foundation when connected to the required utilities and includes plumbing, heating, air conditioning and electrical systems.

F. Permit - Written permit/certification issued by the City permitting the construction, alteration, or use and occupancy of a HUD-Code Manufactured Home under the provision of this Ordinance and regulations issued hereunder.

**SECTION 3 - MOBILE HOMES PROHIBITED**

No mobile home shall be permitted within the City limits of the City of Robert Lee, Texas. Any mobile home located in the City legally, prior to the enactment of this ordinance and used and occupied as a residential dwelling shall be allowed to remain, but shall not be replaced with another mobile home under any circumstance.

**SECTION 4 - UNLAWFUL PARKING, USE OR LOCATION OF HUD CODE MANUFACTURED HOMES**

ordinance, it shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to park, locate or permit the parking or location of any HUD Code Manufactured Home upon any lot, street or tract of land which is less than 6500 square feet of space whenever such lot or tract of land is unoccupied by any HUD Code Manufactured Home or any other dwelling within the City limits of the City of Robert Lee, Texas.

**SECTION 5 - EXISTING MANUFACTURED HOMES**

This ordinance does not make unlawful any mobile home or manufactured home already in place and complying with all laws when this ordinance becomes effective. However, after the effective date of this ordinance, if any nonconforming mobile home or manufactured home is removed from its location the following shall apply:

A. If it is a mobile home, it shall not be allowed to relocate within the city limits of the City of Robert Lee, Texas; and

B. If it is a HUD Code Manufactured Home, all provisions of this ordinance shall apply.

**SECTION 6 - PERMITS AND CONDITIONS**

A. Permit Procedures - Permit seekers must apply for a permit with the Permit Clerk at the City Hall. The Permit Clerk will assist with information regarding regulations, prohibitions, requirements, paperwork and inspections.

2. Use and Occupancy Permit Fee - \$35.00

**SECTION 8 - INSPECTION**

Officials of the City may enter the premises of any

proposed or existing place where any manufactured home is located, in order to inspect for compliance with this ordinance.

**SECTION 12 - PENALTY FOR NON-COMPLIANCE**

Any person, firm, or corporation violating this Ordinance or any part of this Ordinance or providing false information to a City official concerning licensing or permitting under this Ordinance and found guilty by the Judge of the Municipal Court, will be guilty of a Class "C" Misdemeanor, and be fined not more than \$500.00 (Five Hundred Dollars) except for health violations which may be fined not more than \$2000.00 (Two Thousand Dollars). Each day such violation continues, or be permitted to continue, shall be a separate offense.

**SECTION 13 - SEVERABILITY**

If any section or part of any section or paragraph of this Ordinance is declared invalid or unconstitutional for any

reason, it shall not be held to invalidate or impair the validity, force, or effect of any other section or sections or part of a section or paragraph of this Ordinance.

**SECTION 15 - EFFECTIVE DATE**

This ordinance shall become effective from and after the date of its final passage and publication as provided by law, and it is accordingly so ordained.
