Longhorns to play in State Basketball Tournament

The #1 ranked Bronte Longhorns (32-3) have advanced to the State Tournament yet again! They will play #25 Roxton (25-6) Friday evening at 7 pm. The winner of this game will face either #15 Waelder (31-7) or #3 Paducah (27-6) in the finals Saturday evening, March 12, at 7 pm. All games will be played in the Frank Erwin Center in Austin.

In the 1A Division II Regional Quarterfinals, the Longhorns defeated the Sterling City Eagles 35-22 at the Junell Center in San Angelo Wednesday evening, March 2, 2011. The Eagles strategy was to control the pace of the game and they were very successful with the "stall ball" tactic. The only place this tactic wasn't successful for the Eagles was on the scoreboard.

Statistics include Dakota Rawls - 12 points, 11 rebounds, 3 steals; Kerwin Rawls - 6 points, 6 assists; Heath Richey - 11 points, 3 steals; Terron Charles - 3 points; and Creed Coalson - 3 points.

The Longhorns traveled to Abilene Friday, March 4, to face Throckmorton in the Regional Semifinals. Although Throckmorton also played "stall ball" for the first half, they were unsuccessful in their effort against the Horns. When the buzzer sounded to end the game, the Longhorns led 54-32.

Statistics include Dakota Rawls - 25 points, 4 rebounds; Kerwin Rawls - 11 points, 6 rebounds, 5 steals, 7 assists; Heath Richey - 9 points, 4 rebounds, 3 steals, 5 assists; Terron Charles - 2 points; and Creed Coalson 7 - points.

The Longhorns played Ira in the Regional Finals Saturday afternoon, March 5. Ira had one lead on the Horns in the opening minutes, but that didn't last. Bronte earned the championship with a 50-33 win over Ira. Dakota received 2 fouls in the first quarter and came out of the game. The other Longhorns stepped up and broadened the lead significantly before Coach Rawls put #2 back in. Kerwin

Rawls, Creed Coalson and Terron Charles each hit 3 pointers, Caleb Rosson fought for the rebounds, and Heath Richey exhausted Ira's star player #45 by the 2nd quarter.

Statistics include Dakota Rawls - 15 points, 10 rebounds; Kerwin Rawls - 20 points, 6 rebounds, 5 assists; Heath Richey - 2 points, 4 rebounds; Terron Charles - 5 points; Creed Coalson - 8 points; and Caleb Rosson - 4 rebounds.

All Coke County historians are encouraged to attend the meeting, Monday, April 14 at 3:00 p.m. Call 453-2495 for information.

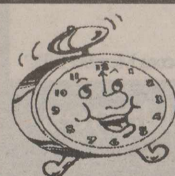
Emergency cards being distributed to East Coke County

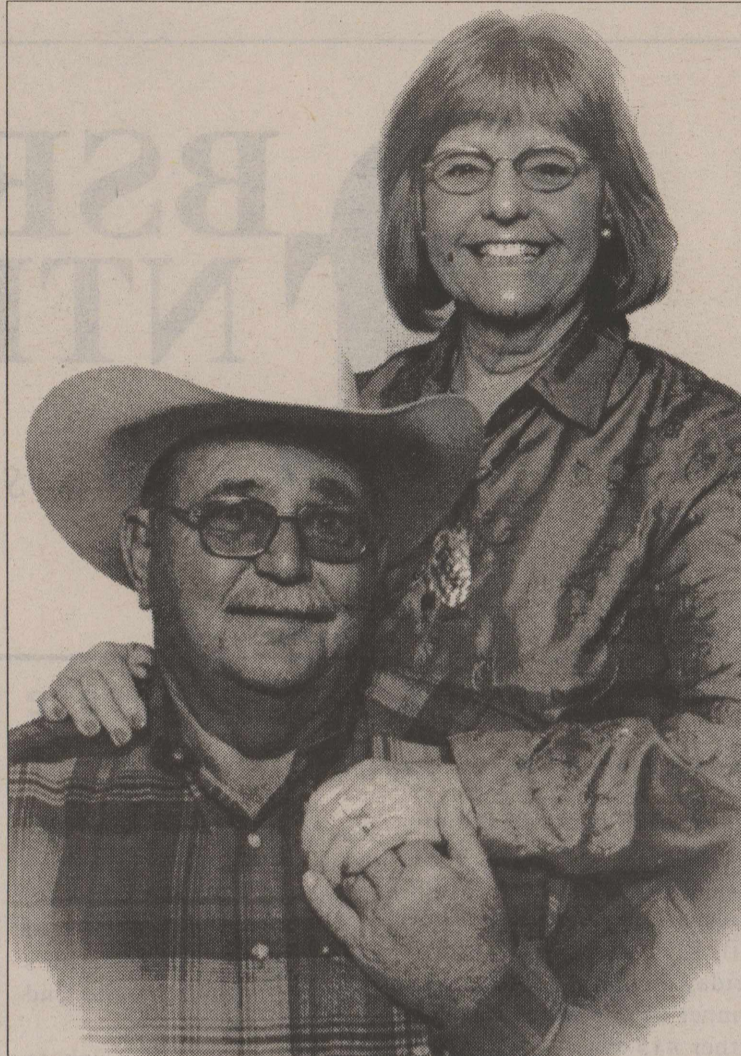
Drennans celebrate 50th Wedding Anniversary

Rancher's Workshop slated for Big Lake

The Crockett, Middle Concho, North Concho River, Edwards Plateau, Eldorado-Divide and Tom Green Soil & Water Conservation Districts (SWCD) are partnering up with local landowners, Angelo State University (ASU), Grazing Lands Conservation Initiative (GLCI) and the Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) to host the 2nd annual "Rancher's Workshop".

The event is scheduled for Friday, March 25, 2011, at the Big Lake Community Center in Big Lake. There will be a BBQ lunch, catered by Kenny Blanek's Village

Café, and vendors will be on site to display improvements in today's agriculture business sector. Continuing Education Credits (CEU) will be offered for participants, registration will begin at 8:00 a.m., with the first speaker starting the day at 8:45 a.m. and concluding at 2:30 p.m.

The mission is to bring together innovative and successful individuals to share their experiences with an audience of their peers in the agricultural business.

Dr. Gary Vannoy, D.V.M., from Ozona, will cover livestock diseases common to the area; Dr. Rick Machen, AgriLife Research and

Extension livestock specialist, will provide vaccinating schedules and results; Dr. Cody Scott, with Angelo State University will cover range animal nutrition and protein/mineral supplementation; and representatives from Boehringer-Ingelheim and Texas Vet Lab, Inc. will be covering pharmaceutical improvements and available products.

During the event Stay Tuff Fencing, Yellowhouse Machinery Company and Priefert Ranch Equipment will offer on-site live demonstrations of new innovations to the livestock and equipment industry.

Corey Owens, instructor/research associate with the ASU Department of Agriculture will have graduate students on hand to display their rangeland research projects. Both students and speakers will be available to answer questions about their respective research projects and presentations.

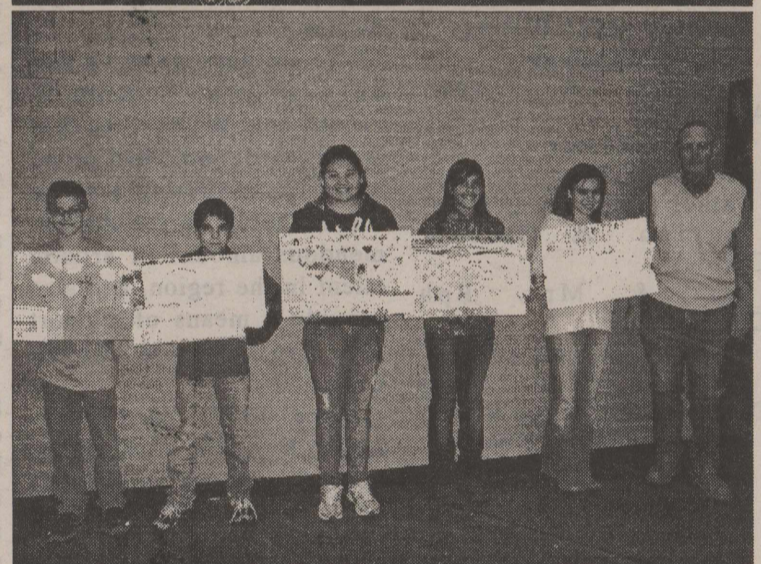
